October 7, 2021

Dear Commissioners,

Below is a summary of activities I participated in as Chair of the SHRC, as well as additional points of interest:

- Social Media (Facebook)
  - Created Facebook event for October meeting.
  - Posted information about utility shutoff moratorium and resources.
  - Posted American Rescue Plan community conversation invitation.
  - Posted Spokesman-Review article re: hiring of Mr. Jarrell Haynes as Civil Rights Officer.
  - Posted Spokesman-Review article on rise of hate crimes.
  - Shared Councilwoman Wilkerson's post re: meeting with Mr. Jarrell Haynes and welcoming him aboard.
- OCR Exploratory Task Force
  - Continued facilitating meetings with this group. The group is looking forward to meeting with Mr. Haynes soon to lay out a plan for moving forward.
- Working with Vice Chair Harrison and an SCSO staff member on scheduling Sheriff Knezovich for the Courageous Conversation series.
- Sent sponsorship request letters to community partners for the Spokane Human Rights Awards. No-Li has agreed to provide a \$1,000 sponsorship. Funds will be handled by the Spokane County Human Rights Task Force.
- Continuing to coordinate appointments and re-appointments of Commissioners with the Mayor's Office.
  - Mayor asked for more than two recommendations for the two at-large vacancies.
     Based upon our rankings, a third candidate was moved forward for consideration.
  - Mayor's Office has had staffing changes that has slowed down scheduling of meetings/interviews for candidates, as well as Commissioner Archer's reappointment.
  - I've informed the Mayor's Office that I will continue to operate under the assumption that Commissioner Archer will be re-appointment, and therefore, Commissioner Archer will continue to serve until a decision has been made.
  - We are still recruiting for the third/final at-large vacancy. One application has been forwarded to me thus far.
- Upon review of the email complaint regarding a Spokane Police Officer, I determined that the concerns and details shared do not fall within Title 18. However, the complaint

was shared with the Office of the Police Ombudsman for further review, should there be any city or department policies or procedures that are not being followed.

- Worked with Vice Chair Harrison to register SHRC for the drive-through Spokane Pride Parade on Oct. 9. VC Harrison is compiling a list of volunteers; we may share the booth with SCHRTF.
- Met with Mr. Haynes on Sept. 22 to help onboard him in his new CRO role. Shared information about the Commission, responsibilities to provide administrative support, information about meetings, and our Office of Civil Rights work.
- Received information on sponsorship opportunities for the Spokane Human Rights Awards and the Sixth Gonzaga International Conference on Hate Studies to be held virtually November 4-6. Will be discussed in Outreach subcommittee update.
- Responded to two media inquiries from the Spokesman-Review. Both articles were posted to our Facebook page.
- Will begin working with city staff to produce business cards for Commissioners Schreibman and Baker.
