Following the conclusion of the Legislative portion of the meeting, an Open Forum is held unless a majority of Council Members vote otherwise. Please see additional Open Forum information that appears at the end of the City Council agenda.

ADDRESSING THE COUNCIL

- Public participation in Council meetings is governed by Council Rules 2.15 and 2.16. A complete copy of the council rules can be found here: City Council Rules.
- No member of the public may speak without first being recognized for that purpose by the Chair. Except for named parties to an adjudicative hearing, a person may be required to sign a sign-up sheet and provide their name and city of residence as a condition of recognition.
- Persons speaking at the podium shall verbally identify themselves by name, city of residency and, if appropriate, representative capacity.
- Speakers may be provided additional written or verbal instructions to ensure that verbal remarks are electronically recorded. Documents submitted for the record are identified and marked by the Clerk. (If you are submitting paper copies of documents to the Council Members, please provide a minimum of ten copies via the City Clerk. The City Clerk is responsible for officially filing and distributing your submittal.)
- To ensure that evidence and expressions of opinion are included in the record, and to ensure that decorum befitting a deliberative process is maintained, no modes of expression including but not limited to demonstrations, banners, signs, applause, profanity, vulgar language, or personal insults are permitted. To prevent disruption of council meetings and visual obstruction of proceedings, members of the audience shall remain seated during council meetings.
- A speaker asserting a statement of fact may be asked to document and identify the source of the factual datum being asserted.
- When addressing the Council, members of the public shall direct all remarks to the Council President, and shall confine their remarks to the matters that are specifically before the Council at that time or, if speaking during Open Forum, shall confine their remarks to affairs of the city.
- City staff may testify at Council meetings, including open forum, providing the testimony is in compliance with the City of Spokane Code of Ethics and the staff follow the steps outlined in the City Council Rules of Procedure.

SPEAKING TIME LIMITS: Each person addressing the Council is limited to two minutes of speaking time, except during hearings and items under final consideration by the Council, for which three minutes will be allowed. The chair may allow additional time if the speaker is asked to respond to questions from the Council. Public testimony and consideration of an item may be extended to a subsequent meeting by a majority vote of the Council. Note: No public testimony shall be taken on amendments to consent or legislative agenda items, or solely procedural, parliamentary, or administrative matters of the Council.

PUBLIC WORKS CONTRACT

Title: MAXWELL FROM PETTET TO WALNUT WSDOT BIKE-PED

This Contract is made and entered into by and between the **CITY OF SPOKANE** as ("City"), a Washington municipal corporation, and **WM. WINKLER COMPANY**, whose address is 5516 North Starr Road, Newman Lake, Washington 99025 as ("Contractor"), individually hereafter referenced as a "party", and together as the "parties".

The parties agree as follows:

- 1. <u>PERFORMANCE</u>. The Contractor will do all work, furnish all labor, materials, tools, construction equipment, transportation, supplies, supervision, organization and other items of work and costs necessary for the proper execution and completion of the work described in the Special Provisions entitled **MAXWELL FROM PETTET TO WALNUT WSDOT BIKE-PED.**
- 2. <u>CONTRACT DOCUMENTS</u>. The contract documents are this Contract, the Contractor's completed bid proposal form, the Washington State Department of Transportation's Standard Specifications for Road, Bridge and Municipal Construction 2025, City of Spokane Special Provisions, contract provisions, contract plans, standard plans, addenda, various certifications and affidavits, supplemental agreements, change orders and subsurface boring logs (if any). These contract documents are on file in the Engineering Services Department and are incorporated into this Contract by reference as if they were set forth at length. In the event of a conflict, or to resolve an ambiguity or dispute, the order of precedence defined in the City of Spokane Special Provisions section 1-04.2 City Engineering Services File No. 2023111 shall apply.
- 3. <u>TIME OF PERFORMANCE</u>. The time of performance of the Contract shall be in accordance with the contract documents.
- 4. <u>LIQUIDATED DAMAGES</u>. Liquidated damages shall be in accordance with the contract documents.
- 5. <u>TERMINATION</u>. Either party may terminate this Contract in accordance with the contract documents.
- 6. <u>COMPENSATION</u>. This is a unit price contract, and upon full and complete performance by the Contractor, the City will pay only the amount set forth in Schedule A-1 for the actual quantities furnished for each bid item at a total cost not to exceed \$1,250,022.70, which are taxed as noted in Section 7.

