












#### **UNSHELTERED BREAKOUT BY HOUSEHOLD TYPE**





#### **UNSHELTERED GENDER BY YEAR**




#### **UNSHELTERED AGE GROUPS BY YEAR**




The majority of unsheltered persons identified as either male or female while less than 2% identified as transgender, gender nonconforming, or questioning.










