Chase Gallery (Shantell)

- Lenora Lopez in the galley. Had an artist talk on Friday. Not well attended, but a good talk.
- Chase Gallery Committee met and getting ready for 2023 call to artists. Details to come.
- Community School show upcoming in Chase Gallery for December
- 2023 kick off with a group show for the month of January.
- November First Friday reception. Commissioners encouraged to come help out.

Utility Box Wraps (Shantell)

- Mead Middle School utility box wraps student project underway
- 159 applicants for latest open call utility box wraps. Committee is working to select artists.
- Shantell did a lot of work to help artists submit this time around. Eva suggested holding a training for artists on how to prepare/submit utility box designs for upcoming high school artist utility box call.

Murals (Shantell)

- Committee to meet soon
- Mural maintenance has been underway and is ongoing.

Public Art (Melissa)

- The Seeking Place in Riverfront Park is completed and open to the public! Has been well received all around. Good turnout at the ribbon cutting.
- Installation of *Stepwell* in Riverfront Park is ongoing. It's progressing quickly and *growing!* Goal is to have the sculpture finished by the end of November. Still discussing whether to have a ribbon cutting event this fall/winter or wait until the spring.

Street Murals (Melissa)

- \$900K in funding (over three years) has been approved by City Council for street murals in intersections and crosswalks in every neighborhood!
- Up to 29 intersections and at least 9 crosswalks to be installed over the next three years.
- Money is coming from "traffic calming" fund collected through tickets from school zone speeding, etc.

- Artists, artwork, location, etc. will be chosen in conjunction with Neighborhood Councils, Arts Commission, and City Streets Department.
- Spokane Arts will be hiring a part-time employee to administer this program.
- Lots more information to come! Murals committee to be involved.

Grantmaking (Melissa)

SAGA

- 30 applicants for the latest round of SAGA last one of 2022. Selection panel will be reviewing.
- Next SAGA application deadline is Feb 1st.

Advocacy (Melissa)

- Currently no one signed up for the Advocacy Committee, but we have some opportunities upcoming for advocacy.
- WA State Legislature Session begins in January. Arts Advocacy Day will be in February a chance to meet with state legislatures to advocate for statewide arts projects/funding.
- Inspire WA would like to designate "regional captains" for spearheading statewide advocacy to serve as a liaison between meetings with legislators and Inspire WA.
 - Captains would also support Shantell in coordinating/scheduling meetings with legislators and help recruit individuals to meet with legislators.
 - Hoping that Spokane's captain (or co-captains) would come from the Arts Commission. Please let Melissa know if you're interested.
