Discussion Items:

1. Tree City USA Stats – Katie Kosanke

Katie presented a Tree City USA Summary noting this is our annual report for our accreditation through the Arbor Day Foundation to be an official Tree City USA. An application must be submitted every year. Some of the requirements to be a Tree City USA through the Arbor Day Foundation include spending at least \$2 per capita on Urban Forestry activities and must have a tree board, a tree ordinance and an Arbor Day Celebration. The annual report also documents all the work UF is accomplishing throughout the year.

- a. **Community Trees Planted** A total of 3,023 trees were planted in 2025. Many trees were planted on city property by Spokane Ponderosa. Seedlings were planted on golf courses in areas where trees were lost. A seedling distribution event was held for Arbor Day and seedlings were also provided for the Shadle Plant Swap. Trees were planted throughout the park system and some bigger trees at the golf courses. Trees were planted through the SpoCanopy program, the grant project, engineering projects, the downtown tree program and at the school yard forest.
- b. **Tree Symposium and Seedling Giveaway** Urban Forestry partnered with On-Track Academy for their 5th Tree Hero Tree Symposium. There was a tree planting demonstration, lots of seedlings distributed to the community with students bagging and tagging 1,000 seedlings with the tree species, lots of events, activities and refreshments.
- c. On-Track Academy Outdoor Forest Classroom OTA acquired a grant for the project and UF through their IRA grant was able to provide trees through the Conservation District. It is a whole outdoor classroom where students can meet at the trees with their teachers and have a different learning environment. Students made benches with the Conservation District for the Outdoor Forest Classroom and are also going to plant native plants. A ribbon cutting was held with the mayor in the fall.
- d. **Arbor Day Celebration** Annual Spring Celebration that is a Tree City USA requirement to keep our accreditation. It is a great event with music, free refreshments, a ceremonial tree planting, and the Spokane County Regional Waste Ambassadors hold a compost fair.
- e. **SpoCanopy Street Tree Plantings** In Partnership with The Lands Council with plantings done in the Spring and the Fall. The Lands Council helps find planting spots for trees and communicates with people that sign up for trees. Funding is now through the IRA USDA USFS grant. Lots of contractor plantings being done and volunteer plantings will take place in the spring and fall. Amber Ramirez with Urban Forestry is coordinating, and the city is handling utility locates.
- f. **Susie Forest Plantings** Nancy McKerrow donated multiple trees which were funded by her through Susie Forest and other programs. UF nominated Nancy for a Washington Recreation and Parks Association citation of merit award for the Susie Trail and tree plantings. She was chosen to receive the award, and it was presented to her at the annual conference which was held in Tri-Cities area in the spring.
- g. **Fall Leaf Festival** Annual Fall Festival with typical festivities. No compost fair was held. The compost fair will only be held now in the spring at the Arbor Day Celebration.
- h. **Fundraiser 5k** Tree Trot fundraiser to raise funds for the Willow nature-based project. The event had great participation and many sponsors. UF has completed a survey, done

outreach and has a concept plan for the project. The project is not on the list yet for funding. The Tree Trot will be held again next year to raise funds and UF is also looking into grants.

- i. UF Crew Work Lots of work was done throughout the year including pruning, tree removals, mulching, limited fuels reduction work, and storm damage response. Projects are fit in when they can. The grant is helping to catch up on deferred maintenance that hasn't been able to be done previously and UF has been able to invest in pruning park trees through contractors.
- j. **Field Operations Arborist Crew** The crew pruned over 663 trees and removed approximately 482 dead or dying trees. These numbers don't include fuels reduction, these are trees that were removed throughout the park system. There has been another outbreak of beetles at Manito. UF will provide communication regarding the infected trees before the work is started. UF continues to work closely with the entomologist at the DNR to make sure doing everything they can to limit future impacts and try to prevent significant impacts.
- k. **IRA USDA USFS Grant** Through the grant over a million dollars was invested in 2025. Contractors planted over 300 trees and removed over 400 dead or poor condition trees. Some pruning work has been done on school property, in parks, in some business districts and some neighborhoods. Pruning in neighborhoods will ramp up in the summer. A list is on the Tree Equity Spokane website that shows the order pruning will be done for each neighborhood through 2029. The order is based off canopy tools that show items like canopy cover, income and need. The pruning work will be focused on high-risk pruning, clearance pruning and formative pruning of young trees. Trees are provided by and cared for by the Spokane Conservation District.
- I. Fuels Reduction / Forest Health Nearly 900 acres of fuels reduction work was completed in 2025. Over \$520,000 was invested in fuels reduction through Nick Jeffries work at the Fire Department as a Wildland Resource Planner. For all fuels reduction projects on city property Urban Forestry is involved in writing and reviewing the prescription for the work to be done, monitoring the work onsite and providing quality control. Only smaller trees 8 inches in diameter or less are being removed and they are being chipped and added back to the forest floor.
- m. **Engineering Construction Projects** There were 38 Engineering construction projects in 2025. Uran Forestry is involved in all street projects to outline any trees that need to be pruned, removed, or protected. The Engineering Department often design projects around trees and the scope of work Urban Forestry provides generally includes protective fencing around trees and pruning lower branches on trees, so neither the trees nor equipment are damaged when they are doing the street work.
- n. **Engineering Dept Collaboration** The Engineering Department spent over \$400,000 on tree work associated with city projects. They often design around trees to limit impact, and 260 trees were planted by contractors for city engineering projects.
- Volunteer Hours There were 898 volunteer hours for the year with many groups helping
 with planting and other various projects. There were also lots of volunteer hours from the
 Urban Forestry committees for meetings attended.

p. **Tree City USA Totals** – The total UF Investment was \$2,991,519.37, which equals \$13.16 per capita.

Discussion took place regarding the Tree Equity Website and if there is a map to track what work is being done in the community. There is a list on the website with a schedule. More information may be added to the website like a counter showing how many trees were planted, pruned, and removed. Currently information about work that is underway is being communicated at the neighborhood level, but more information will be added to the website. Information has been shared at neighborhood council meetings. Notices are also provided to abutting property owners where tree work is taking place. More tree signups are still needed. It was suggested for staff to attend the DVCAC to assist in getting outreach materials distributed for SpoCanopy free street trees.

2. Golf Tree Work Updates – Steve Nittolo

The Golf Tree Work Update was not presented at this meeting, it will be presented at the next regularly scheduled meeting.

Standing Report Items:

1. <u>Citizen Advisory Report</u> – Kris Neely

Minutes for the UFCAC were approved. Guy Gifford gave a presentation on the Wildland Urban Interface codes that are being evaluated at the state level. Katie presented the Tree City USA stats and provided information on the 2026 Annual Work Plan.

2. Urban Forestry Monthly Update - Katie Kosanke

The Urban Forestry Monthly Update was included in the Tree City USA stat report.

3. 2026 Annual Work Plan – Katie Kosanke

A draft work plan for 2026 was distributed to the committee members and is attached to the minutes. It is a roadmap for the year of items Urban Forestry is planning to do for the year.

4. Urban Forestry Financial Report – Katie Kosanke

Katie presented the October financial report. Urban Forestry had a 10% reduction to the budget this year. Some areas are over budget, and some are under budget, but overall, UF is under budget.






