## **CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS**

### **29<sup>TH</sup> AVENUE GRIND & OVERLAY**

- 29<sup>th</sup> Avenue between Ray Street and Grand Boulevard is reduced to one lane in each direction.
- **Perry Street is closed between 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> Avenue.**

This work is two separate projects, [Market/Monroe/29th Grind & Overlay](#) and [29th/Washington/Monroe/Lincoln Grind & Overlay](#) that will grind and overlay pavement and install ADA ramps.

### **COCHRAN CONTROL FACILITY**

- There are residential travel impacts on Cleveland Avenue and Grace Avenue.

This project will construct a stormwater flow control vault.

**This is a \$7.3 million project.**

### **DIVISION STREET PEDESTRIAN HYBRID BEACONS**

- This project starts Monday, April 15, Division Street will have lane closures in each direction between Crown and Cozza Avenue.

This project aims to enhance pedestrian safety and accessibility by installing crossing signals at three uncontrolled crosswalks on Division Street. These locations include Division/Longfellow, Division/Everett, and Division/Rhodes-Weile.

**This is a \$1.2 million project.**

### HAVEN GRIND & OVERLAY

- Haven Street is reduced to one lane between Columbia and Rockwell Avenue.

This project will grind and overlay pavement and install ADA ramps as needed.

**This is a \$1 million project.**

### HIGH SYSTEM WATER TANK

- No impacts to the traveling public are anticipated.

This project will construct a 2-million-gallon elevated steel and concrete water reservoir on the Hamblen Elementary property just south of Hamblen Park.

**This is a \$9.8 million project.**

### MAPLE/ASH CHIP SEAL

- Maple and Ash Street has rotating single-lane closures between Rowan Avenue and Northwest Boulevard.

This project will chip seal on the Maple/Ash corridor from Northwest Boulevard to Rowan Avenue.

**This is a \$1.8 million project.**

### MARSHALL ROAD & CHENEY SPOKANE ROAD WATER TRANSMISSION MAIN

- Cheney-Spokane Road between the Hwy 195 interchange and Latah Bistro is reduced to one lane in each direction.
- Marshall Road south of Thorpe Road is closed; residents are recommended to go south to Spokane Cheney Road for access.

Phase 1 will construct a 30-inch water transmission main to increase water transmission capacity from the existing 30-inch water main on Thorpe Rd. southward, running parallel to US Highway 195 to the existing Qualchan reservoir.

**This is a \$9.9 million project.**

### POST STREET BRIDGE REPLACEMENT

- The Post Street Bridge is closed. [See the detour routes for pedestrians and bicyclists.](#)
- The intersection of Lincoln Street and Summit Boulevard is closed.
- Post Street is closed at Spokane Falls Boulevard with local access only. Parking is limited on Post, and the Riverfront Park parking lot on Post just south of the bridge is closed.

This project will replace the Post Street Bridge and associated utilities.

**This is an \$18.5 million project.**

### RAY STREET WATER MAIN

- This project starts Monday, April 15, the following streets will be closed.
  - Hartson Avenue between Ralph and Greene Street.
  - Ray Street between Harston and 11<sup>th</sup> Avenue.

This project will replace an aging water main along Ray Street, stretching from Hartson Avenue to 11<sup>th</sup> Avenue.

**This is a \$1.4 million project.**

### SOUTH GORGE TRAIL CONNECTION

- No impacts to the traveling public are anticipated.

This project constructs a shared-use pathway under the Monroe Street Bridge connecting Main Avenue west of Monroe Street to the existing path attached to the north side of Spokane Falls Boulevard across from the Central Library.

**This is a \$2 million project.**

### SPOKANE INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT RESERVOIR

- No impacts to the traveling public are anticipated.
- Construction will be complete in 2024.

This project will construct a 3.6-million-gallon drinking water reservoir near the Spokane International Airport.

**This is a \$13.3 million project funded with state and local funds.**

### STREET MAINTENANCE CURB RAMPS

- Crews are installing curb ramps at the following locations.
  - Perry Street and Liberty Avenue
  - Perry Street and Dalton Avenue
  - Perry Street and Fairview Avenue
  - Nevada Street and Westview Court
  - Lyons Avenue and Lidgerwood Street
  - Rowan Avenue and Mayfair Street
  - A Street and Central Avenue/Loma Drive
  - A Street and Eloika Avenue
  - A Street and Bismark Avenue

This project will install ADA ramps on streets which will receive a grind and overlay by the Street Department.

**This is a \$500,000 project.**

### THOR-FREYA 2<sup>ND</sup>/3<sup>RD</sup> INTERSECTIONS

- The following streets are closed.
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue between Freya and Thor Street.
  - Westbound I-90 Exit 283B Thor/Freya off-ramp.

This project involves full roadway reconstruction with concrete, curb and stormwater facilities replacement, ADA ramp upgrades, and water/sewer replacements.

**This is a \$4.4 million project.**

### THORPE RESERVOIR (THORPE & TRAINOR RD)

- Work continues with no traffic impacts.

This project construct five MG ground level steel water reservoir.