- 7. TAXES. Bid items in Schedule A-1 shall include sales tax.
- 8. <u>PAYMENT</u>. The Contractor will send its applications for payment to the Engineering Services Department, 998 E North Foothills Drive Spokane, WA 99207-2735. All invoices should include the City Clerk's File No. "OPR 2025-XXXX" and an approved L & I Intent to Pay Prevailing Wage number. The final invoice should include an approved Affidavit of Wages Paid number. Payment will not be made without this documentation included on the invoice. **Payment will be made via direct deposit/ACH** within thirty (30) days after receipt of the Company's application except as provided by state law. Five percent (5%) of the Contract price may be retained by the City, in accord with RCW 60.28 for a minimum of forty five (45) days after final acceptance, as a trust fund for the protection and payment of: the claims of any person arising under the Contract; and the State with respect to taxes imposed pursuant to Titles 50, 51 and 82 RCW which may be due from the Contractor.
- INDEMNIFICATION. The Contractor shall defend, indemnify, and hold the City and its 9. officers and employees harmless from all claims, demands, or suits at law or equity asserted by third parties for bodily injury (including death) and/or property damage which arise from the Contractor's negligence or willful misconduct under this Agreement, including attorneys' fees and litigation costs; provided that nothing herein shall require a Contractor to indemnify the City against and hold harmless the City from claims, demands or suits based solely upon the negligence of the City, its agents, officers, and employees. If a claim or suit is caused by or results from the concurrent negligence of the Contractor's agents or employees and the City, its agents, officers and employees, this indemnity provision shall be valid and enforceable to the extent of the negligence of the Contractor, its agents or employees. The Contractor specifically assumes liability and agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold the City harmless for actions brought by the Contractor's own employees against the City and, solely for the purpose of this indemnification and defense, the Contractor specifically waives any immunity under the Washington State industrial insurance law, or Title 51 RCW. The Contractor recognizes that this waiver was specifically entered into pursuant to the provisions of RCW 4.24.115 and was the subject of mutual negotiation. The indemnity and agreement to defend and hold the City harmless provided for in this section shall survive any termination or expiration of this agreement.
- 10. <u>BONDS</u>. The Contractor may not commence work until it obtains all insurance, permits and bonds required by the contract documents and applicable law. This includes the execution of a performance bond and a payment bond on the forms attached, each equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the contract price, and written by a corporate surety company licensed to do business in Washington State.
- 11. <u>INSURANCE</u>. The Contractor represents that it and its employees, agents and subcontractors, in connection with the Contract, are protected against the risk of loss by the insurance coverages required in the contract documents attached hereto including attached Certificates of Insurance (COI) and any other insurance documents attached. The policies shall be issued by companies that meet with the approval of the City Risk Manager. The policies shall not be canceled without at least minimum required written notice to the City as Additional Insured.
- 12. <u>CONTRACTOR'S WARRANTY</u>. The Contractor's warranty for all work, labor and materials shall be in accordance with the contract documents.
- 13. <u>WAGES</u>. The Contractor and all subcontractors will submit a "Statement of Intent to Pay Prevailing Wages" certified by the industrial statistician of the Department of Labor and Industries, prior to any payments. The "Statement of Intent to Pay Prevailing Wages" shall include: (1) the

Contractor's registration number; and (2) the prevailing wages under RCW 39.12.020 and the number of workers in each classification. Each voucher claim submitted by the Contractor for payment on a project estimate shall state that the prevailing wages have been paid in accordance with the "Statement(s) of Intent to Pay Prevailing Wages" on file with the City. Prior to the payment of funds held under RCW 60.28, the Contractor and subcontractors must submit an "Affidavit of Wages Paid" certified by the industrial statistician.

