Project Application

- Agency: Craft3
- Project Name: COVID-19 Low & Moderate Income Job Retention Project
- Project Location: City-wide
- Award Total: \$100,000.00
- Source of Funds: CDBG
- Target Population: Small businesses employing low & moderate income individuals (<80% AMI)

Project Eligibility

- National Objective: Activities benefiting low- and moderate-income persons: Job creation or retention activities
 - Regulatory Citation: 24 CFR Part 570.208(a)(4)(i-iii)
- Eligible Activity: Special economic development activities
 - Regulatory Citation: 24 CFR Part 570.203(b), and; 24 CFR Part 570.209

Project Scope

- Craft3 will provide subsidized loans to small businesses to prevent the loss of jobs resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic.
 - CDBG funds will be used to buy-down interest rates in the form of grants.
 - Total allocation will not exceed \$30,000 per FTE job retained, or created.
 - Loans will be available to qualified borrowers and subject to underwriting procedures set by Craft3.
 - Leverage ratio of 1:5 invested through this project
