Bob Breeden retired as the Assistant Special Agent in Charge (ASAC) of FDLE's Miami Regional Operations Center. The Miami Region of FDLE covers the southeastern coast of Florida, encompassing West Palm Beach, Fort Lauderdale, Miami, and Key West. As the ASAC, Breeden served as the second-in-command, managing the administrative and investigative priorities, specifically responsible for overseeing violent crime, organized crime, public corruption, major drugs, and cybercrime. Breeden also served as the media spokesman for the Miami Region and managed the Special Operations Tactical Team.

Prior to this assignment, ASAC Breeden served as the Director of the South Florida Money Laundering Strike Force. In this capacity, ASAC Breeden managed 60 people from 18 different agencies, conducting undercover narcotics and money laundering investigations. The South Florida Money Laundering Strike Force is considered the most successful and active money laundering investigative unit in the nation.

Earlier in his career, ASAC Breeden developed the FDLE Computer Crime Center (FC3), with the statewide mission of investigating complex computer crimes, assisting with regional investigations, training investigators, disseminating information to the public and proactively working to identify computer criminals in order to prevent future crimes. ASAC Breeden was tasked with coordinating the daily investigative activities that dealt with Child Pornography and Exploitation on the Internet, hacking cases, network intrusion cases, and other various high-tech fraud investigations. ASAC Breeden has received extensive training in this area and served as the FDLE's spokesman for high technology crimes.

ASAC Breeden received his Bachelor and Master Degrees from Florida State University, where he later served as an Adjunct Professor in the School of Criminology. Breeden is a graduate of the FBI National Academy, Class 249. In addition to his career in law enforcement, ASAC Breeden is also a Licensed Funeral Director and Embalmer.

Bob Breeden has served for 32 years in law enforcement, having worked with the Gadsden County Sheriff's Office and Tallahassee Police Department prior to his appointment as a Special Agent with FDLE.

In 1998, developed the nationally recognized FDLE Computer Crime Center (FC3) primarily focus on investigations, training, research and prevention activities, responsible for the daily operations which includes managing all investigations, coordinating all training efforts for law enforcement and the public, managing the four websites hosted by FC3 and coordinating numerous partnerships with both government and the private sector. Directed high tech crime investigations and provided investigative assistance to law enforcement agencies statewide. Developed the Tallahassee chapter of Infragard, focused on bringing technology professionals together with law enforcement cyber crime investigators to forge alliances and partnerships. Served as co-principal on three federally funded grants through a partnership with Florida State University's School of Computer Science.

In 1995, developed the FDLE Serious Habitual Offender Comprehensive Action Program (SHOCAP), involving 37 counties, (nationally acclaimed habitual offender tracking program) focused on coordinating all components of the juvenile justice system to effectively share information and supervision duties on those juvenile offenders who are responsible for the most amount of criminal activity. This program required assuring the cooperation and commitment of the Juvenile Court Judges, Police Chiefs, Sheriffs and Department of Juvenile Justice Managers.
