2. Minutes:

A. March 8, 2018, and March 22, 2018 Park Board meeting minutes

Motion No. 1: Mike Fagan moved to approve the March 8, 2018, and March 22, 2018, Park Board meeting minutes.

Sally Lodato seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion No. 2: Chris Wright moved to approve claims for the month of March 2018 in the amount of \$3,626,975.45.

Steve Salvatori seconded. Motion carried unanimously. 6. <u>Financial report & budget update</u>: – Mark Buening provided the March financial report & budget update. Park Fund revenue is tracking at 87.9% of the projected budget. Parks and Recreation expenditures are tracking at 91.81% of the projected budget. The Golf Fund revenue is tracking at 189.44% of the projected budget. The Golf Fund expenditures are tracking at 93.83% of the projected budget. The Riverfront Park Bond budget of \$68.5 million has expended \$31.28 million and committed \$25 million, to date. This leaves a \$12.2 million bond fund, budget balance.

7. Special Discussion/Action Items:

A. <u>Urban Forestry Tree Committee assignments</u> – *Nick Sumner* explained the Spokane Municipal Code calls for two Park Board members to serve on the UFTC. For this reason, an adjustment is necessary to comply with code. Rick Chase and Jennifer Ogden have agreed to serve as members, and Chris Wright has agreed to serve as alternate.

Motion No. 3: Nick Sumner moved to approve Rick Chase as Urban Forestry Tree Committee chair, Jennifer Ogden as committee member and Chris Wright as alternate.

Jennifer Ogden seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

A. <u>Palisades Park Memorandum of Understanding</u> – *Greta Gilman* presented the proposed Palisades Park Memorandum of Understanding. Palisades is a community group of volunteers who provide stewardship for the Palisades Park and Indian Canyon National Area. This memorandum formalizes the relationship between Parks and Palisades which currently exist.

Motion No. 4: Greta Gilman moved to accept the Memorandum of Understanding between Parks and Palisades as presented.

Mike Fagan seconded Motion carried unanimously.

B. <u>Spokane Municipal Code Ordinance amendments and resolution/Park rules</u> – *Justin Worthington* presented the proposed amendments to SMC 12.06.040 & SMC 12.06.060. Mr. Worthington reported the purpose of the changes is to address issues of health and public safety by updating language and clarifying code ordinances. Park rangers are encountering issues of sprawling camps, drug needles, human waste, unsafe/illegal use of weapons, and crime and fire hazards. Mr. Worthington explained these ordinance amendments could allow Parks to better deal with some of these issues. Leroy Eadie explained these amendments do not include any policy changes. If approved by the Park Board, these proposed amendments

will need to be brought before City Council for consideration.

Motion No. 5: Greta Gilman moved to accept the Spokane Municipal Code Ordinance amendments and resolution as presented.

Chris Wright seconded Motion carried unanimously.

Riverfront Park Committee: April 9, 2018, Chris Wright

A. Riverfront Park art plan and signature artwork design - Melissa Huggins presented the proposed signature art piece design and the art plan. The Stepwell art design, created by Lead Artist Meejin Yoon, is the proposed signature art piece. The 30-foot by 20-foot design is reminiscent of the stepwells in India, and involves a stacked and laminated wood material with embedded steel structure which will seat approximately 65-75 people. Jamie SiJohn asked why the inspiration came from India as opposed to drawing from the Spokane region. Ms. Huggins explained the geometry of the piece was inspired by the Expo '74 World Fair logo and by the local landscape. Ms. Yoon describes it was inverting the landscape of Riverfront Park. Ms. Yoon is collecting additional information regarding a proposed site which would either be in the Clocktower or the Conservation area. The recommendation for the signature art piece site location is expected to come from the Joint Arts Committee and presented to the Riverfront Park Committee in the next month. Ms. Huggins reviewed the art plan and provided images of the art signage design. The art signage design involves a measuring-stick style marker featuring a stainless steel plate with information pertaining to the artwork and a QR code. The art marker also notes the specific height above sea level. The art plan involves 18 existing art pieces, three sites for potential artwork, and two possible sites for a butterfly garden.

