Projects highlighted in RED have notable changes this week. Construction is tentative and subject to change at any time.

CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS 29TH AVENUE GRIND & OVERLAY

• 29th Avenue between Ray Street and Grand Boulevard is reduced to one lane in each direction.

This work is two separate projects, <u>Market/Monroe/29th Grind & Overlay</u> and <u>29th/Washington/Monroe/Lincoln Grind & Overlay</u> that will grind and overlay payment and install ADA ramps.

COCHRAN CONTROL FACILITY

Work continues with no traffic impacts.

This project will construct a stormwater flow control vault.

This is a \$7.3 million project.

CYCLE 10 TRAFFIC CALMING

- Crews are working at the following locations.
 - Boone Avenue and Stone Street
 - Boone Avenue and Cook Street

This project aims to enhance the overall infrastructure, ensuring better pedestrian safety, traffic flow, and drainage in the area.

This is a \$3 million project.

DIVISION STREET PEDESTRIAN HYBRID BEACONS

Division Street has lane closures in each direction between Crown and Cozza Avenue.

This project aims to enhance pedestrian safety and accessibility by installing crossing signals at three uncontrolled crosswalks on Division Street. These locations include Division/Longfellow, Division/Everett, and Division/Rhodes-Weile.

This is a \$1.2 million project.

HAVEN GRIND & OVERLAY

Haven Street is reduced to one lane between Columbia and Rockwell Avenue.

This project will grind and overlay payment and install ADA ramps as needed.

This is a \$1 million project.

HIGH SYSTEM WATER TANK

No impacts to the traveling public are anticipated.

This project will construct a 2-million-gallon elevated steel and concrete water reservoir on the Hamblen Elementary property just south of Hamblen Park.

This is a \$9.8 million project.

MAPLE/ASH CHIP SEAL

 Maple and Ash Street has rotating single-lane closures between Rowan Avenue and Northwest Boulevard.

This project will chip seal on the Maple/Ash corridor from Northwest Boulevard to Rowan Avenue.

This is a \$1.8 million project.

MARSHALL ROAD & CHENEY SPOKANE ROAD WATER TRANSMISSION MAIN

- Thorpe Road is closed between U.S. 195 and the railroad tunnel.
- Cheney-Spokane Road between the Hwy 195 interchange and Latah Bistro is reduced to one lane in each direction.
- Marshall Road south of Thorpe Road is closed; residents are recommended to go south to Spokane Cheney Road for access.

Phase 1 will construct a 30-inch water transmission main to increase water transmission capacity from the existing 30-inch water main on Thorpe Rd. southward, running parallel to US Highway 195 to the existing Qualchan reservoir.

This is a \$9.9 million project.

MONROE STREET GRIND & OVERLAY

• This project will start on Monday, May 6. Monroe Street between Kiernan and Francis Avenue will be reduced to one lane in each direction.

This work is two separate projects, <u>Market/Monroe/29th Grind & Overlay</u> and <u>29th/Washington/Monroe/Lincoln Grind & Overlay</u> that will grind and overlay payment and install ADA ramps.

POST STREET BRIDGE REPLACEMENT

- The Post Street Bridge is closed. See the detour routes for pedestrians and bicyclists.
- The intersection of Lincoln Street and Summit Boulevard is closed.
- Post Street is closed at Spokane Falls Boulevard with local access only. Parking is limited on Post, and the Riverfront Park parking lot on Post just south of the bridge is closed.

This project will replace the Post Street Bridge and associated utilities.

This is an \$18.5 million project.

RAY STREET WATER MAIN

- The following streets will be closed.
 - Hartson Avenue between Ralph and Greene Street.
 - o Ray Street between Harston and 11th Avenue.

This project will replace an aging water main along Ray Street, stretching from Hartson Avenue to 11th Avenue.

This is a \$1.4 million project.

SOUTH GORGE TRAIL CONNECTION

No impacts to the traveling public are anticipated.

This project constructs a shared-use pathway under the Monroe Street Bridge connecting Main Avenue west of Monroe Street to the existing path attached to the north side of Spokane Falls Boulevard across from the Central Library.

This is a \$2 million project.

SPOKANE INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT RESERVOIR

- No impacts to the traveling public are anticipated.
- Construction will be complete in 2024.

This project will construct a 3.6-million-gallon drinking water reservoir near the Spokane International Airport.

This is a \$13.3 million project funded with state and local funds.

STREET MAINTENANCE CURB RAMPS

- Crews are installing curb ramps at the following locations.
 - Garland Avenue and Lindeke Street
 - Garland Avenue and Milton Street
 - Graland Avenue and A Street
 - Graland Avenue and Audubon Street
 - Graland Avenue and C Street
 - Graland Avenue and D Street
 - Chelan Avenue and Madison Street
 - Mallon Avenue and Madelia Street
 - o Wellesley Avene and Crestline Street island

This project will install ADA ramps on streets which will receive a grind and overlay by the Street Department.

This is a \$500,000 project.

THOR-FREYA 2ND/3RD INTERSECTIONS

- The following streets are closed.
 - 2nd Avenue between Freya and Thor Street.
 - Westbound I-90 Exit 283B Thor/Freya off-ramp.

This project involves full roadway reconstruction with concrete, curb and stormwater facilities replacement, ADA ramp upgrades, and water/sewer replacements.

This is a \$4.4 million project.

THORPE RESERVOIR (THORPE & TRAINOR RD)

• Work continues with no traffic impacts.

This project construct five MG ground level steel water reservoir.

This is a \$5.1 million project.

WASHINGTON STREET GRIND & OVERLAY

- Crews are working at the following locations.
 - Washington Street is reduced to one lane in each direction between Maxwell Avenue and the Spokane River.
 - Boone Avenue is reduced to a single lane at Washington Street.

