MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 8:01 a.m. by committee chair Gerry Sperling.

Public comment - None

Action items

- 1. Spirit Pruners LLC. Change order #1 / Downriver Golf Course Forest Health Management (\$88,650.00+tax) Nick Hamad
 - a. To recap, this project was authorized by the Park Board on Jan 4, 2023, with work commencing on Jan. 9. As the trees were felled, the decay and deterioration was obvious. Ben Nelson, Katie Kosanke and Steve Nittolo have become quite adept at identifying infected trees and will continue to evaluate 15-20 potential trees on a regular basis. As of today, all the infected trees have been felled with logs, heavy brush and machinery completely removed. On Monday, Spirit Pruners will bring in a tub grinder, chipping remaining debris one inch or larger, with a project completion set for the end of next week. Ben's work on this project, as well as identifying problematic trees at Indian Canyon has been exceptional.
 - b. As anticipated, there are three factors causing a price increase. All bids were generated as though the ground would remain frozen throughout the process, recognizing a change order may be necessary if the ground were to thaw. As such, due to the warmer weather in January, modifications to the process were made to minimize sizable ruts or other damage to the terrain. A trail was created using sheets of plywood covered with old tires for the machines to travel on. This resulted in additional labor costs. Additionally, it was determined the use of a forwarder (a machine that picks up and carries the logs off the premises) rather than a skidder (which drags the logs across the terrain) should be used to prevent further damage to the softened terrain. This machine is more expensive than the originally quoted machine. As a cautionary measure prior to completion, the Urban Foresters recommended the removal of additional trees showing symptoms of the infestation, increasing the overall cost of the project. Note: Urban Forestry was planning to remove four trees near the clubhouse but agreed to cover the expense for Spirit Pruners to remove them.

Motion #1 – Gerry Sperling moved to recommend the Spirit Pruners LLC. Change order #1 / Downriver Golf Course Forest Health Management (\$88,650.00+tax).

Nick Sumner seconded. The motion passed unanimously (4-0 vote).

The committee agreed to present this recommendation as a regular agenda item on the Feb. 9 Park Board meeting agenda.

2. 2023 Golf/Parks Chemical/Fertilizer Value Blanket – Mark Poirier

Ben Nelson researched several vendors for this annual value blanket. It covers all the turf chemicals used throughout the park system and golf courses for 2023, which also aids in locking in the lowest prices. This is approximately \$35,000 higher than the 2022 value blanket. Moving forward, the annual value blanket will be presented each February for Park Board approval.

Motion #1 – Gerry Sperling moved to recommend the Spirit Pruners LLC. Change order #1 / Downriver Golf Course Forest Health Management (\$88,650.00+tax).

Barb Richey seconded. The motion passed unanimously (4-0 vote).

The committee agreed to present this recommendation as a consent agenda item on the Feb. 9 Park Board meeting agenda.

Discussion item

- 1. 2022 Water Savings Nick Hamad
 - a. To improve turf, reduce maintenance and reduce water use, Park Board committed to

eliminating manual watering at Esmeralda and Indian Canyon, concentrate Spokane Investment Pool (SIP) loan improvements on course, combine Downriver stormwater and irrigation into one project to reduce impact on players, avoiding a street project. Currently, the irrigation systems at three of four courses have seen significant improvements, including weather-based controls. The new systems were put in place not only to save water, but to improve the courses. In 2022, approximately 140 million gallons of water was used, compared to an average of 250 million gallons per year prior to 2019, when the project began, which is a 41% reduction in usage. All three new courses saved enough water to qualify for the City's water credit incentive discount program. Essentially, the water savings amounted to around 875 houses worth of water usage per year.

- b. An outside consultant was hired by the water department to evaluate systems for efficiency versus total use. The results revealed interesting statistics: based on current turf and weather conditions, the software determines how much water should be used for peak efficiency and calculates how much was actually used. Beginning in 2016, the course usage was consistently higher than peak efficiency usage. Beginning in 2020 during the irrigation renovations, the actual usage drops, closely following the peak efficiency usage. By 2022, the actual usage drops slightly below the recommended peak efficiency usage. There is a desire to leverage this 90% efficiency rating with the Water Department for future funding opportunities with an irrigation renovation at Qualchan.
- c. The committee would like to recommend Marketing use this information to show that Spokane Parks with Golf in particular, are excellent stewards of natural resources. This should help when the time comes to increase greens fees. Mark pointed out that turf conditions can make or break a game. Good turf helps the ball move faster and longer, decreasing the handicap, which is something every golfer strives to achieve.

