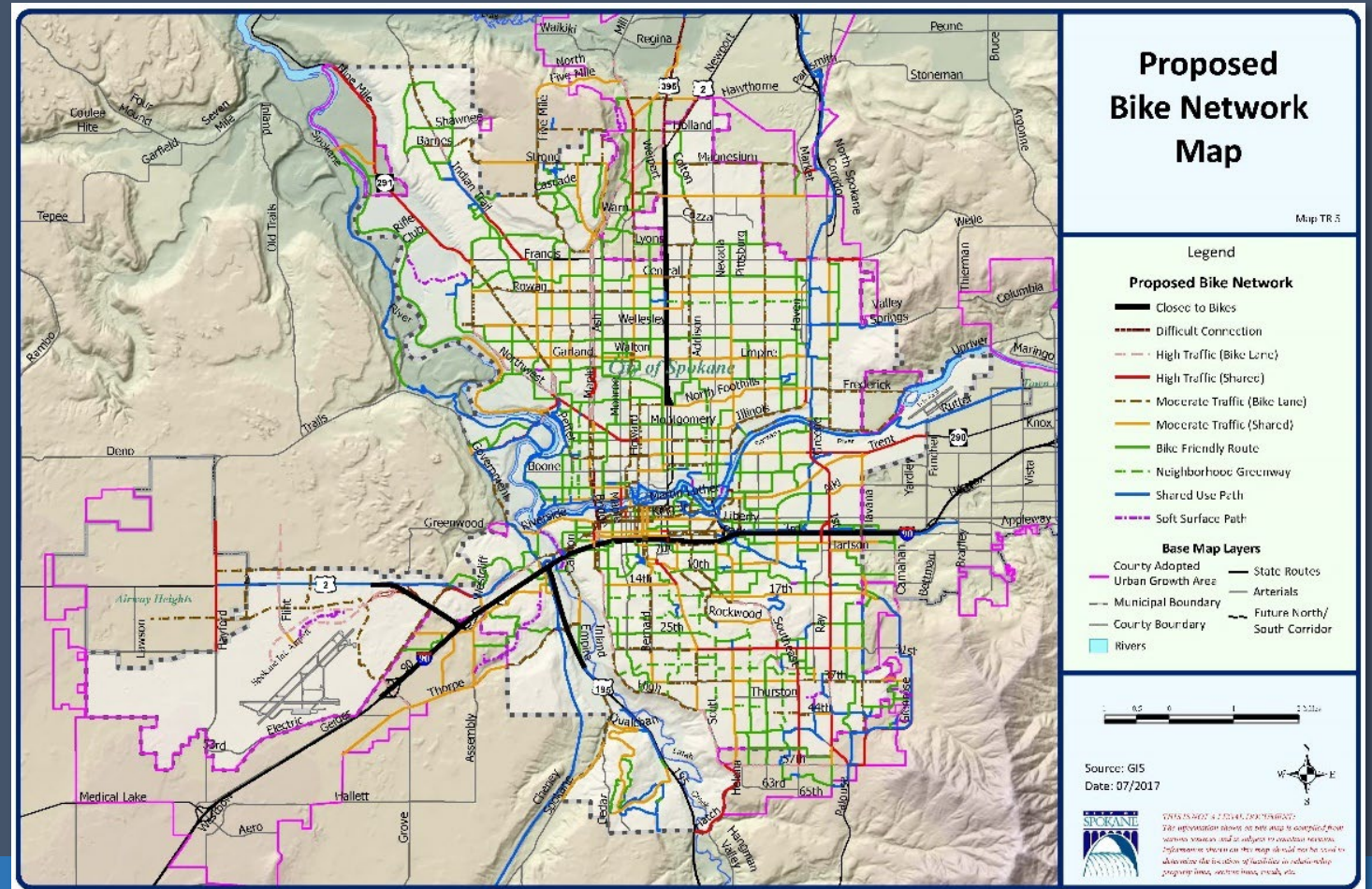

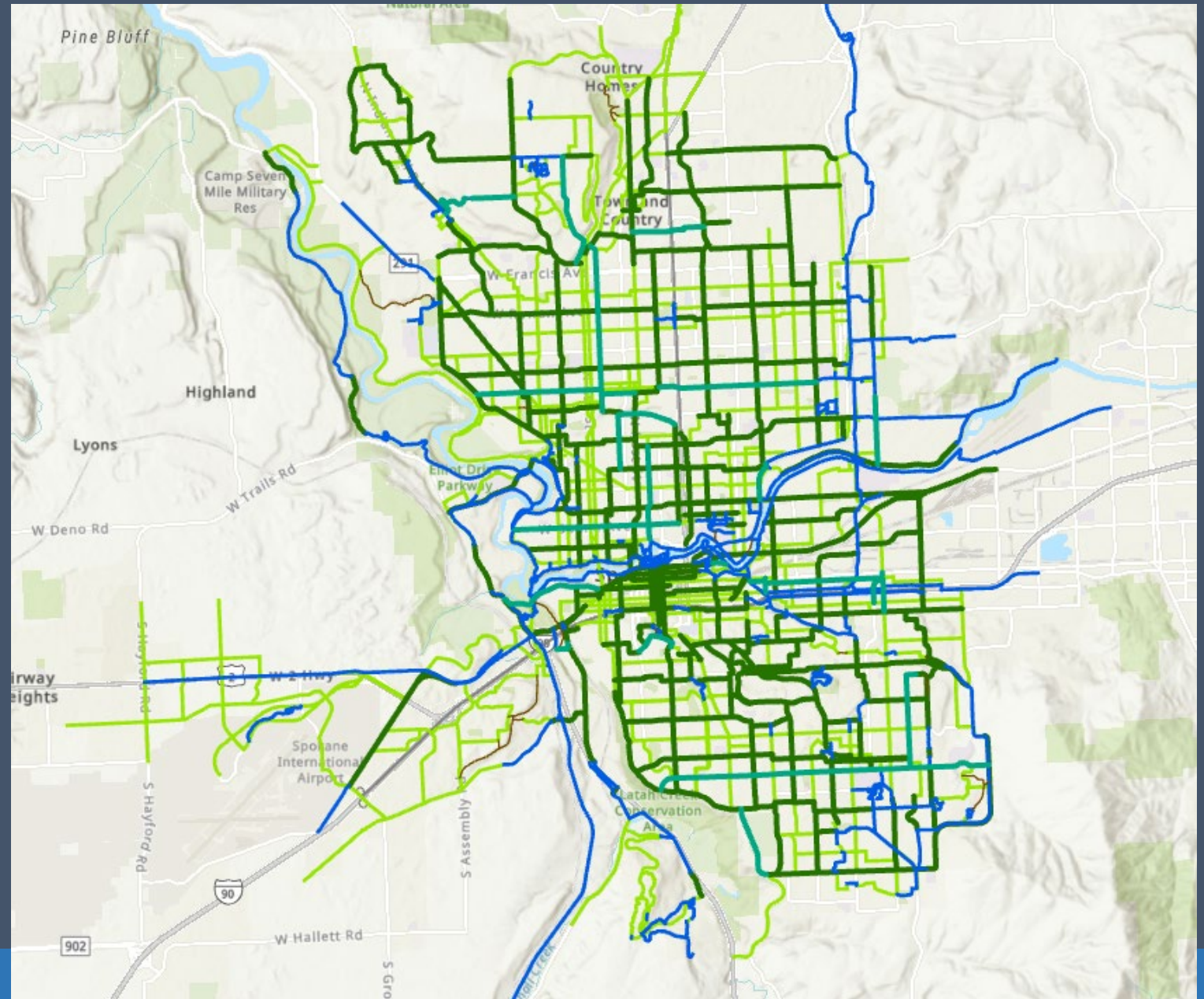
