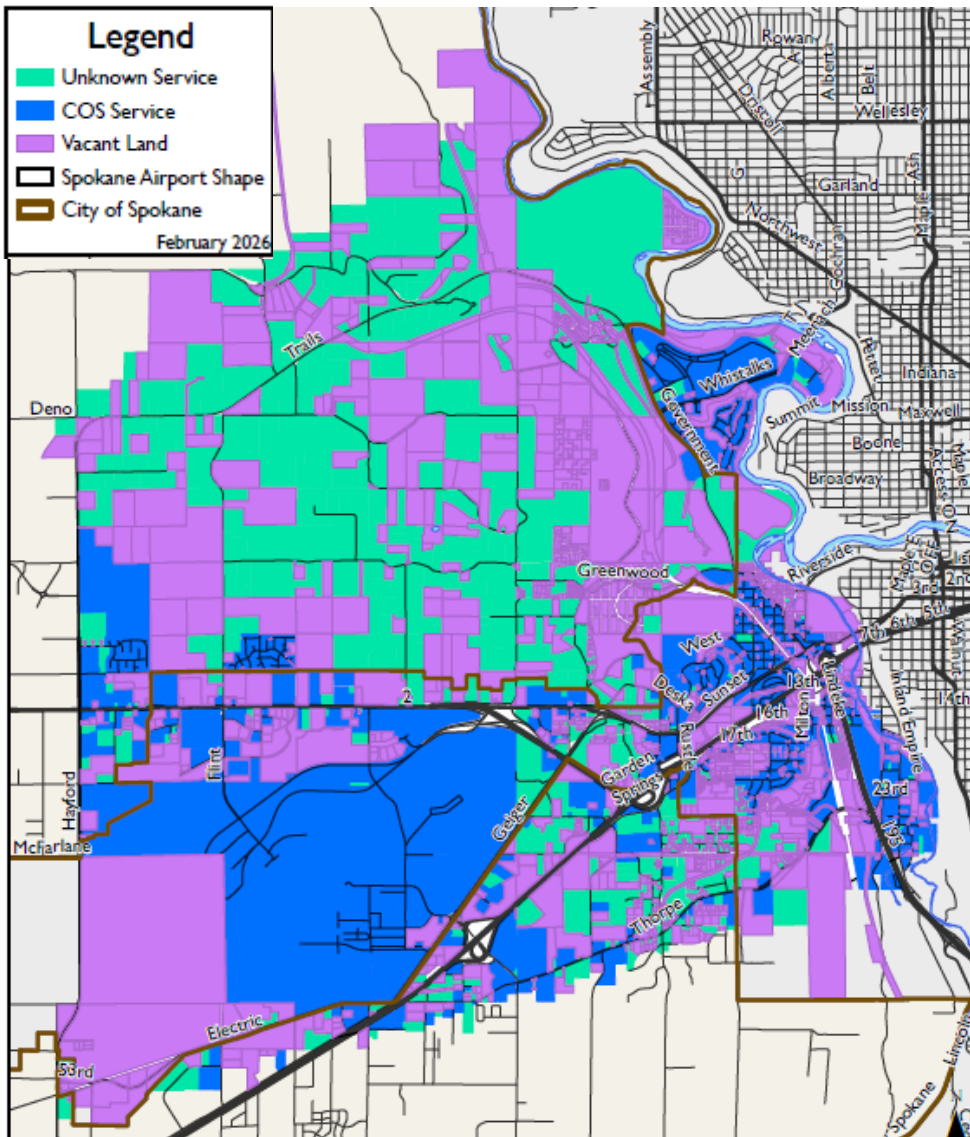
Background

- PFAS site at Airport listed – mid-2023
- SIA investigation work – assessment, field work, initial PFAS investigation – 2024 & 2025
- City and County added to work:
 - Identified as Potentially Liable Parties (PLPs) – Summer 2025
 - Agreed Order – January 2026
 - 30-day public comment period on Agreed Order – February 6 to March 9
 - Emergency Interim Actions – Notice provided February 10
 - Short Term Interim Action Work Plan – Ecology approved on April 13



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Airport, County, & City

- Immediately began to assess requirements of the short-term emergency interim actions.
- Priority was to deliver a Work Plan that prioritizes public health!
- Geographic area includes about:
 - 2,000 parcels already connected to City of Spokane municipal water
 - 2,000 vacant parcels
 - 900 properties with buildings and potentially exempt wells



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Immediate Access to Clean Water

