


Complaints/Referrals/Contacts



Highlights:

In February, the Office of the Police Ombudsman (OPO) submitted 1 Complaint, 1 Commendation and 3 Referrals to SPD.


- OPO 22-01: An employee from a local hospital wanted to voice concerns about the interactions an RN had with responding officers to her being assaulted by a patient.
- OPO 22-02: A community member submitted a commendation regarding an officer who treated the community member with kindness and respect.
- IR 22-05: A community member had concerns surrounding their vehicle being towed without them being notified. This was referred to the SPD/IA.
- IR 22-06: A community member had been trying to get in contact with a detective regarding their friend's disappearance. They were not able to get a call back. This was referred to the SPD/IA.
- IR 22-07: A community member was concerned with identity theft and was unable to get assistance. This was referred to SPD/IA.






