2024 Funding Proposal



#### 2024 Contracts

- Contracting period: January 1—June 30, 2024
- Home repair programs will then move to the Program Year cycle
  PY 2024: July 1, 2024—June 30, 2025
  - Current CDBG RFP is for PY 2024
- Ask: CHHS Board approval of 6-month budget

### Single Family Rehabilitation – Program Overview

- Provide low-interest loans for needed home repairs to help low- and moderate-income homeowners maintain a safe and efficient home
  - Loans range from \$10,000—50,000
  - Interest rate: 3%
  - Repayment: 15 years
  - Grants up to \$10,000 for income-limited households
- SNAP manages all aspects of the program
  - Loan qualification & underwriting
  - Home assessment & project scope of work
  - Project bidding & program management
- Serves the City of Spokane

#### **Common Rehabilitation Projects**

Roof replacement	Sewer repair or replacement
Window & door replacement	Electrical work
Plumbing repair	Egress windows
Home modifications to accommodate multi-generational families	Updates to deteriorating interior areas (flooring, bathrooms, kitchens, etc.)
Hazardous tree removal	ADA Modifications
Radon testing/remediation	Lead testing/remediation

## Single Family Rehabilitation – 2024 Goals

Activity #1: Unduplicated home rehabilitation loans delivered to homeowners who occupy the assisted home as their primary residence.	10 loans
Activity #2: Home rehabilitation grants, for an amount up to \$10,000, delivered to homeowners receiving a Single Family Rehabilitation loan to help offset the loan cost burden to low-and moderate-income homeowners.	4 grants
Activity #3: New client contacts each month, who will be counseled on the Single Family Rehabilitation program and application requirements.	50 contacts per month

### Minor Home Repair – Program Overview

- Provides minor home repairs as grants, up to \$6,000, to homeowners at or below 80% AMI
- Minor home repairs address health hazards, safety hazards, and/or accessibility issues that make homes unsafe or uninhabitable
- SNAP manages all aspects of the program
  - Client intake and qualifications
  - Project scope of work
  - Project management
- Serves the City of Spokane
  - MHR also receives funding from Spokane County and other sources

## Minor Home Repair – Program Overview

#### **Common Home Repair Projects**

Roof leaks/repair	Fixing broken windows/doors
Replacing flooring to mitigate a hazard	HVAC servicing & repair
Unclogging toilets & drains; minor plumbing work	In-kind replacement of kitchen appliances
Minor electrical work	Replacing malfunctioning water heater
Servicing smoke, fire, or carbon monoxide detectors	Pest inspection/treatment
ADA modifications: wheelchair ramps, han expanding doorways	drails, grab bars, bathroom modifications,