- Access to City's water fill station on Garden Springs Rd
 - Food-grade containers to distribute
- Provide filter pitchers to residents for indoor use
- Provide countertop dispensers to residents for indoor use
- Efforts are a bridge to long term solutions:
 - Extension of municipal water service
 - Installation of Point of Entry Treatment (POET) systems
 - Installations managed by Spokane County and Department of Health through \$7.5M grant



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Water Filter and Container Options

Short-Term Interim Action Work Plan provides residents with the following:

Filter Pitcher



Countertop Dispenser



Fill Station Containers



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Testing

- Distribution of Filters and Containers does not require a positive PFAS test for impacted residents
- Sets out a schedule to complete testing of properties with private wells in the identified area
 - Working to map the testing data already known
 - Including a systematic testing approach to assist with the ongoing site assessment work



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Next Steps

- Host Open House to distribute filters/containers
- Begin outreach
 - Testing of wells in impacted area
 - Evaluation for Point of Entry Treatment Systems
- Proceed with developing a Long-Term Interim Action Work Plan (LTIAWP)
 - Focus is on “permanent” clean water solutions – Point of Entry Treatment Systems, connection to Municipal Water
 - Due May 11th
- Continue with site assessment work and analysis



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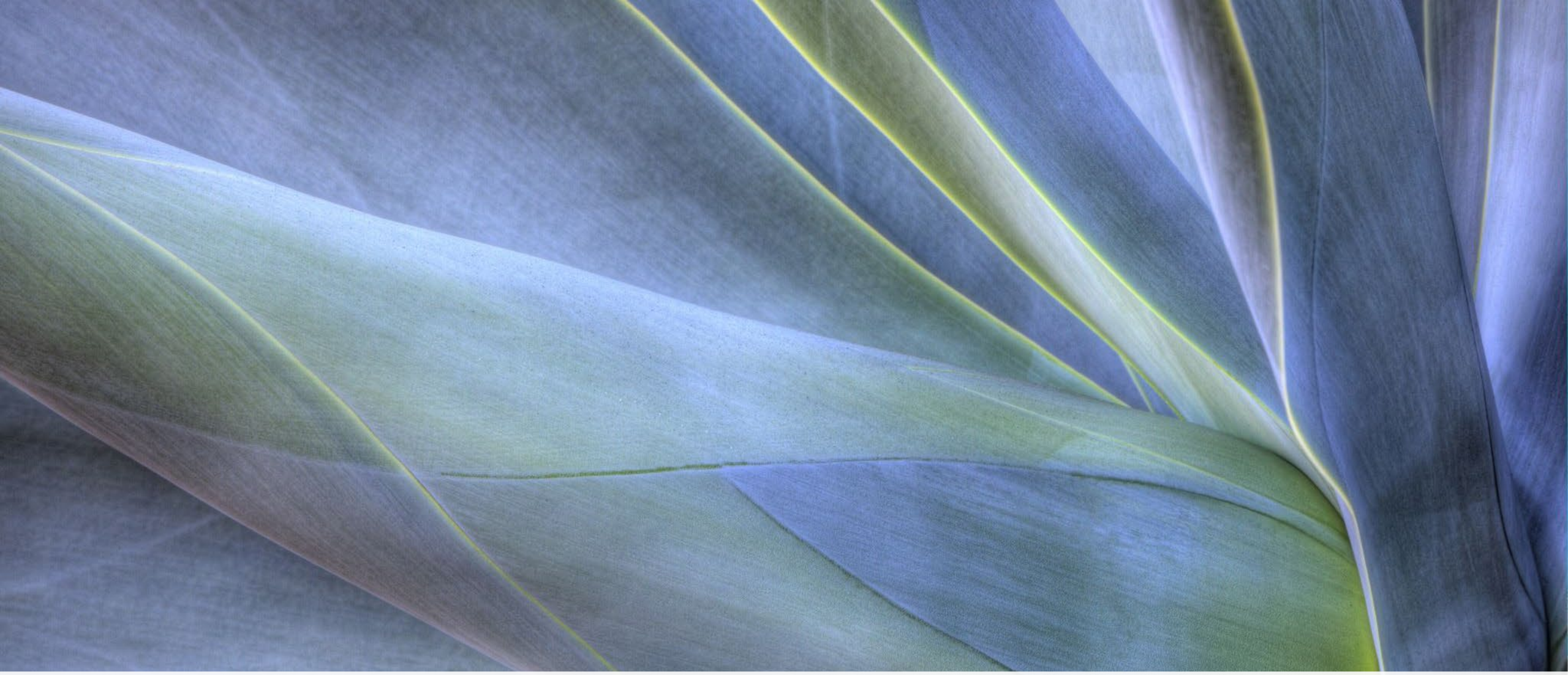
Next Steps cont...
