SUMMARY

- Katie Kosanke presented a summary of the proposed PLANT (Protecting Leaves and Adding New Trees) ordinance.
- Due to Matt Ugaldea's scheduling conflicts, Tim Kohlhauff shared topics discussed in the Citizen Advisory Committee (CAC) meeting, most of which revolved around the proposed PLANT ordinance.
- Katie Kosanke provided Urban Forestry's monthly report, comprised of current tree work in the parks performed by Staff, clearance pruning along pathways, and providing support for upcoming projects.
- The September financial report that was reviewed by Katie Kosanke reflected significant reduction in expenditures.

Discussion Items:

1. PLANT Ordinance Update

Katie presented a summary of the proposed ordinance changes such as; new construction Street Tree planting and irrigation requirements currently applicable only to commercial development would also apply to single-family residential and duplex development; verbiage regarding tree standards, protection requirements during construction, adjacent property owner responsibilities, etc. contained in the ordinance would now also be included in the standards section for development; introduction of new construction tree incentives for retaining trees rather than having them removed from the development site. Several outreach events and two Plan Commission workshops have already been held regarding this proposed PLANT ordinance, and the next step will be a hearing before the Plan Commission on October 23rd. Standing Report Items:

1. <u>Citizen Advisory Report</u>

Tim reported that a very beneficial and informational discussion took place during the Citizen Advisory Committee (CAC) meeting regarding the proposed PLANT ordinance. Also mentioned was the Reforest Spokane event on October 12th sponsored by Lands Council and Avista that will include planting seedlings along the river and work in the downtown core.

2. <u>Urban Forestry Monthly Update</u>

Katie presented the monthly update, which included plans to work with the four City golf courses to create a tree maintenance plan comprised of input from the course superintendents and Urban Forestry personnel; providing a scope of work in conjunction with the Esmeralda irrigation replacement project; clearance pruning along pathways and in several parks; along with tree work in Riverfront Park in preparation for the Pavilion's Grand Opening.

3. <u>Urban Forestry Financial Report</u>

Katie reviewed the September financial report that reflected reduced expenditures with intention to purchase a needed trailer.