Motion No. 6: Ted McGregor moved to accept the Riverfront Park art plan and signature artwork design as presented.

Chris Wright seconded Motion carried with a 10-1 vote.

B. <u>Pavilion and Promenade GMP and design development</u> – *Matthew Walker and Keith Comes* presented the proposed Pavilion and Promenade Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) in the amount of \$16,521,915, plus tax. The Promenade GMP is \$4,150,000, plus tax, which involves some scope reductions. Mr. Walker explained in some cases some scope of work was increased. The Promenade scope reductions were necessary to maintain project budget. Mr. Comes reviewed the landscape, movable stage, elevation experience, shade element and the lighting features.

Motion No. 7: Ted McGregor moved to accept the Pavilion and Promenade GMP and design development as presented.

C. <u>Visit Spokane Memorandum of Understanding/regional information center</u> – *Jonathan Moog* presented the proposed Visit Spokane Memorandum of Understanding which endorses Visit Spokane to establish a regional information center in the former Fountain Café building. The first term of the agreement ends December 2022. The agreement may then be renewed with three, two-year options. Visit Spokane will provide a customer service desk for phone and in-person inquiries for the park's programs and services, and general information. Guest services will include park memberships and ticket sales, booking private facility rentals, assisting with will-call functions, and a lost and found center. The construction project is scheduled to come before the Finance Committee as an action today.

Motion No. 8: Ted McGregor moved to accept the Visit Spokane Memorandum of Understanding/regional information center as presented.

Gerry Sperling seconded Motion carried unanimously.

D. <u>Historic Carousels, Inc., contract amendment and sole source resolution/Looff Carrousel</u> (\$25,000) – *Jonathan Moog* presented an overview of a contract amendment with Historic Carousels Inc. and a sole source resolution in the amount of \$25,000. Parks originally contracted with Historic Carousels for \$49,000 to install the Looff Carrousel. Due to unforeseen needs, the department anticipates it will exceed the initial contracted amount before work is completed.

Motion No. 9: Ted McGregor moved to accept the contract amendment with Historic Carousels, Inc., and the sole source resolution as presented.

Jennifer Ogden seconded Motion carried unanimously.

E. <u>Budget reallocation/North Butterfly design and construction (\$117,500)</u> – *Berry Ellison* presented a proposed reallocation of \$117,500 from the North Bank budget to be used for design and restoration of the North Butterfly. This amount includes a 15% construction contingency and 8.8% tax. Mr. Ellison reviewed the design and specification report developed by GuildWorks. The design involves restoring the Butterfly as a moving feature with fabric wings which may be replaced. Craig Lee of Coffman Engineers is volunteering his time for the structural engineering support on the project.

Motion No. 10: Ted McGregor moved to accept a reallocation of funds from the North Bank project to Promenades for the design and construction of the North Butterfly in the amount of \$117,500, including a 15% contingency and 8.8% tax.

Jamie SiJohn seconded Motion carried unanimously.

F. <u>T. LaRiviere final balancing change order #10R/Howard Street Bridge South (\$139,649.06 credit)</u> – *Berry Ellison* presented the final balancing change order #10R with T. LaRiviere in the credit amount of \$139,649.06. The change order includes the bid items listed in the contract, less additional work including power extensions to new Looff switch panel, upgraded light fixture fasteners, specialized amenity zone wire mesh fasteners, and additional galvanizing.

Motion No. 11: Ted McGregor moved to approve the final balancing change order #10R with T. LaRiviere on the Howard Street Bridge South project in the credit amount of the \$139,649.06.

Chris Wright seconded Motion carried unanimously.

