Subject:

Regional active transportation planning activities at Spokane Regional Transportation Council (SRTC).

Background:

SRTC is the federally-designated Metropolitan Planning Organization for the area covered by Spokane County. SRTC is responsible for coordinating regional transportation planning among the multiple jurisdictions within Spokane County across all modes of transportation. The main planning framework for SRTC and its member agencies is the long-range metropolitan transportation plan, known as Horizon 2050, which was recently updated in December 2025. SRTC provides data analysis, maintains a regional travel demand model, conducts transportation studies, and distributes competitive funding as part of its planning activities.

Relationship to Plans/Actions:

Priorities identified by the City of Spokane through its planning processes are typically incorporated into SRTC's planning and processes. For example, the City conducted a planning project to update Spokane's bicycle priority network and this in turn informed SRTC's Regional Bicycle Priority Network that was adopted in Horizon 2050.

Timeline/ Further Action:

Spokane Reimagined is coordinating a series of events for this year's Week Without Driving (Oct 1-8). Emily Loeffler is SR's main organizer for this year's WWD and wants to talk about ways we can collaborate with the BAB.

Background:

WWD was started by Disability Rights WA to draw attention to the needs and experiences of non-drivers. The overarching goals this year are (1) celebrate alternative forms of transit, like biking/walking/bussing and (2) continue encouraging the development of sustainable and accessible transit infrastructure.

Some ideas to discuss with the BAB are: identifying spots around town that would be good candidates for art (like painted bike lanes), facilitating bike audits (securing cameras, developing easy forms for folks to fill out and submit), soliciting volunteers for events during WWD (like bike corrals), organizing bike-busses-for-grownups in the weeks leading up to WWD so folks who don't cycle regularly can feel more empowered during WWD.

Relationship to Plans/Actions:

One of the main themes of the Comprehensive Plan is to make sure residents have access to "viable transportation options." WWD is dedicated to cultivating these options and empowering residents to learn how to use them.

Mobile meeting discussion for September 2026

Background:

Twice annually the Bicycle Advisory Board takes their meeting on the road to check out new and upcoming projects and/or ride routes that need further attention.

- May 2025 the BAB rode from Manito Shopping Center to Ben Burr Park, back to Manito Shopping Center via 44th and then Grand Blvd.
- September 2025 the BAB rode the lower South Hill, going up Adams, across 27th, and down Rockwood Blvd.
- In May 2025 the BAB rode from the Centennial Trail at Kendall Yards up Elm to Garland & Belt and down Post St ending at David's Pizza. This route highlighted upcoming 27x27 projects currently under construction.
- August 2024, the BAB rode Inland Empire Way to the Spokane-Cheney interchange, finishing in Kendall Yards.
- May 2024, the BAB rode from Grant Park through East Central and finished back at Grant Park.
- October 2023, A Bike Town Hall with Senator Billig and Council Member Zappone, riding from the U-District Bridge to Bennedito's Brewpub on Sprague.
- May 2023, the BAB started near the Gonzaga campus and rode north to Columbia and Market St. and back down to Gonzaga campus.
