### 6 Year Average All Races





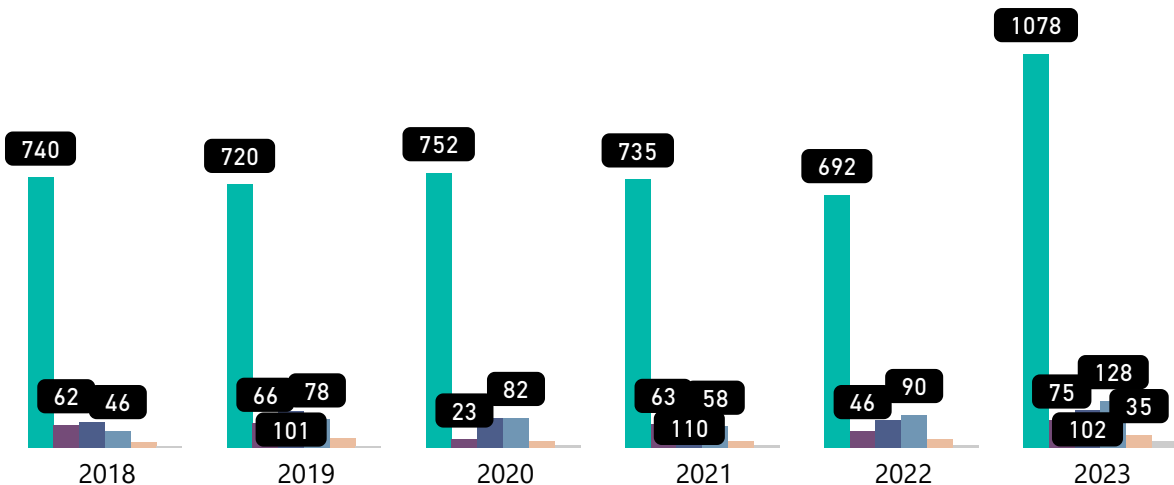

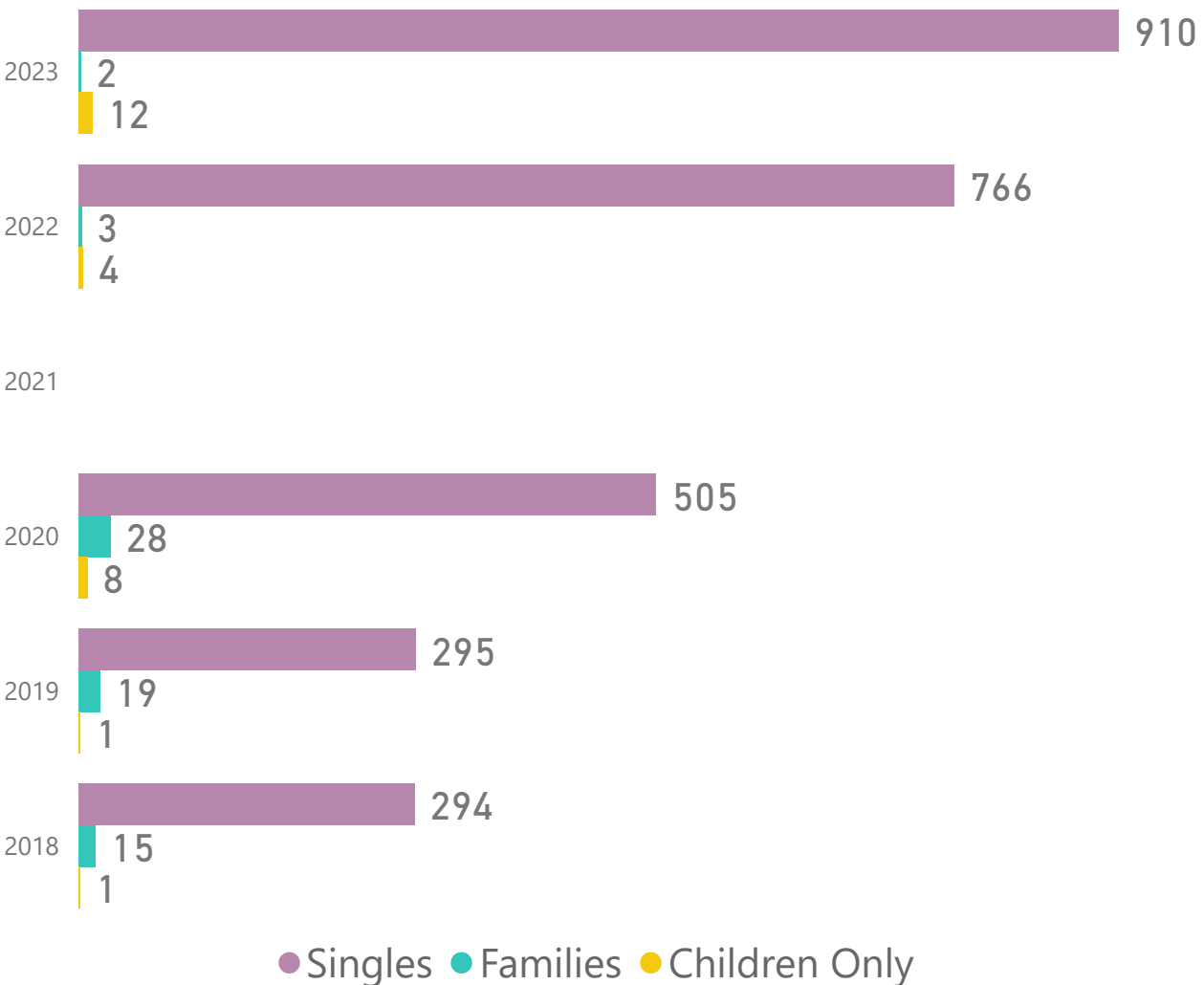
### 6 YEAR COMPARISON OF UNSHELTERED & SHELTERED