G. <u>North Star Enterprises traffic control and detour plans contract amendment #4 (\$4,000)</u> – *Berry Ellison* presented the proposed contract amendment #4 with North Star Enterprises for traffic control and detour plans in the amount of \$4,000.

Motion No. 12: Ted McGregor moved to accept contract amendment #4 with North Star Enterprises for traffic control and detour plans in the amount of \$4,000.

Steve Salvatori seconded Motion carried unanimously.

H. <u>Contractors Northwest Inc. change order #17/Recreational Rink (\$5,026.26)</u> – *Berry Ellison* presented change order #17 with Contractors Northwest Inc. in the amount of \$5,026.26. The change order includes credit for work not performed, adding receptacles at street light poles, and replacing one site light pole damaged by staff.

Motion No. 13: Ted McGregor moved to accept change order #17 with Contractors Northwest Inc. for work on the Recreational Rink project in the amount of \$5,026.26.

Gerry Sperling seconded Motion carried unanimously.

I. <u>Bill Fearn naming proposal/Former YMCA site conservation area</u> – *Hal McGlathery* provided background on a proposal to name the former YMCA site/conservation area in Riverfront Park in honor of Bill Fearn, former director of Parks and Recreation during Expo '74 from 1965 - 1980. Mr. McGlathery also acknowledged special guests from the Fearn family who were in attendance. With Park Board approval of the naming proposal, the next steps will be to create interpretive signage, consistent will Park signage design, which will feature Mr. Fearn's accomplishments, and his contributions to Parks and the community. A ceremony will be scheduled for sometime this summer.

Motion No. 14: Ted McGregor moved to approve the naming proposal to name the former YMCA site conservation area in honor of Bill Fearn.

Rick Chase seconded Motion carried unanimously.

J. <u>Riverfront Park redevelopment update</u> – *Garrett Jones* presented the monthly bond update. Project highlights include: 1) Looff Carrousel and Rotary Fountain – Carrousel installation is underway and grand opening is scheduled for spring 2018; and 2) Pavilion and Central/North Promenades – Parking Lot #2 will close the end of April and the Centennial Trail detour route is in place.

A. <u>Fountain Café tenant improvements project (\$107,882.82)</u> – *Chris Wright* presented the proposed Fountain Café tenant improvement project contract. The contract involves a base bid and alternate 1 in the amount of \$107,882.82 with low bidder M.E. Uphus Construction for the Fountain Café tenant improvement project. Construction includes converting the front half of the building to a vanilla shell which Visit Spokane will utilize as a regional visitor center.

Motion No. 15: Chris Wright moved to approve a contract with low bidder M.E. Uphus Construction for the construction of the Fountain Café tenant improvements project in the amount of \$107,882.82.

Mike Fagan seconded Motion carried unanimously.

B. <u>Aquatics chemical value blanket</u> – *Chris Wright* presented the proposed aquatics chemical value blanket in the amount \$93,805.11.

Motion No. 16: Chris Wright moved to approve the Aquatics chemical value blanket as presented.

Mike Fagan seconded Motion carried unanimously.

C. <u>Public Works Memorandum of Understanding/Howard Street Bridge South</u> – *Chris Wright* presented the proposed Public Works Memorandum of Understanding. The purpose of the memorandum is to memorialize the ownership of the bridge and define each department's responsibility for maintenance of the bridge. Public Works will accept ownership of the new bridge, and will be responsible for inspection and maintenance of all structural elements of the bridge. Public Works will also assume payment of construction of the bridge project not to exceed \$7.1 million. Parks will be responsible for maintaining the non-structural parts of the bridge, such as lighting, railings, private electrical service and other surface amenities, as well as the surface of the bridge.

Motion No. 17: Chris Wright moved to approve the Memorandum of Understanding between Public Works and Parks relating to the Howard Street Bridge South project.

Steve Salvatori seconded Motion carried unanimously.