- 14. <u>STATEMENT OF INTENT TO PAY PREVAILING WAGES TO BE POSTED</u>. The Contractor and each subcontractor required to pay the prevailing rate of wages shall post in a location readily visible at the job site: (1) a copy of a "Statement of Intent to Pay Prevailing Wages" approved by the industrial statistician of the State Department of Labor and Industries; and (2) the address and telephone number of the industrial statistician of the Department of Labor and Industries where a complaint or inquiry concerning prevailing wages may be made.
- 15. <u>PUBLIC WORKS REQUIREMENTS</u>. The Contractor and each subcontractor are required to fulfill the Department of Labor and Industries Public Works and Prevailing Wage Training Requirement under RCW 39.04.350. The contractor must verify responsibility criteria for each first tier subcontractor, and a subcontractor of any tier that hires other subcontractors must verify the responsibility criteria listed in RCW 39.04.350(1) for each of its subcontractors. Verification shall include that each subcontractor, at the time of subcontract execution, meets the responsibility criteria. This verification requirement, as well as responsibility criteria, must be included in every public works contract and subcontract of every tier.

16. SUBCONTRACTOR RESPONSIBILITY.

- A. The Contractor shall include the language of this section in each of its first tier subcontracts, and shall require each of its subcontractors to include the same language of this section in each of their subcontracts, adjusting only as necessary the terms used for the contracting parties. Upon request of the City, the Contractor shall promptly provide documentation to the City demonstrating that the subcontractor meets the subcontractor responsibility criteria below. The requirements of this section apply to all subcontractors regardless of tier.
- B. At the time of subcontract execution, the Contractor shall verify that each of its first tier subcontractors meets the following bidder responsibility criteria:
 - 1. Have a current certificate of registration in compliance with chapter 18.27 RCW, which must have been in effect at the time of subcontract bid submittal;
 - 2. Have a current Washington Unified Business Identifier (UBI) number;
 - 3. If applicable, have:
 - Industrial Insurance (workers' compensation) coverage for the subcontractor's employees working in Washington, as required in Title 51 RCW:
 - b. A Washington Employment Security Department number, as required in Title 50 RCW;
 - c. A Washington Department of Revenue state excise tax registration number, as required in Title 82 RCW;
 - d. An electrical contractor license, if required by Chapter 19.28 RCW;
 - e. An elevator contractor license, if required by Chapter 70.87 RCW.

- 4. Not be disqualified from bidding on any public works contract under RCW 39.06.010 or 39.12.065 (3).
- C. On Public Works construction projects, as defined in RCW 39.04.010, with an estimated cost of six hundred thousand dollars (\$600,000) or more, at least fifteen (15) percent of the labor hours on each project shall be performed by apprentices enrolled in a State-approved apprenticeship program; and for each contract in the project fifteen (15) percent of the labor hours for each craft that has an available state-approved apprenticeship program for Spokane County and utilizes more than one hundred sixty (160) hours in each contract; shall be performed by apprentices enrolled in a state-approved apprenticeship program.
 - 1. Subcontracting Requirements. The utilization percentages for apprenticeship labor for Public Works construction contracts shall also apply to all subcontracts of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) or more within those contracts, and at least fifteen percent (15%) of the labor hours for each such subcontract shall be performed by apprentices in a state-approved apprenticeship program. For each craft that has an available apprenticeship program for Spokane county and performs more than one hundred sixty (160) hours on each project, fifteen (15) percent of the labor hours shall be performed by apprentices enrolled in a State-approved apprenticeship program.
 - 2. Each subcontractor which this chapter applies to is required to execute a form, provided by the city, acknowledging that the requirements of Article X 07.06 SMC are applicable to the labor hours for the project.
- 17. <u>NONDISCRIMINATION</u>. No individual shall be excluded from participation in, denied the benefit of, subjected to discrimination under, or denied employment in the administration of or in connection with this Contract because of age, sex, race, color, religion, creed, marital status, familial status, sexual orientation including gender expression or gender identity, national origin, honorably discharged veteran or military status, the presence of any sensory, mental or physical disability, or use of a service animal by a person with disabilities. The Contractor agrees to comply with, and to require that all subcontractors comply with, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and the Americans with Disabilities Act, as applicable to the Contractor.
- 18. <u>DEBARMENT AND SUSPENSION</u>. The Contractor has provided its certification that it is in compliance with and shall not contract with individuals or organizations which are debarred, suspended, or otherwise excluded from or ineligible from participation in Federal Assistance Programs under Executive Order 12549 and "Debarment and Suspension", codified at 29 CFR part 98.
- 19. <u>ASSIGNMENTS</u>. The Contractor may not assign, transfer or sublet any part of the work under this Contract, or assign any monies due, without the written approval of the City, except as may be required by law. In the event of assignment of accounts or monies due under this Contract, the Contractor specifically agrees to give immediate written notice to the City Administrator, no later than five (5) business days after the assignment.
- 20. <u>ANTI-KICKBACK</u>. No officer or employee of the City of Spokane, having the power or duty to perform an official act or action related to this Contract shall have or acquire any interest in the Contract, or have solicited, accepted or granted a present or future gift, favor, service or other thing of value from or to any person involved in the Contract. Contractor will comply with the

Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act (40 USC 3145), as supplemented by Department of Labor Regulations (29 CFR Part 3, "Contractors and Subcontractors on Public Building or Public Work Financed in Whole or in Part by Loans or Grants from the United States").

- 21. <u>COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS</u>. Each party shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations that are incorporated herein by reference.
- 22. <u>DISPUTES</u>. This Contract shall be performed under the laws of the State of Washington. Any litigation to enforce this Contract or any of its provisions shall be brought in Spokane County, Washington.
- 23. <u>SEVERABILITY</u>. In the event any provision of this Contract should become invalid, the rest of the Contract shall remain in full force and effect.
- 24. <u>AUDIT / RECORDS</u>. The Contractor and its subcontractors shall maintain for a minimum of three (3) years following final payment all records related to its performance of the Contract. The Contractor and its subcontractors shall provide access to authorized City representatives, at reasonable times and in a reasonable manner to inspect and copy any such record. In the event of conflict between this provision and related auditing provisions required under federal law applicable to the Contract, the federal law shall prevail.
- 25. <u>BUSINESS REGISTRATION REQUIREMENT</u>. Section 8.01.070 of the Spokane Municipal Code states that no person may engage in business with the City without first having obtained a valid annual business registration. The Contractor shall be responsible for contacting the State of Washington Business License Services at www.dor.wa.gov or 360-705-6741 to obtain a business registration. If the Contractor does not believe it is required to obtain a business registration, it may contact the City's Taxes and Licenses Division at (509) 625-6070 to request an exemption status determination.
- 26. <u>CONSTRUAL</u>. The Contractor acknowledges receipt of a copy of the contract documents and agrees to comply with them. The silence or omission in the contract documents concerning any detail required for the proper execution and completion of the work means that only the best general practice is to prevail and that only material and workmanship of the best quality are to be used. This Contract shall be construed neither in favor of nor against either party.
- 27. <u>MODIFICATIONS</u>. The City may modify this Contract and order changes in the work whenever necessary or advisable. The Contractor will accept modifications when ordered in writing by the Director of Engineering Services, and the Contract time and compensation will be adjusted accordingly.
- 28. <u>INTEGRATION</u>. This Contract, including any and all exhibits and schedules referred to herein or therein set forth the entire Agreement and understanding between the parties pertaining to the subject matter and merges all prior agreements, negotiations and discussions between them on the same subject matter.
- 29. <u>OFF SITE PREFABRICATED ITEMS</u>. In accordance with RCW 39.04.370, the Contractor shall submit certain information about off-site, prefabricated, nonstandard, project specific items produced under the terms of the Contract and produced outside Washington as a part of the "Affidavit of Wages Paid" form filed with the State Department of Labor and Industries.
- 30. FORCE MAJEURE. Neither party shall be liable to the other for any failure or delay in

performing its obligations hereunder, or for any loss or damage resulting therefrom, due to: (1) acts of God or public enemy, acts of government, riots, terrorism, fires, floods, strikes, lock outs, epidemics, act or failure to act by the other party, or unusually severe weather affecting City, Contractor or its subcontractors, or (2) causes beyond their reasonable control and which are not foreseeable (each a "Force Majeure Event"). In the event of any such Force Majeure Event, the date of delivery or performance shall be extended for a period equal to the time lost by reason of the delay.