### UNSHELTERED BREAKOUT BY HOUSEHOLD TYPE



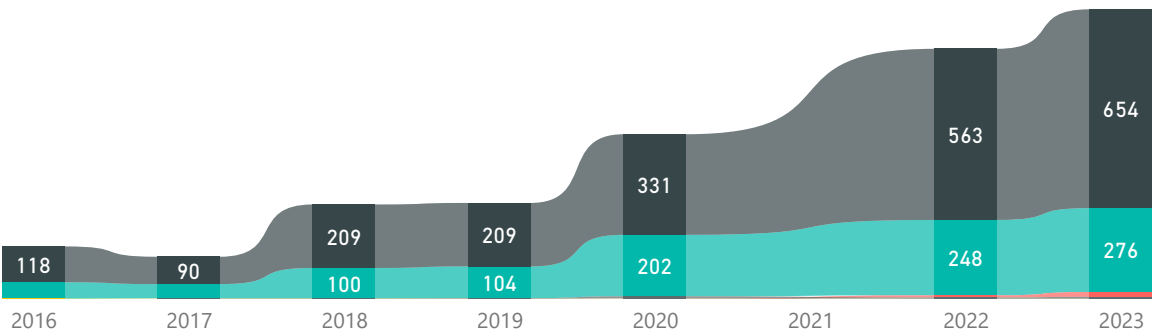

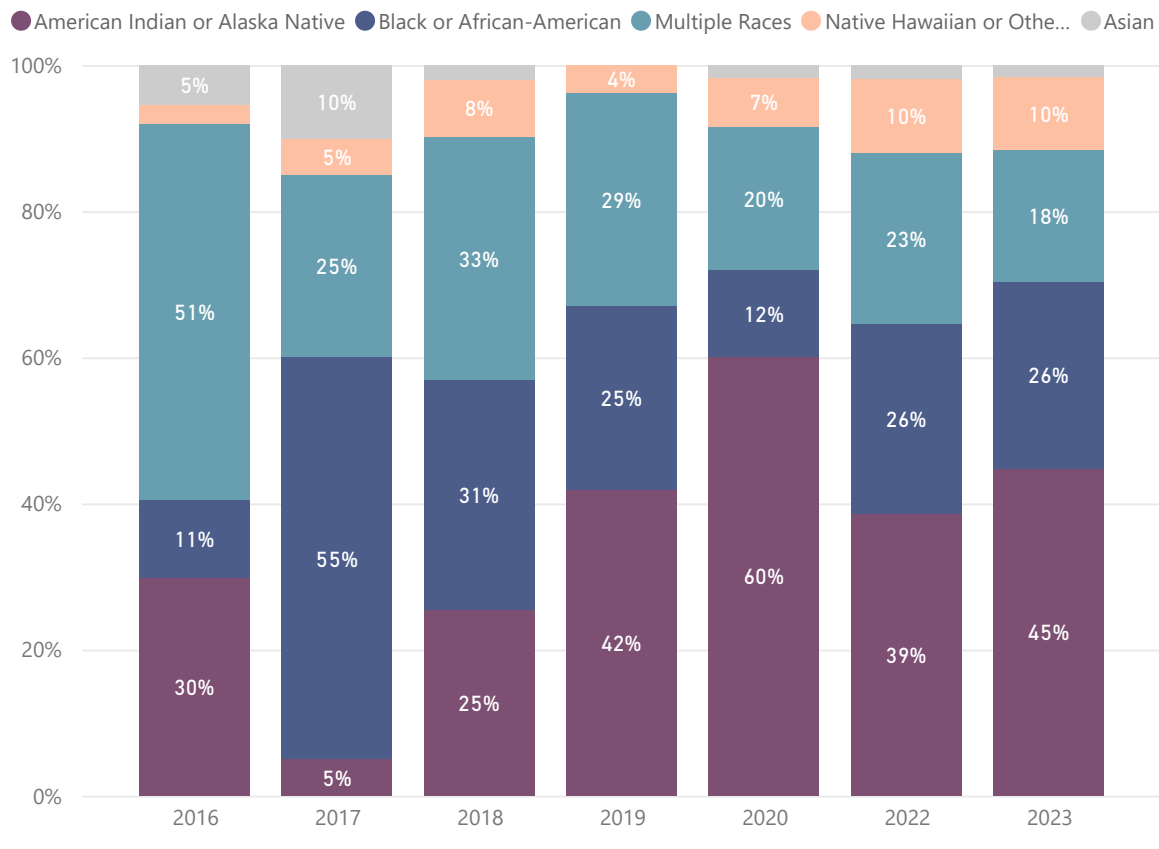
### UNSHELTERED GENDER BY YEAR

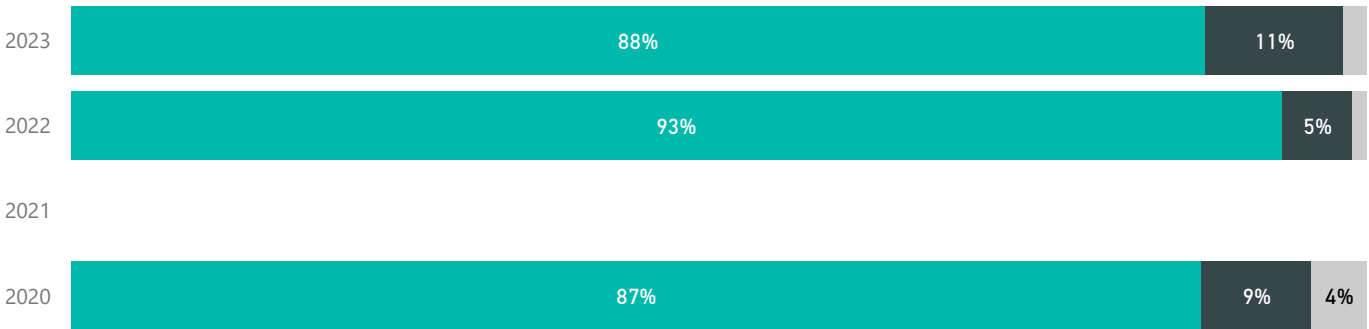