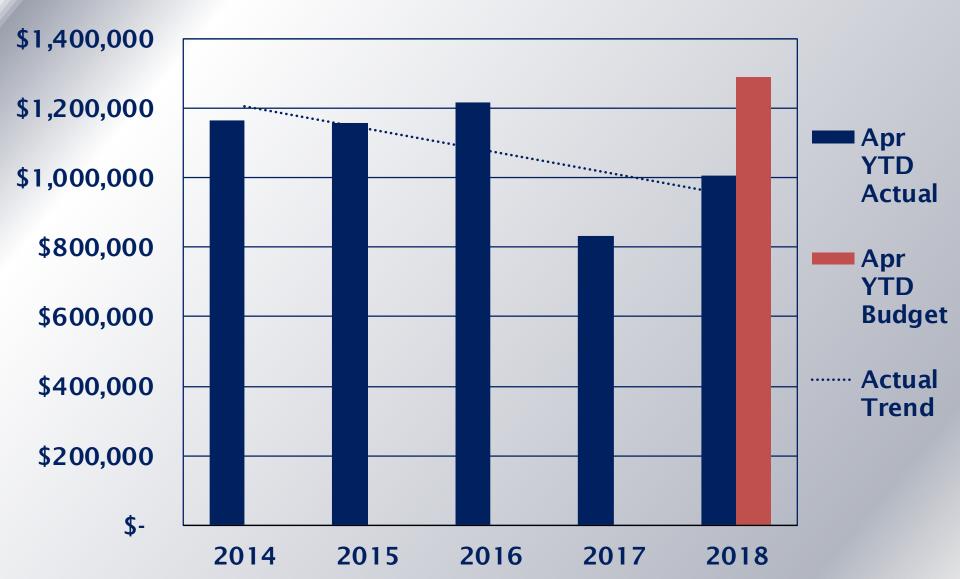

Park Fund Revenue 5 Year Trend & YTD Budget

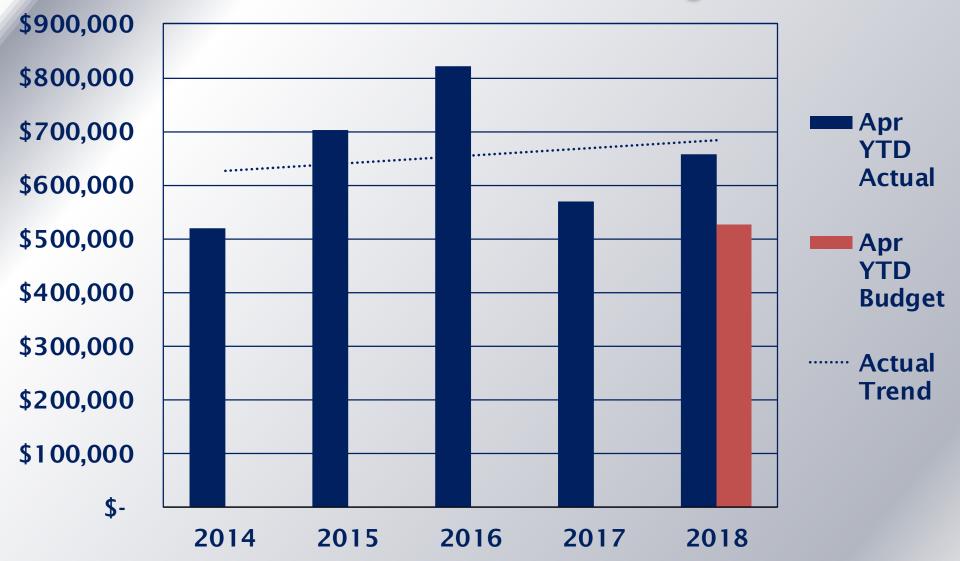

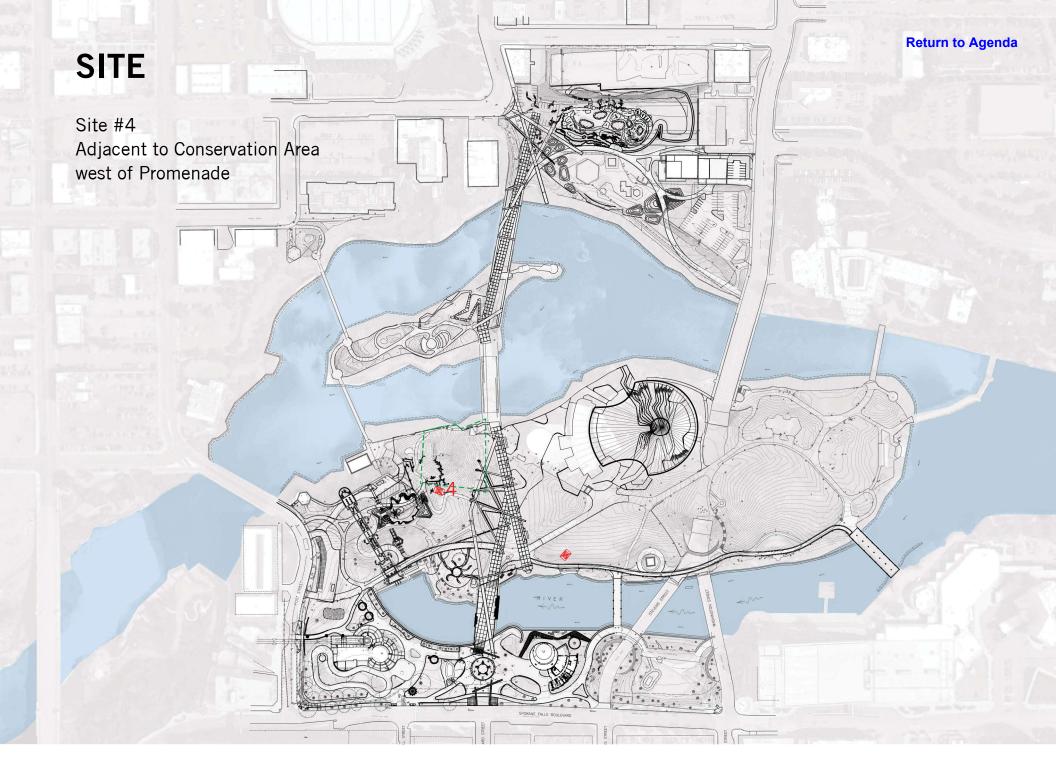

4.) All decisions by the Administrative Review Board are final.

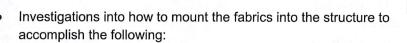
#### Design & Specification Report for Riverfront Park Butterfly Wings and Tension System

GuildWorks was hired by Garco Construction to design a solution to attach fabric under tension to the existing butterfly frame shown to the right. The "Riverfront Park Butterfly Wings and Tensioning System" conceptual design process is now complete and this is a report of GuildWorks's findings.

The photo to the right shows the original fabric, note how it wrinkles and not totally smooth. This is because of inadequate tensioning. This wrinkling effect is not great for logos and other art visuals. GuildWorks solution offers even tensioning.

#### What was accomplished:

- Full FEM analysis of wind loading on butterfly structure to give Coffman the data needed to reengineer the mast to support the butterfly with fabric wings plus giving our own structural suggestions which included:
  - Concept and discussions with Coffman about design some locking pins into the rotation and lift on the butterfly to be held in place during changing the fabrics so the structure does not pivot and move during that time