**This is a \$5.1 million project.**

### TJ MEENACH SIPHON VAULTS

- Work has been suspended to further notice.

This project connects the 60" siphon to be installed with [TJ Meenach Street and Stormwater Improvements](#) to the existing 60" siphon pipe.

**This is a \$3.3 million project.**

## WASHINGTON STREET GRIND & OVERLAY

- The intersection of Washington Street and Boone Avenue is closed. Detours are in place. Drivers are all highly encouraged to utilize Division St., Monroe St., and the Maple/Ash corridor for north-south travel and Maxwell Ave. for east-west travel.

This project will grind and overlay pavement and install ADA ramps.

## **CITY OBSTRUCTIONS**

- North Sky Communications will be working at the following areas with lane closures from 4/8/24 to 4/12/24 to support utility work.
  - Bernard Street between 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> Avenue.
  - Bernard Street between 23<sup>rd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> Avenue.
  - Bernard Street between 31<sup>st</sup> and 32<sup>nd</sup> Avenue.
  - 37<sup>th</sup> Avenue between Manito Boulevard and Gandy Street.
- **The north curb lane of 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue will be closed between Wall and Howard Street from 4/9/24 to 4/12/24 for Broadband Development Group work.**
- Upriver Drive will be closed between Buckeye and Frederick Avenue from 4/9/24 to 4/12/24 for utility work by Lariviere Inc. work.
- Flagging on Trent Avenue between Sycamore and Florida Street from 4/1/24 to 4/12/24 for Avista Utilities to facilitate wire crossing.
- The southbound curb lane of Northwest Boulevard between Princeton Place and Longfellow Avenue from 4/1/24 to 4/12/24 for underground service install by Avista Utilities.
- The westbound lane of Main Avenue will be closed between Lee and Napa Street from 3/18/24 to 4/12/24 for North Sky Communications work.
- TDS Telecom will be working in the following areas from 1/8/24 to 4/15/24 to support cable installation.
  - Southbound Standard Street shoulder closed between Gettysburg Drive and Weile Avenue.
  - Northbound Cozza Drive shoulder closed between Calkins Drive and Dakota Street.
  - Northbound Standard Street shoulder closed between Cozza Drive and Greta Avenue.
- MasTec North America will be installing aerial and underground fiber in the following locations from 3/18/24 to 4/16/24.
  - The northbound curb lane of Indian Trail Road will be closed between Kathleen and Lowell Avenue.
  - The southbound curb lane of Indian Trail Road will be closed between Barnes Road and Pacific Park Drive.

- Rowan Avenue between Driscoll Boulevard and Fleming Street will have lane closures with flaggers on-site from 3/18/24 to 4/17/24 for TDS Telecom work.
- Riverside Avenue will be closed between Wall and Howard Street from 4/18/24 at 9 p.m. to 4/19/24 at 5 a.m. for Specialty Windows Commercial to replace the glass in the skywalk.
- The east curb lane of Maple Street will be closed between 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue from 4/8/24 to 4/19/24 for Avista Utilities work.
- MasTec will be working at the following locations from 3/19/24 to 4/19/24.
  - The eastbound curb lane of 29<sup>th</sup> Avenue from Southeast Boulevard and Regal Street.
  - The westbound curb lane of 29<sup>th</sup> Avenue from Fiske to Mt. Vernon Street.
  - Southbound lane and center island of Regal Street from 29<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup> Avenue.
  - Northbound lane closure of Crestline Street from 39<sup>th</sup> to 36<sup>th</sup> Avenue.
  - Westbound lane closure of 37<sup>th</sup> Avenue from Napa to Ray Street.
  - Southbound lane closure of Regal Street from 35<sup>th</sup> to 38<sup>th</sup> Avenue.
- Both curb lanes of Division Street will be closed between Ermina and Augusta Avenue from 3/20/24 to 4/20/24 for MasTec work.
- TDS Metrocom will be working at the following areas from 3/25/24 to 4/24/24.
  - Assembly Street between Everett Avenue and Winston Drive will have center lane closure.
  - Driscoll Boulevard between Everett Place and Winston Drive will have center lane closure.
- TDS Metrocom will be working at the following locations from 3/26/24 to 4/25/24.
  - The southbound curb lane of Indian Trail Road will be closed between Francis and Elmhurst Avenue.
  - The eastbound curb lane of Francis Avenue will be closed between Fotheringham and A Street.
- Avista Utilities will be working at the following locations from 3/30/24 to 4/30/24 to support gas main replacement.
  - The southbound curb lane of Havana Street closed between Boone Avenue and Alki Way.
  - The eastbound curb lane of Broadway Avenue closed between Alki Way and Havana Street.
- The two east curb lanes of Stevens Street are closed between Riverside to 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue from 4/1/24 to 5/3/24 for Palouse Power vault replacement work.
- North Sky Communications will be flagging at the following locations for fiber installation from 4/1/24 to 5/3/24.
  - Inland Empire Way between 20<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> Avenue.
  - 23<sup>rd</sup> Avenue between Chestnut Street and Inland Empire Way.