The majority of unsheltered persons identified as either male or female while less than 2% identified as transgender, gender non-conforming, or questioning.

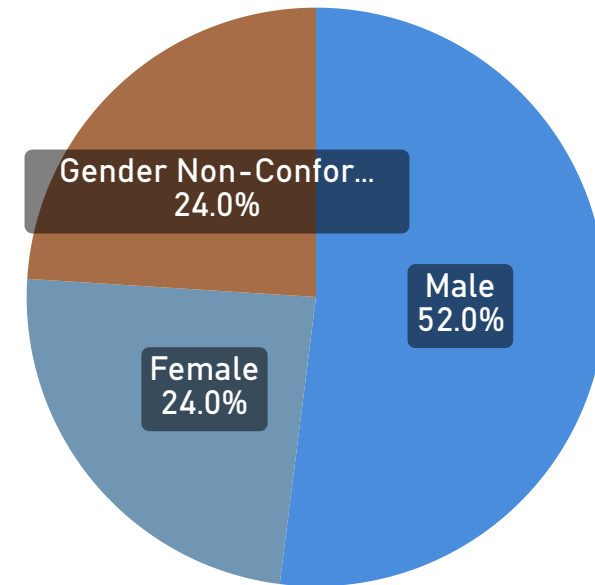

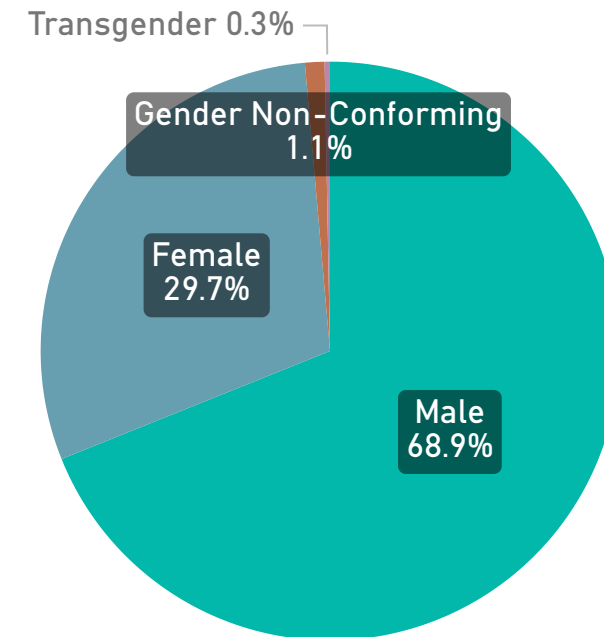