- Fabrics to be in full tension and presenting completely smooths with minimal to no wrinkles
- Be easy to replace and install by park personnel
- o Be possible to mount onto existing frame without to much structural work
- o Removed the use of battens in the design due to cost of installing battens
- Battens would add difficulty to installation process and they would likely break the smooth surface required for including logos and other artwork.
- Investigation into materials of the fabrics with the following in mind:
  - Life span concept to be determined
  - Ease of adding imagery to the fabric wings
  - o Ease of installing based on weight and type of fabric
  - Potential to change out butterfly wings for specific events, seasonal art, or simply to refresh over time.
  - Potential to print on the fabrics or do applique designs
- Pricing out new fabrics and potential replacement cost



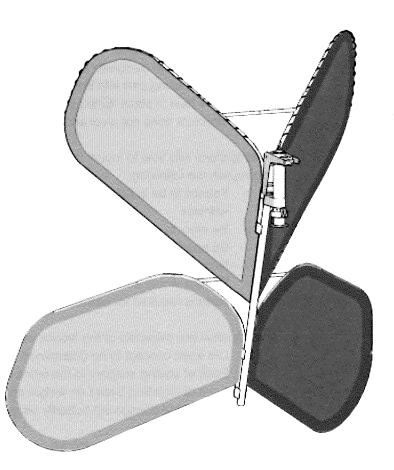

#### **Mounting Solution**

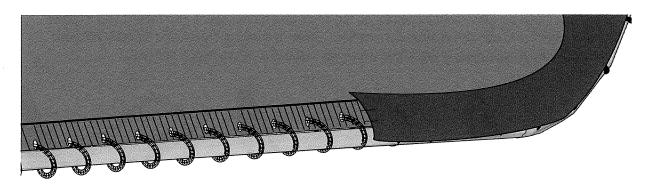
GuildWorks has settled in on "Lashing" an older relatively low tech way of attaching the butterfly sails to the frame. We have looked at many modern high tech systems and determined lashing would be the best suited method for the following reasons:

- This method is simple and anyone can do it allowing the sails to be mounted with just a very simple set of instructions.
- The ease of attachment means that changing the sails on the butterfly can be considered for special events or seasonally as desired without specialized labor.
- This method allows for tension of the fabric to be slowly applied one lash at a time increasing the tension on the overall sail as it is lashed to the frame. This pretensioning is very important to the smooth look of the fabric installed as well as removing any flapping, and increasing longevity.
- This method has does not require additional structural framework or for new frames unlike some higher tech attachment techniques which would require full rebuilding of the existing frame.
- The rope used to lash, sail to frame, can be provide an extra safety precaution in the engineering of the structure. The rope can be designed to break in very high wind load situations—i.e., winds over 70 mph. This would only be an issue in a rare case where the wind does not lift or pivot the butterfly on the mast as it is designed to do but instead curls around the backside pushing quickly into the butterfly and pushing it against the mast before it has had a chance to spin. In this case the rope could break releasing the fabric, there by lower loading on the overall frame and mast.

The following image shows the "Basic Lashing System" around the frame, It should be noted that the fabric is reinforced where the sail is grommeted, along the outside edge of each sail.



The image below shows how there could be flap added to the sail of each wing which could hide the grommets and part of the frame bar from the front side. Please note it would still be visible from the back but you would never see light through the holes of the grommets so they would disappear more.



#### Materials

GuildWorks is suggesting one range of materials for the sails of the butterflies based on the following

- Provide a material that is not to heavy so that one person could hold the fabric easily while working in a lift basket for installation
- Provide a material that can be dye sublimation printing so that logos, artwork, and other visuals can be presented on the butterfly wings as desired and show from both sides
- Provide a material that is a reasonable cost allowing for lower cost special orders for events

The choice we found is standard within the advertising printing world, these fabric are lightweight structural cloths used some times for large backlighting printed visuals. They have polyester bases with coatings to allow them to hold up to UV light for a period of time but light and easy to install.

- A cloth of this sort as the base can take dye sublimation printing, which is the best way to place any image, visual or artwork onto the butterfly with the least cost and fastest turnaround.
- Can last 1-2 years easily outside with a good printed image (up to 3 years total)
- Durable enough to be taken down and reinstalled if needed for a custom event.
- Lightweight compared to longer lasting coated cloths.

