The City Clerk's Office received a complaint on June 16<sup>th</sup>, 2026 filed by Anthony Proctor. Pursuant to SMC 1.04B.150, the City Attorney's Office is providing this memorandum of its preliminary review of the complaint.

Complaint June 17, 2026 Complaint against Anthony Proctor

The complaint was filed on June 16<sup>th</sup>, 2026 by the complainant, Anthony Proctor. The complainant did use the correct form to file his complaint; however, Mr. Proctor identified himself as the respondent who is alleged to have engaged in prohibited conduct. Mr. Proctor is not an employee of the City of Spokane. Thus, this complaint appears to have been filed incorrectly and does not meet the requirements of SMC 1.04B.140 (A) by identifying the City official or employee to have engaged in prohibited conduct. Further, the complaint does not state any specific provision of SMC 1.04B that is alleged to have been violated. In the attachments to the complaint, the complainant refers to events that took place at the Department of Children, Youth, and Family Services. DCYF is a department of the State of Washington and not a function or governmental body of the City of Spokane.

It is recommended that this complaint not be processed and dismissed summarily by the Ethics Commission Chair.
