
## Workshop 1 – Children of the Sun Trail Alignment Options: Spokane River to I-90

## Fall 2021 Refined Alignment Options and Selection Process


### Notes:

- The maps that follow show the gradual refinement and narrowing of potential alignments over the past several years.
- The first map indicates 14 initial route options identified through the North Spokane Corridor Placemaking Process.
- These were narrowed to the three primary alignment options shown in the second map, which were evaluated during several workshops and a Charrette in the summer of 2019.
- The results and comments from these workshops are included in this packet for the Regal
  Alignment and the Skyway Alignment, which are the two remaining potential alignments. The
  River Route alignment along Riverton Avenue is no longer an option due to environmental
  agreement parameters associated with the North Spokane Corridor that put this alignment
  outside of consideration.
- The September BAB Meeting Workshop will present refined alignment options for the Regal and Skyway routes, and seek comment on these options. This workshop will also outline remaining steps in the public process for recommending a selected alignment.




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Bridges and Tunnels North-South Trail Route Alternatives Parks East-West Trail Route Alternatives --- Railroad






