### MINUTES OF SPOKANE CITY COUNCIL

Monday, April 22, 2024

### **BRIEFING SESSION**

The Briefing Session of the Spokane City Council held on the above date was called to order at 3:32 p.m. in the Council Chambers in the Lower Level of the Municipal Building, 808 West Spokane Falls Boulevard, Spokane, Washington.

#### Roll Call

On roll call, Council President Wilkerson and Council Members Cathcart, Dillon, Klitzke, Navarrete, and Zappone were present. Council Member Bingle was absent.

Interim City Administrator Garrett Jones; Giacobbe Byrd, Director-City Council Office; City Council Policy Advisor Chris Wright; and City Clerk Terri Pfister were also present for the meeting.

### First Reading Ordinance C36515 (Council Sponsors: Council Members Dillon, Zappone, and Navarrete)

**Motion** by Council Member Dillon, seconded by Council Member Klitzke, **to amend** First Reading Ordinance C36515—relating to residential rental properties and establishing minimum notice period for residential rent increases, amending sections 10.57.130 and 10.57.140 of the Spokane Municipal Code, creating a new Section 10.57.160 of the Spokane Municipal Code, and establishing an effective date—with a Wilkerson/Dillon proposed amendment filed April 19, 2024 (reduces notice period to 120 days for rent increases equal to or less than 3%, and keeps 180-day notice period for increases over 3%); **carried 5-1.**

If an ordinance is vetoed by the Mayor, the Mayoral veto will be published in a subsequent issue of the Official Gazette.

### **ORDINANCE NO C36504**

An ordinance relating to "Spokane Tourism and Cultural Investment (TACI) Grants Committee, formerly the Lodging Tax Advisory Committee program; amending Chapter SMC 4.30.010 and 4.30.020 and adopting a new section 4.30.030 to chapter 4.30 of the Spokane Municipal Code.

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to RCW 67.28.1816, the City Council established the Lodging Tax Advisory Committee ("LTAC") to make recommendations for funding of tourism and marketing activities from the lodging excise tax authorized by RCW 67.28.180; and

**WHEREAS**, the enabling provisions of the Spokane Municipal Code relating to the lodging excise tax and the Lodging Tax Advisory Committee require updating to reflect state law, and further to establish the frequency of the grants funded by the lodging excise tax, and to provide grant evaluation criteria; and

**WHEREAS**, on recommendation of the existing Lodging Tax Advisory Committee, the name of the committee is being changed to the "Spokane Tourism and Cultural Investment (TACI) Grants Committee" to better reflect its function.

**NOW**, **THEREFORE**, the City of Spokane does ordain:

**Section 1.** Chapter 04.30 of the Spokane Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

### 04.30 ((Lodging Tax Advisory Committee)) Tourism and Cultural Investment Grant Committee

Section 2. Section 04.30.010 of the Spokane Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

### 04.30.010 Establishment

Pursuant to RCW 67.28.1817 there is established a lodging tax advisory committee, which shall be named the Spokane Tourism and Cultural Investment (TACI) Grants Committee. ((to review and comment to the city council on any proposal to

- A. increase the rate of,
- B. repeal an exemption from, or
- C. change the use of revenue received from the special excise tax upon the furnishing of lodging authorized by RCW 67.28.180 (the hotel/motel tax).))
- A. The Spokane Tourism and Cultural Investment Grants Committee shall review, comment, and make recommendations to the City Council on any proposal to increase the rate of the lodging tax, repeal an exemption from the lodging tax, or change the use of revenue received from the lodging tax as required as in RCW 67.28.1817.
- B. The Committee shall make Spokane Tourism and Cultural Investment Grants recommendations to the City Council. The City Council shall make the final decision on all grants and may adjust recipients and funding levels from the grant recommendations of the Committee provided the Council satisfy the requirements of RCW 67.28.1817.
- C. The Committee may make recommendations to the mayor and city council regarding <u>policies</u>, <u>programs</u>, <u>and projects to enhance tourism activities and events</u> throughout the city.
  - Section 3. That Section 04.30.020 of Chapter 04.30 of the Spokane Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

### 04.30.020 Membership

<u>Consistent with RCW 67.28.1817, ((The)) the Committee consists of seven voting members nominated by the mayor and appointed by the city council annually.</u> The membership is comprised of:

- A. Three representatives of businesses required to collect the tax levied by SMC 08.08.010; and
- B. Three persons involved in activities authorized to be funded by the revenue from the tax levied by SMC 08.08.010;
- C. One member of the city council, who shall chair the committee.
- D. Membership of the committee is determined by RCW 67.28.1817.
- E. Members appointed pursuant to SMC 04.30.020A shall live in or within fifty miles of the city limits of Spokane and must have an in-person work role within the City of Spokane.

Section 4. There is enacted a new section 04.30.030 to Chapter 04.30 of the Spokane Municipal Code to read as follows:

### 04.30.030 Spokane Tourism and Cultural Investment Grants Program

- A. The Spokane Tourism and Cultural Investment Grants program is funded by the Lodging Tax authorized by RCW 67.28 and levied pursuant to SMC 08.08.010.
- B. The Spokane Tourism and Cultural Investment Grants Committee grants shall be used to support programs, and projects to enhance tourism activities and tourism events in the city of Spokane, including uses permitted in accordance with RCW 67.28.1816. Applications for Spokane Tourism and Cultural Investment Grants must include the following:
  - 1. the total amount of grant funds requested;
  - 2. the budget for the project; and
  - 3. tourism estimates required by RCW 67.28.1816.
- C. Spokane Tourism and Cultural Investment Grants are awarded on a biannual basis. The City Council may change the frequency of the grants by resolution.

**Section 5**. Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or words of this ordinance should be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality thereof shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this ordinance.

**Section 6.** Clerical Errors. Upon approval by the city attorney, the city clerk is authorized to make necessary corrections to this ordinance, including scrivener's errors or clerical mistakes; references to other local, state, or federal laws, rules, or regulations; or numbering or referencing of ordinances or their sections and subsections.

WHEREAS, subsequent to the adoption of the 2024 budget Ordinance No. C36467, as above entitled, and which passed the City Council November 27, 2023, it is necessary to make changes in the appropriations of the Miscellaneous Grants Fund, which changes could not have been anticipated or known at the time of making such budget ordinance; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance has been on file in the City Clerk's Office for five days; - Now, Therefore,

The City of Spokane does ordain:

Section 1. That in the budget of the Miscellaneous Grants Fund, and the budget annexed thereto with reference to the Fund, the following changes be made:

- 1) Increase revenue by \$420,000.
- A) Of the increased revenue, \$420,000 is provided solely for grant revenue from the Department of Commerce.
- 2) Increase appropriation by \$420,000.
- A) Of the increased appropriation, \$420,000 is provided solely for contractual services.

Section 2. It is, therefore, by the City Council declared that an urgency and emergency exists for making the changes set forth herein, such urgency and emergency arising from the award and acceptance of the Dept. of Commerce's climate planning grant, and because of such need, an urgency and emergency exists for the passage of this ordinance, and also, because the same makes an appropriation, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage.
