Minutes from the March 2, 2021 meeting approved unanimously.

#### 1. Chair Report - Clifford Winger

- Mr. Winger reported that membership of the Plan Commission Transportation Subcommittee (PCTS) is under the authority of City Council and Plan Commission and that City Council suspended rule 2.1E and appointed Council Member Cathcart as City Council Liaison to PCTS.
- Mr. Winger also stated that the purpose of the PCTS is to review and evaluate for possible approval or acceptance transportation projects.

- 4. Stakeholders Report -
  - Kitty Klitzke, Futurewise Reported that Futurewise is working with the Transportation Choices Coalition on the Clean and Just Transportation Act which is currently being considered in State Legislature.
  - Paul Kropp, Neighborhood Alliance Brought up that pedestrian safety is an issue that needs to be addressed and would like to know if pedestrian safety /crashes are being tracked.
  - Rachel Callary, Lilac Services for the Blind Brought up that "ADA" does not always mean accessible and that terms such as "ADA" should be thoughtfully and intentionally used.
  - Mike Tresidder, Spokane Transit Authority (STA)- Reported that STA is starting public outreach for the May 2022 service change that will include the City Line.
  - Jessica Engelman, Bicycle Advisory Board (BAB) Reported that the BAB discussed Ray-Freya Alternatives, and has been discussing the Comprehensive Plan and bicycle routes that might be included.
  - Eve McMenamy, Spokane Regional Transportation Council (SRTC)- Presented the Rebuilding America Grant infrastructure priorities, which include Climate Change and Racial Equity. She also reported that SRTC decided which of the US195-I90 draft strategies will be released to the public.

• Shauna Harshman, City Council Manager of Neighborhood Connectivity Initiatives - Reported that the Northeast Spokane, North-South Corridor to 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue infrastructure package is focused on equity and economic development. Bike routes are included in this infrastructure package as well.

# Plan Commission Transportation Subcommittee Integrated Capital Management April 6, 2021

### **Subject**

2022 - 2027 Six-year Comprehensive Street Program Proposed Additions

#### **Background**

In support of the State Growth Management Act and the City of Spokane's Comprehensive Plan, the City must maintain 6-year capital financing plans for certain providers of public facilities and services. Accordingly, the City must maintain a 6-year capital financing plan for its capital street program. Pursuant to RCW 35.77.010 the capital street program must be adopted before July 1 of each year, and filed with the Secretary of Transportation not later than 30 days after adoption. To determine the plan's consistency with the Comprehensive Plan, it is scrutinized by the City Plan Commission. The Plan Commission then makes a recommendation to the City Council as to the program's consistency with the Comprehensive Plan. The City Council then accepts or modifies the plan accordingly.

Each new project to the 6-Year Program is assessed for compliance with the Comprehensive Plan by verifying fulfillment of the Transportation goals and policies (TR's). Staff have prepared an assessment, and seek a PCTS recommendation to Plan Commission regarding program compliance.

#### **Impact**

Staff will present a draft assessment of new projects being brought into the 2022 – 2027 6-Year Comprehensive Street Program. The assessment includes a review of each project for consistency with the transportation chapter goals and policies of the comprehensive plan.

#### **Action**

Seeking recommendation to the Plan Commission:

New projects coming into the 6-Year Comprehensive Street Program are consistent with the comprehensive plan.
