

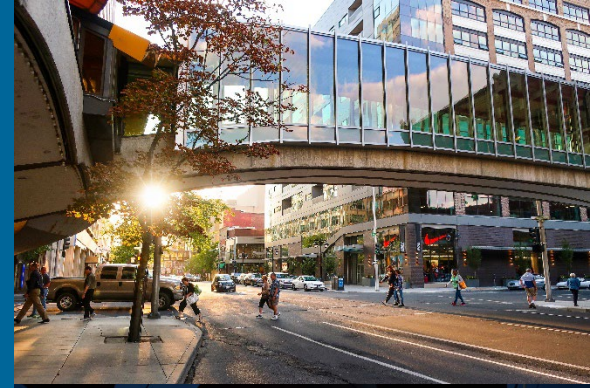

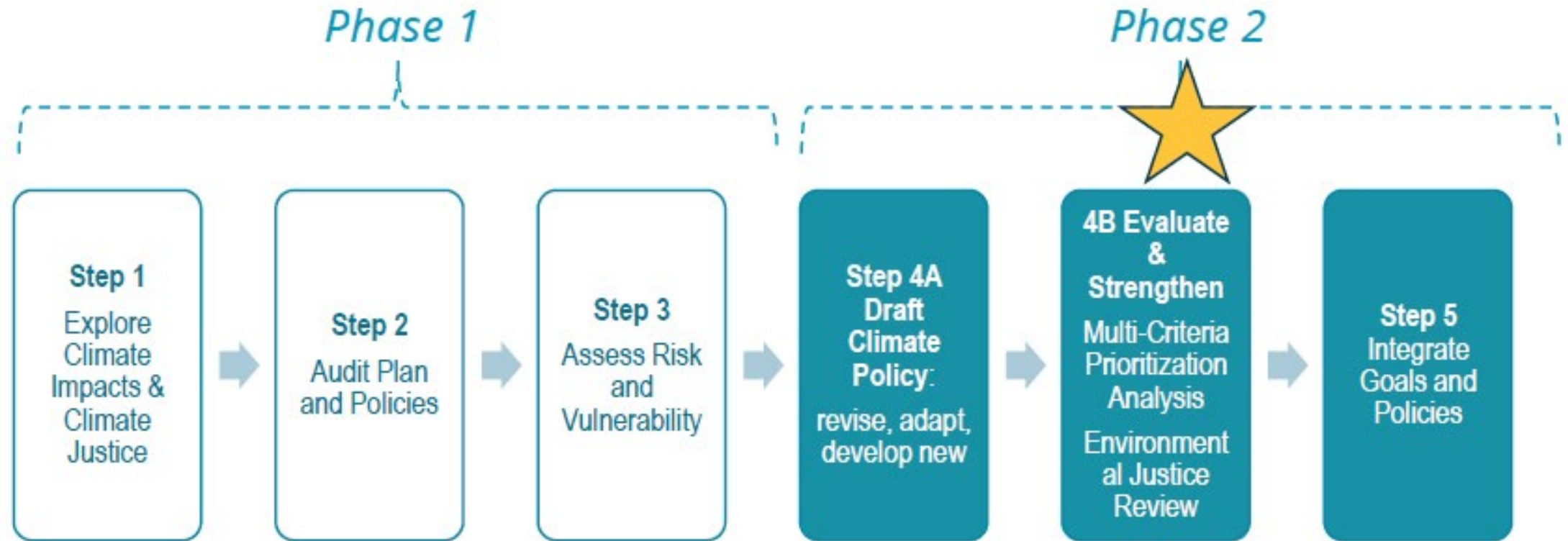

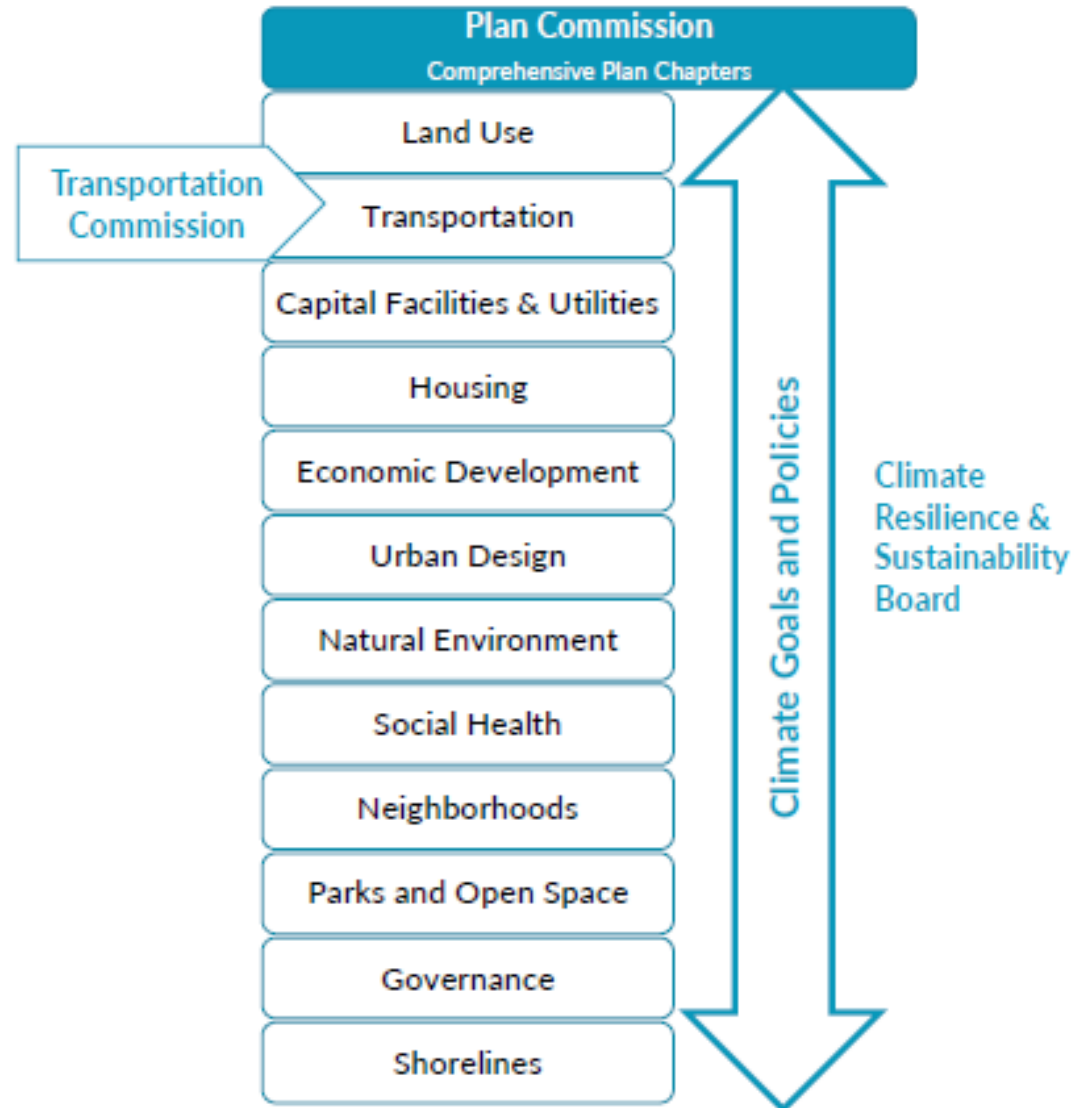

Relevance Filter

Does the City have a **clear role**? (*lead, partner, communicator, or regulator*)

2

Scoring & Ranking

- **Resilience**
- **GHG Reduction**
- **Overburdened Community Benefit**
- **Logistics** (*cost-benefit, partnerships, administrative feasibility*)
- **Degree of Certainty** (*unintended impacts, public support, momentum*)
- **Co-Benefits**

Holistic Evaluation

- Remove **redundancies**
- Ensure the list meets **State requirements**, addresses **key hazards**, and includes a **variety of topics**, time frames, responsible groups, and city roles.

Evaluate draft climate policy alignment with State requirements and City goals.

Policy EM-2-6 (Resilience)	Provide support for infrastructure or services that allow <u>Support</u> low-income residents to <u>in</u> remaining in their residences <u>homes</u> during extreme climate events, such as extreme heat or wildfire smoke, <u>through infrastructure and services</u> such as through the installation of cooling devices or high-quality portable air cleaners, utility bill assistance, or community and Tribal partner collaborations and educational opportunities. ↑*★ (MCPA_0096)	Moved from Emergency Management. Allows for resources to be allocated to residents and not only co-located at hubs. Addresses collaboration and incentives.	3 of 7	Community Health or Housing	
Policy HEAL-6 (Resilience)	Promote environmental justice and support physical and mental health and well-being by providing <u>Provide</u> all residents with an equitable opportunity to learn about climate impacts, influence policy decisions, and take actions to enhance community resilience <u>to promote environmental justice and support physical and mental health and well-being.</u> (MCPA_0103)	Strong on several aspects of resilience, moderately strong on overburdened communities, logistics, and certainty.	4 of 7	Community Health