This project will grind and overlay payment and install ADA ramps.

CITY OBSTRUCTIONS

- The two east curb lanes of Stevens Street are closed between Riverside to 2nd Avenue from 4/1/24 to 5/3/24 for Palouse Power vault replacement work.
- North Sky Communications will be flagging at the following locations for fiber installation from 4/1/24 to 5/3/24.
 - o Inland Empire Way between 20th and 28th Avenue.
 - o 23rd Avenue between Chestnut Street and Inland Empire Way.
- Rowan Avenue between C Street and G Street will have lane closures with flaggers onsite from 3/4/24 to 5/3/24 to support the installation of underground cable by TDS Metrocom LLC.
- Perry Street will be reduced to one lane at Thurston Avenue with flaggers on-site from 4/29/24 to 5/6/24 between the hours of 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. for Hydromax to perform sewer inspections.

 - The northbound curb lane of Browne Street will be closed between 7th and 5th Avenue.

- Napa Street will have lane restrictions between Trent and Riverside Avenue from 4/30/24 to 5/7/24 for LS Enterprise to perform sidewalk work.
- TDS Metrocom will be working at the following locations from 4/8/24 to 5/7/24.
 - O Assembly Street between Sanson to Queen Avenue will have center lane closure.
 - Driscoll Boulevard between Sanson and Queen Place will have center lane closure.
- The eastbound curb lane of Francis Avenue will be closed between A and Alberta Street from 4/8/24 to 5/7/24 for TDS Telecom to install cable.
- Mountain LTD will be working in a rolling work zone with lane closures along Francis Avenue between Royal Drive and Maple Street from 2/13/24 to 5/7/24.
- 29th Avenue will be reduced to one lane between Howard Street and High Drive Parkway from 4/29/24 to 5/10/24 for Avista Utilities work.
- The eastbound curb lane of Indiana Avenue will be closed between Calispel and Atlantic Street from 4/29/24 to 5/10/24 for Avista Utilities light pole replacement work.
- The west curb lane of Stevens Street will be closed between 6th Avenue to just south of 7th Avenue from 4/29/24 to 5/10/24 for North Sky Communications fiber work.
- The eastbound curb lane of Francis Avenue will be closed between Winston Drive and N Street from 3/11/24 to 5/10/24 for TDS Metrocom work.
- The northbound curb lane of Grand Boulevard will be closed between 14th and 9th Avenue from 4/8/24 to 5/10/24 for Avista Utilities pole replacement.
- Driscoll Boulevard between Longfellow Avenue and Bismark Place will have lane closures with flaggers on-site from 3/11/24 to 5/11/24 to support utility work by TDS Metrocom.

- The westbound curb lane of Illinois Avenue will be closed between Hogan and Perry Street from 4/29/24 to 5/31/23 for Devout Excavations work.
- Flaggers will be at the intersection of Monroe Street and Euclid Avenue from 3/11/24 to 6/1/24 for Mastec work.
- The two middle lanes of Division Street will be closed between Ermina and Augusta Avene from 5/3/24 to 6/3/24 for Mastec to perform aerial fiber work.
- The eastbound curb lane of 4th Avenue will be closed between Washington and Bernard Street from 3/11/24 to 6/11/24 for Mastec work.
 - The eastbound center lane of Francis Avenue will be closed between Market and Sycamore Street from 4/1/24 to 10/29/24.

Bloomsday is Sunday, May 5, the race day map can be found <u>here</u>. Drivers are asked to slow down and be aware of extra pedestrians in the downtown area all weekend long.

Bloomsday Trade Show

Bloomsday packet pick-up will be at the Spokane Convention Center, from 11:30 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Friday, May 3, and 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Saturday, May 4, so watch for increased pedestrian traffic downtown on those days.

Race Day

Parking restrictions will be in place starting Sunday, May 5 at midnight. Streets near the start (downtown Spokane) and finish (Monroe Street Bridge) are closed beginning at 430 a.m. and reopen about 3 p.m. Other streets on the Bloomsday course begin closing at 7:30 a.m. and reopen after the final walkers pass. This could be as early as 1 p.m. for Riverside Ave. west of Monroe St., and as late as 3 p.m. for Broadway Ave. west of Monroe St.

Participants are encouraged to take Spokane Transit to the race; there will be free bus service system-wide for Bloomsday weekend. There will be five express Bloomsday shuttles at Northtown Mall, Spokane Valley Mall, Ferris High School, Cheney/Red Barn, and West Planes Transit Center. Details here.

For those not participating, travel through downtown will be available on Ash, Maple, Division/Browne, and Hamilton Street, which remain open all day on Bloomsday.

CHILDREN OF THE SUN TRAIL

 This project continues to expand on the current Children of the Sun Trail located along the North Spokane Corridor between Columbia and Carlisle Avenue.

NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR-US 395/NSC SPOKANE RIVER CROSSING

- South Riverton Avenue between Ermina Avenue and Fiske Street is closed.
- Upriver Drive is closed between Ralph Street to under the Greene Street Bridge.
- This project will construct the North Spokane Corridor bridge that will cross the Spokane River and connect the skyway portion near Spokane Community College to the south and at Carslie Avenue to the north of the river.

NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR-US 395/SPOKANE R. TO COLUMBIA – NEW SEGEMENT

- The new section of the North Spokane Corridor from Freya to Wellesley Avenue opened in November 2023.
- Euclid Avenue between Market and Ralph Street is closed to traffic for contractor crews to reconstruct the roadway between Market and Ralph Street. The detour is via Market, Wellesley, and Freya Streets.
