- Post Street Bike Lanes – Buckeye to Garland: .8 miles
- Cedar Street Bike Lanes – 3<sup>rd</sup> Ave to Riverside: .3 miles
- Central Ave. Bike Lanes – Division to Lidgerwood: .3 miles
- Children of the Sun Trail – Columbia Ave. to River: 2 miles
- Garland Ave Pathway – Cook to Market: .5 miles
