MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 8:07 a.m. by committee chair Barb Richey. Due to technical difficulties, there is not a full recording available.

Discussion item

1. Capital outlay for remainder of 2025 - Nick Hamad

Currently, the capital item list is more reactive rather than proactive, although Golf is much better off today than 7-8 years ago. The attached list is mostly P1 items, indicating high priority (high risk and/or liability) based on user and supervisor feedback. Qualchan requires the most repairs. Most of the items which need replacing are well beyond their life expectancy. The supervisors have done an amazing job bandaging the ailing equipment. If Golf were to fix every broken item on the attached list, it could run upwards of \$20,000,000 with a 4% +/- increase each year it is deferred. Golf is primarily funded by the players through course fees, etc. Barb Richey would like to see the likelihood of refinancing the FIF loan. Rich Lentz would be able to answer this and it will be discussed at the today's Finance Committee. Barb emphasized thinking creatively to finance more projects. Nick suggested taking care of as many lower dollar items as possible with the current capital funding. Nick stated Qualchan is in dire need of a total irrigation replacement, as the original pipes are thin, cracking and delaminating. It would be cost effective to replace the system rather than major repairs. Moving forward, new piping would have a 100-year life expectancy, saving considerable money in the future.

2. 2024-2025 pass sales comparison – Jennifer Papich

It is apparent the pass discount incentives have had no bearing on sales. There were no incentives offered for the 2025 Golf year and Pass sales have continued to grow.

3. Software update – Jennifer Papich

A request for bid was put out autumn of 2024. The Golf staff spent several weeks of training in early spring but were not fully comfortable with system and felt that introducing it at the start of the season would be unfair to the patrons. It was decided to wait until October to introduce the system. The contract with Club Profit remains open and available for use until the end of 2025.

Standing reports

Golf marketing report – Fianna Dickson

Fianna and Mark discussed two key growth areas to focus on for summer marketing: Reputation (Quality of Course ~ Quality of Play) and Pass Sales (60% +/- of the players have a discount pass). They designed the interactive "What Pass is Right for Me" advertisement which played on a couple different platforms June and July. The second advertisement was Course Investment Highlights, reminding the community that Golf is not funded by taxes, but rather by the players themselves and will be running through the end of October. Additionally, the Google search by continues to keep Spokane City Golf at the top of the list. The brand awareness campaign runs on streaming services August through October. The social media pages for each of the courses has great engagement. Rob Sanders mentioned he would like to see updated course logos.

2. Golf financial report - Jennifer Papich

Financially, Golf in general is doing great with a \$164,877 year to date gain in revenue. Due to the recent capital equipment purchases, there is a \$313,000+ year-to-date loss. Rounds are up across the board by over 6,000 with a total revenue of \$102,697.

3. Superintendents' reports - What's Happening at the Courses – Jennifer Papich

- a. <u>Downriver</u> course remains in excellent condition. The public loves the cart path renovations. The maintenance building roof has been completed.
- b. <u>Qualchan</u> Rob Decker said that with 300 rounds per day, his team has been quite busy fixing everything that can be fixed. They are gearing up for City Championships. Doug Kelley recommended staff take a look at the roof on the clubhouse. He indicated there was a lot of pine needles which could be fire fuel.
- c. Indian Canyon Doug Phares and staff once again organized the Rosauers Open which raised \$170,000 for Vanessa Behan. Playing on behalf of Spokane Parks was the incomparable team of Mark Poirier, Rich Lentz, Jason Conley, Barb Richie and Garrett Jones. Kyle Kelly also played in the tournament. Thanks to Josh Harty, the course looks amazing. Mike Hamm was hired as the new long-awaited 2nd assistant. The City Championship is coming up and the Pro Am is Monday. The Canyonette Scramble is tonight. KSPS is doing some filming for this event. Kyle added the chef and food is spectacular at the clubhouse. Barb complimented Kyle on stepping up to instruct some beginner players.
- d. <u>Esmeralda</u> The North Freya Street project is now complete, which was impacting the ingress and egress to the course. They added in fencing along the NE corner boundary. Mark is looking at previously owned sources to replace their pro-gator, new is \$40,000.