GuildWorks will be providing samples of these cloths soon as we are gathering the different options now.

#### Applying an Image - Printing vs Applique

GuildWorks envisions the butterfly sails being changed out and different colors and imagery happening on them throughout the year. This could be seasonal, but could also be per event. Our fastest way to place visuals on the cloth is through dye-sublimation printing. There are also options using different colored clothes and using an sewn applique technique which will result in a different look and feel.



#### **Dye-Sublimation Printing**

#### Pros:

- Images are permanent and do not peel
- Dye does not build up on the fabric but is bonded into it
- Colors can be extraordinarily brilliant due to the bonding of the dye to the transparent fibers of the synthetic fabric
- Truly continuous tones can be achieved that are equivalent to photographs, without the use of special techniques such as half-screen printing
- The image can be printed over the entire wing with no difficulty in printing edge to edge
- Fine detailed lines, art and photographic images can be presented
- An artistic image can be exactly scaled and transferred at a lower cost and exactness
- Transmitted backlight & back sunlight would show through the image brilliantly

#### Cons:

- The image can look a little bit lighter more faded on the back side in reflected light—i.e., street lamp lightings towards the back side
- Sunlight will degrade the image causing it to fade faster than solid colored cloth.

#### **Sewn Applique**

Pros:

- fabric applique is a brilliant looking technique when done well and can graphicly make a big visual impact
- Fabric colors will last longer than the printed image
- Color reads the same from both sides in all lighting situations
- Simple applique like the original colored bands could be comparable or lower cost than dye sublimation printing.

#### Cons:

- Time consuming and higher budget to produce
- Image detail & resolutions is limited due to sewing fabric together vs printing an image
- Not good for photographic imagery or art reproductions

#### Summary of Applique vs Dye sublimation

• Both options work well and there are good reasons for either depending on the purpose - for a one time special event dye sublimation is likely the best way to go due to cost savings in production. However for ongoing daily park use and park branding, applique might offer a longer life design and feel more sophisticated.

#### Budget for butterfly sails

#### **Butterfly Wings Set Budget Options:**

All budget ranges below are estimated high as early calculations and subject to change. It is likely through our initial production process we may discover additional cost savings.

The original butterfly wings featured colorful stripes our lowest estimate is based on this type of design.

I have the following questions/comments on this proposal:

The scope of work is to install 13 footings for future signage:

- Are the anchor bolts priced as stainless steel or galvanized? If SS can you give us a deduct for galvanized? A deduct for galvanized can be applied. I asked the question and didn't hear back so I priced per plan.
- The general pricing to do the work seems reasonable but the GCs seem a little excessive.

GCs:

- You are charging .75 months for the backhoe. This is over 1 day for each footing I would think at least 2 per day is more
  - reasonable. You also have money in equipment under excavation?

We'll need to backfill and compact once we strip the forms. The cost shown in excavation is for j-tamp for action pre/post

compaction pre/post

- Please explain why you are charging mobilization since you currently have 3 excavators on site. Different equipment being used and need to get over to the INB site
- You are charging disposal in both the GCs and the earthwork? Disposal in the GCs is for refuse from the forms and etc. Disposal in earthwork is for hauling excess material to stockpile or dump
- Unless you are adding a superintendent I'm not sure why you are charging for this. He is already paid for in the base contract including his site truck.

It's added scope that will take additional coordination of crews and paperwork, we can change that to a GF but the cost are similar

- Usually small tools are part of your labor costs? The way we put this together in our estimating program the labor cost are only labor and fringe package
- What is the other charge of \$500 for safety? Related costs of company furnished safety equipment and additional protective measures for anchor bolt protrusions, again not built into the labor rates.

