- 3. I graduated from North Central High School in Spokane, Washington in 1978.
- 4. After graduating from high school, I was employed for a period of time in retail.
- 5. In 1986 I became employed at Microsoft Corporation. At Microsoft I was the International Business Development Manager for Sales and Marketing for Microsoft in the United States. My last position was as Product Manager for Microsoft Products at the time of my retirement.
- 6. I then returned to Eastern Washington and was employed by the Pend Oreille County Rural Economic Development Association and later accepted a position with the Spokane Economic Development Council.
- 7. I was then appointed by then Mayor, Dennis Hession as the Economic Development Director for the City of Spokane. I remained employed in that capacity through the end of the Hession administration and into the Verner administration.
- 8. I then retired. I later accepted Mayor Condon's invitation to join his administration as City Administrator.
- 9. I am very familiar with the details surrounding the decision by Mayor Condon to request the resignation of former Police Chief, Frank Straub on or about September 22, 2015. I worked directly with Mayor Condon in the days leading up to that decision. I attended the Executive Session of City Council on September 21, 2015, when Mayor Condon

- 10. I was present when Mayor Condon was questioned by Council Person Stratton regarding the factors that went into the decision to request Chief Straub's resignation.
- 11. I was also present when other council members questioned Mayor Condon concerning the decision.
- 12. I was also present the days leading up to September 21, 2015, when Mayor Condon received a letter from the Spokane Police Department Lieutenants and Captains Association and from the Command Staff regarding their dissatisfaction with Chief Straub's leadership and management style.
- 13. I was also present when Mayor Condon conferred with Assistant Chief Rick Dobrow concerning immense dissatisfaction in the Police Department as it related to Chief Straub's administration.
- 14. I also conferred in depth with Mayor Condon and with corporation counsel Nancy Isserlis concerning Straub continuing with the City of Spokane as Police Chief.
- 15. The letters that I refer to will be included as exhibits before the Ethics Commission, but it was important to the analysis that was undertaken by Mayor Condon and myself that the letters were signed by all members of the Command Staff and by the organizational leaders of the Lieutenant and Captain Association.

- 16. The meeting with Assistant Chief Rick Dobrow and Mayor Condon concerning Chief Straub took place at Mayor Condon's home and I was present along with the Mayor on September 20, 2015.
- 17. After the two letters were received and after Assistant Chief Dobrow's statement to the Mayor that the Command Staff had lost confidence in Chief Straub and could no longer tolerate working or acting under his administration, it became apparent that the Mayor and the City were facing a potential loss of police leadership as well as loss of support of the rank and file in the police department leading to a potential crisis in management, morale and public safety.
- 18. It was at that time that Mayor Condon stated that he saw no alternative to resolve the issues presented in the two letters than to request the resignation of Chief Frank Straub at the earliest possible opportunity. The alternative was to face a loss of senior Command Staff and of rank and file leadership with the crises of confidence that had developed.
- 19. The only factor that prompted Mayor Condon to ask for Chief Straub's resignation was the absolute dissatisfaction with Straub's management style and leadership voiced in the two letters that Mayor Condon received. There were simply no other factors involved.