- Rowan Avenue between C Street and G Street will have lane closures with flaggers on-site from 3/4/24 to 5/3/24 to support the installation of underground cable by TDS Metrocom LLC.
- Mastec will be working at the following locations from 4/5/24 to 5/6/24.
  - The northbound curb lane of Browne Street will be closed between 7<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue.
  - The eastbound curb lane of 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue will be closed between McClellan and Division Street.
- TDS Metrocom will be working at the following locations from 4/8/24 to 5/7/24.
  - Assembly Street between Sanson to Queen Avenue will have center lane closure.
  - Driscoll Boulevard between Sanson and Queen Place will have center lane closure.
- The eastbound curb lane of Francis Avenue will be closed between A and Alberta Street from 4/8/24 to 5/7/24 for TDS Telecom to install cable.
- The eastbound curb lane of Francis Avenue will be closed between Winston Drive and N Street from 3/11/24 to 5/10/24 for TDS Metrocom work.
- The northbound curb lane of Grand Boulevard will be closed between 14<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue from 4/8/24 to 5/10/24 for Avista Utilities pole replacement.
- The eastbound curb lane of Holland Avenue between Dakota and Nevada Street from 4/15/24 to 5/15/24 for Mastec work.
- Mastec will be working in the following areas from 4/12/24 to 5/15/24 to support aerial utility installation.
  - Northbound and southbound Crestline Street lane closures with flaggers on-site between Columbia and Lyons Avenue.
  - The eastbound curb lane of Francis Avenue closed between Napa and Crestline Street.
  - The westbound curb lane of Francis Avenue closed between Stone and Crestline Street.
- The east curb lane of Lincoln Street will be closed between 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue and Railroad Alley Avenue from 4/1/24 to 5/15/24 for Garco Construction work.
- The westbound curb lane of Mission Avenue will be closed between Normandie and Washington Street from 4/18/24 to 5/17/24 for Mastec work.
- Northwest Boulevard island between Cora Avenue and Audubon Street will be closed with flaggers on-site from 4/18/24 to 5/18/24 for Mastec work.
- The westbound shoulder of Electric Avenue will be closed between Thomas Mallen Road to Dowdy Road from 2/22/24 to 5/20/24 for Mastec work.
- The eastbound center lane of Francis Avenue will be closed between Market and Sycamore Street from 4/1/24 to 10/29/24.

## **SPOKANE PARKS AND RECREATION**

### **CORBIN PARK**

- The park will receive a new sport court, with two dedicated pickleball courts and one tennis court. Demolition of the existing court happened over fall, with new surfacing and amenities opening in the spring.

### **COEUR D'ALENE PARK**

- A new irrigation system is being installed February – fall 2024. The park will remain open for use, with rotating sectional closures.

## **STREET DEPARTMENT PROJECTS**

### **CRACK SEALING**

- Arterial Crack Sealing
  - Bridgeport Avenue, Crestline to Division Street
- Residential Crack Sealing
  - Augusta Avenue, Monroe to Howard Street

### **BRIDGE WORK**

- Crews will be removing graffiti on the Monroe Street bridge, there will be lane closures.

### **GRIND AND OVERLAY**

- Crews are working on a grind and overlay project on Inland Empire Way between 23<sup>rd</sup> Avenue and the Latah Creek bridge.
- On Tuesday, April 16, crews will start a grind and overlay project on Sunset Highway between Lewis and Royal Street.

### **POTHOLE CREWS**

- City crews continue to fill potholes as weather allows. If you see a pothole, report it by calling **3-1-1**. Potholes can also be reported online through [your MySpokane account](#). Crews focus on the largest holes on the busiest streets first. Include as much information as possible on the location and size of the pothole.

- Northwest
  - Rt. 7, Francis – Johannsen, Maple – Indian Trail Rd.
- Northeast
  - Rt. 25, Wellesley – Empire, Nevada – Division
  - Rt. 26, Wellesley – Illinois, Crestline – Hamilton/Nevada
- South
  - Rt. 40, Hartson – 29<sup>th</sup> Ave., Crestline – Freya

### **ADDITIONAL WORK**

- Weather permitting, our concrete crew will be working on utility repairs throughout the city.



## WASHINGTON STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (WSDOT)

### CHILDREN OF THE SUN TRAIL

- This project continues to expand on the current Children of the Sun Trail located along the North Spokane Corridor between Columbia and Carlisle Avenue.

### NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR-US 395/NSC SPOKANE RIVER CROSSING

- South Riverton Avenue between Ermina Avenue and Fiske Street is closed.
- This project will construct the North Spokane Corridor bridge that will cross the Spokane River and connect the skyway portion near Spokane Community College to the south and at Carslie Avenue to the north of the river.

### NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR-US 395/SPOKANE R. TO COLUMBIA – NEW SEGEMENT

- The new section of the North Spokane Corridor from Freya to Wellesley Avenue opened in November 2023.
- Euclid Avenue will close to traffic starting Monday, April 15, through Friday, May 31, for contractor crews to reconstruct the roadway between Market and Ralph Street. Detour will be provided via Market, Wellesley, and Freya Streets.