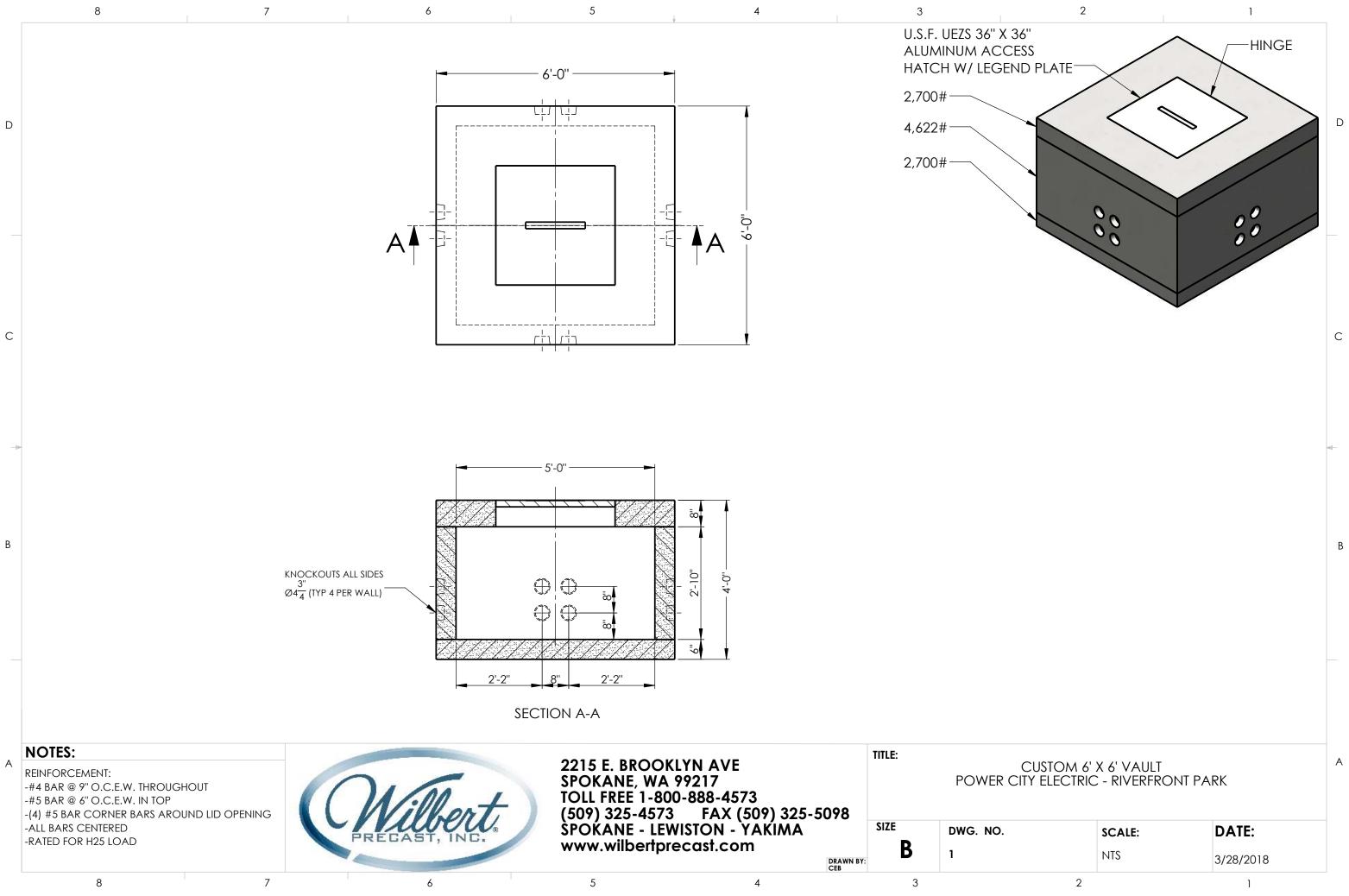