Updates to Proposed Bike Network Map

 - Public Comment



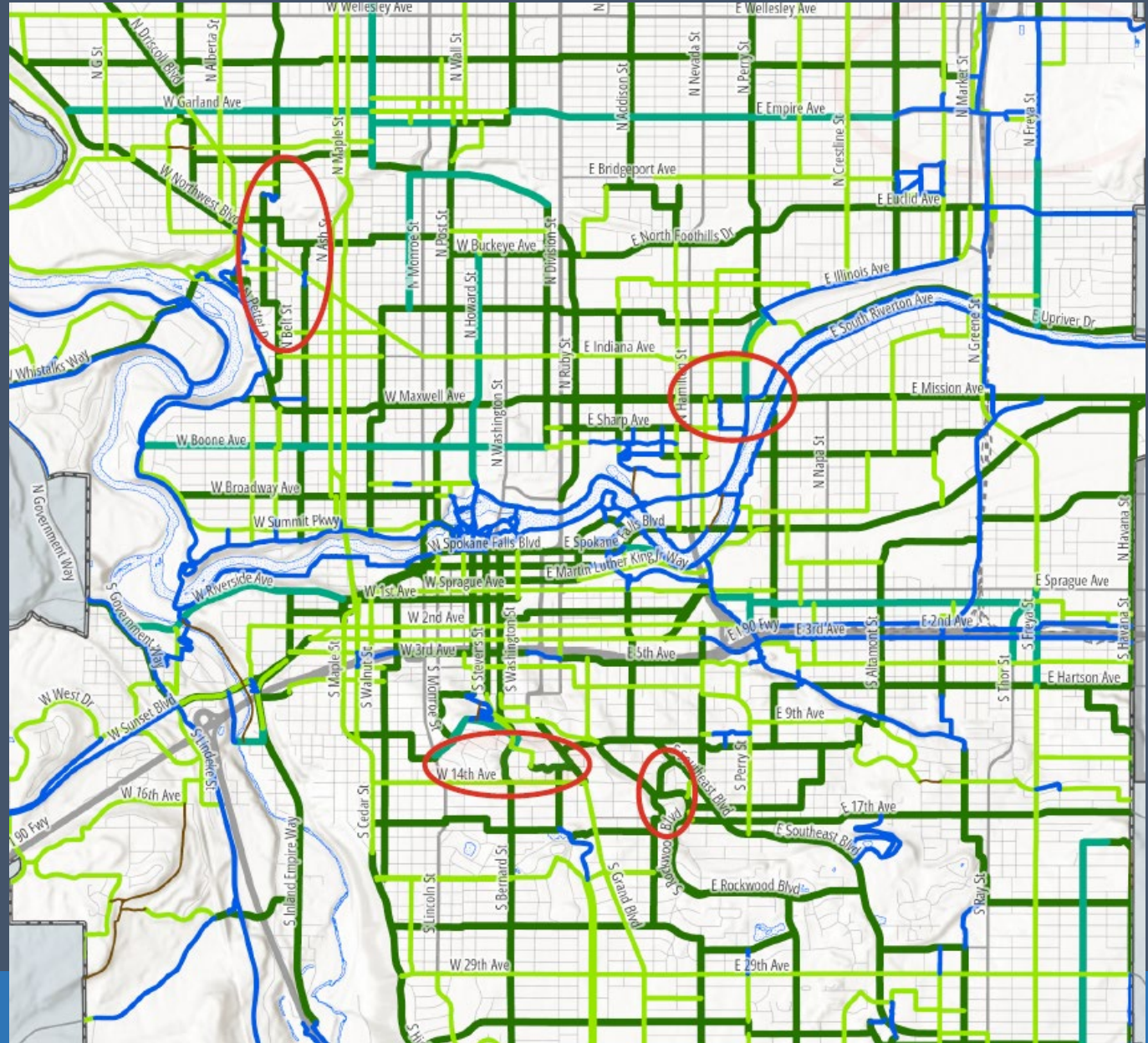
Typologies
