Farmers' Markets have increased over the years but are now at capacity because we don't have that many farms in our area. Access to fresh fruits and vegetables are provided to many low-income families and seniors. Good for farmers and the consumers. Gardens are in several locations around the city. Several people noted that gardens must come up from within the community. When garden locations are developed by government or institutions, they fail.
