




What role does Environmental Justice play in fuels reduction?

- Increase forest health by thinning trees and giving more space
- Reduced wildfire risk by reducing fuel loads and ladder fuels
- Reduce Insect infestation by giving each tree more water and nutrient
- Help reduce forest diseases with best management practices





WHAT IS CWDG?

- The Community Wildfire Defense Program, or CWDG, is intended to help at-risk local communities and Tribes; plan for and reduce the risk of wildfire.
- This program, which was authorized by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, prioritizes at-risk communities in an area identified as having high or very high wildfire hazard potential, are lowincome, or have been impacted by a severe disaster that affects the risk of wildfire.
- The program provides funding to communities for two primary purposes:
 - Develop and revise Community Wildfire Protection Plans (CWPP).
 - Implement projects described in a Community Wildfire Protection Plan that is less than ten years old.

OF THE APPROXIMATELY 12,000 ACRES OWNED BY THE CITY OF SPOKANE, THE SPOKANE FIRE DEPARTMENT ESTIMATES THAT AT LEAST 4,200 ACRES NEED TREATMENT NOW AND WILL NEED A 10-15-YEAR MAINTENANCE PLAN TO KEEP THEM FIRE RESISTANT. BY THE END OF 2025, SPOKANE FIRE WILL HAVE COORDINATED THE COMPLETION OF APPROXIMATELY 1600 ACRES OF FUEL REDUCTION WORK.








17 acres in Austin Ravine completed done by WADNR post release crew.