2. 2022 Player No Show Data - Mark Poirier

In May of 2022, a \$30 no-show fee was implemented into the online booking system, garnering \$8,010 in revenue for 2022. A three-year average number of no-shows from 2019-2021 was 2,500. After the implementation of the no-show fee, there were approximately 1,500 no-shows. In addition to the revenue, tackling no-shows resulted in a \$128,000 net savings to the golf fund.

3. Qualchan Clubhouse Window Project Update – Mark Poirier

As of yesterday, the windows have all been installed. Although the original contract, generated in September with a December completion date, was extended to March 1. The original hazy glass was replaced with energy efficient low-e (emissivity) windows, enhancing the spectacular view from the clubhouse. They are slightly tinted which will alleviate the summer heat. Bob Anderson requested a follow-up in a few years to see the actual energy savings.

Standing reports

- 1. Golf marketing report will be shared by Fianna Dickson at the Feb. 9 Park Board meeting.
- 2. <u>Golf financial report</u> was tabled as this is the 13th month. The 2022 summary and monthly report will be shared at the March Golf Committee meeting.
- 3. Superintendents' reports What's Happening at the Courses Mark Poirier
 - a. <u>Downriver</u> Ben Nelson reports they are currently backpack blowing, cleaning greens and applying fungicide. Most greens are exposed, and conditions look great. Due to early snowfall, the fairways are struggling. The course is still covered with leaves, but as it dries, they continue to blow and sweep. He is also seeing affected fairways due to the early snowfall. David Fern reported the simulator has been pretty busy.
 - b. <u>Qualchan</u> Rob Decker reports the tees and greens are looking good; they are cleaning up the shop; they will begin cleaning brush and removing a few dead trees. Mark Gardner is excited to "see" the completion of the window installation.

- c. <u>Indian Canyon</u> Josh Hardy reports with 95 days of snow cover, they did one to two applications of fungicide, but only six fairways have been sprayed with no end in sight and anticipates some turf damage. Urban Forestry and the fire department has been onsite attempting to mitigate the dead standing trees. The cross-country ski trails have been closed most of the winter due to machine breakdowns and lack of snow on the trail itself. Doug Phares has been running the simulator in both the pro shop and teaching facility.
- d. <u>Esmerelda</u> Mike Vandenburg reports the removal of one wind-damaged and two dead trees. Urban Forestry has approved the removal of a few more trees for playability when feasible. Rob Sanders reports two simulators are full Tue-Sat. Simulator leagues will wrap up the end of the month.
- 4. Other: Jason Conley stated that as of Friday, the State Auditor, who routinely audits Golf, gave a glowing review on the accounting process and wanted to acknowledge Meghan Dyson, Sarah Johnson and the golf pros who prep the paperwork. This was not always the case with golf. Golf is the number one revenue generator in the Parks Division. Gerry Sperling mentioned that there will be a shift in Park Board leadership with members moving to different committees. She indicated she will be leaving Golf to chair the Riverfront Park committee and it has been a joy working with Mark and his team. Nick Sumner will take over as chair of the Golf committee.

Adjournment: The meeting was adjourned at 9:13 a.m.



2022 Player No show Data

 On May 2022, the no show feature for online bookings went into effect. A \$30 fee has been charged to players failing to show up to their tee time, without canceling or modifying, prior to checking in.

• May – 24.....(\$720)

• June – 41.....(\$1230)

• July – 63.....(\$1890)

August – 57.....(\$1710)

September – 64....(\$1920)

• October – 18...... (\$540)

• Total no show fee revenue for 2022 = \$8,010











How much did it save us?

- Using The Creek at Qualchan as our standard for comparison.
- Past 3 year average (2019-2021) # of no shows = 2,500
- Last year's (2022) # of now shows = 1,500
 - 1,000 rounds X \$30 (average fee) = \$30,000
 - \$30,000 savings per course X 4 = **\$120,000**
 - \$120,000 savings + \$8,000 fees = \$128,000 net savings to Golf Fund!
