"When IS A Forest Practice Application/Notification Required?"

An FPA/N is required:

- r When harvesting any volume of timber and selling that volume for payment, or trading for goods or services.

Road construction: - Greater than 600 feet in length, or - On sideslopes greater than 40%, or - Within the shorelines of the state or a riparian management zone, or - When crossing a stream channel, or - Within a wetland or wetland management zone.

- r Road maintenance involving the replacement of bridges or culverts in stream channels, or movement of material that has direct potential for entering typed waters or wetlands.

An FPA/N is not required for:

Harvest of less than 5,000 board feet in any 12-month period for personal use, provided harvest does not occur within the boundaries of a riparian management or wetland management zone.

Any forest practice Within the boundaries of existing golf courses, Within the boundaries of existing cemeteries, Involving a single landowner where contiguous ownership is less than two acres in size, provided that none of the following conditions apply: On sideslopes greater than 40%, or Within the shorelines of the state or a riparian management zone, or When crossing a stream channel, or Within a wetland or wetland management zone.

Road construction that is less than 600 feet in length and does not involve any of the conditions listed above.

Road maintenance, except for replacement of bridges or culverts in stream channels, or movement of material that has direct potential for entering typed waters or wetlands.

Initial installation or replacement of relief culverts and other drainage control features (waterbars, drivable dips, etc.).

Danger Tree Removal - A tree within 1 1/2 times its height from an existing permanent structure.

Slash burning. (A burn permit may be required).
