# 501(C)(3) INSURANCE INFORMATION

## Is My Organization Covered By The City Of Spokane's Insurance?

By IRS definition, a 501(C)(3) entity must be a corporation, community chest, fund or foundation. This means your board has chosen to make a go of it on its own. The City of Spokane can not provide insurance for other entities outside of its own incorporation. Accordingly, you are <u>not</u> covered by the City of Spokane's insurance, and we cannot provide insurance for you.

#### Do I Need To Get Insurance?

This is a decision that is up to your Board of Directors. Many non-profits will choose to insure their activities, property, employees and volunteers by purchasing insurance to cover the potential of a devastating loss. Additionally, to perform work or host special events with City involvement, the City will normally require you to produce a certificate of liability insurance that is typically provided by your insurance carrier or broker; you must have insurance to get the certificate.

## What Kind of Insurance Do I Need?

The risks of non-profit groups are as different as the work that they perform. You need to talk to an insurance professional, agent or broker to help you with this decision.