CLEAN AIR ACT. 31.

Contractor must comply with all applicable standards, orders or regulations issued pursuant to the Clean Air Act (42 USC 7401-7671g) and the Federal Water Pollution Control Act as amended (33 USC 1251-1387). Violations will be reported.

32. USE OF PROJECT MANAGEMENT SOFTWARE. The Contractor shall transmit all submittal documentation for proposed project materials by uploading it to the City's web based construction management software. A City representative will be available to assist in learning this process.

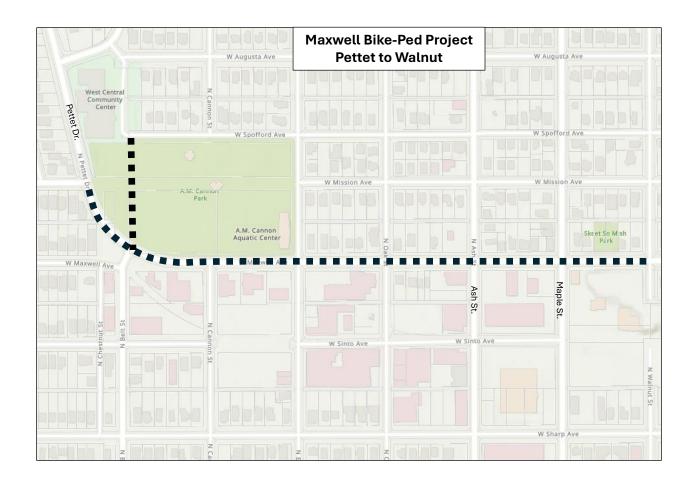

Agenda Wording

An Ordinance adopting an interim official control relating to off-premises alcohol outlets near public assets; adopting a new chapter 17C.348 of the Spokane Municipal Code; setting a public hearing; and declaring an emergency.

Summary (Background)

This ordinance would immediately prohibit the placement of off-premises alcohol outlets (stores that sell alcohol for off-premises use) within 500 feet of parks, schools, libraries, transit centers, and community centers. As an emergency interim ordinance, it sets the required public hearing under RCW 36.70A.390 for June 16, 2025 and declares an emergency pursuant to Section 19 of the Charter and Section 01.01.080 of the Spokane Municipal Code.

What impacts would the proposal have on historically excluded communities? Multiple studies show that off-premises alcohol outlets are disproportionately located in communities with lower incomes and in neighborhoods with a higher percentage of non-white residents.

How will data be collected, analyzed, and reported concerning the effect of the program/policy by racial, ethnic, gender identity, national origin, income level, disability, sexual orientation, or other existing disparities?

The effectiveness of this interim ordinance and the consideration of policies regarding off-premises alcohol outlets will be evaluated and considered during the update to the City's Comprehensive Plan and the work plan required under RCW 36.70A.390.

How will data be collected regarding the effectiveness of this program, policy, or product to ensure it is the right solution?

The City receives notification of liquor license applications. The City will use this data in evaluation of the effectiveness of this interim ordinance.

<u>Describe how this proposal aligns with current City Policies, including the Comprehensive Plan, Sustainability Action Plan, Capital Improvement Program, Neighborhood Master Plans, Council Resolutions, and others?</u>

The City Council adopted Ordinance C36634, which established an alcohol impact area for downtown. The City is currently in the voluntary compliance period as required by Washington Administrative Code 314-12-215. Washington Administrative Code 314-12-215 suggests changes in land use as a voluntary effort a local authority may attempt before the LCB will recognize an alcohol impact area. Additionally, this interim ordinance aligns with the goals of the City's Comprehensive Plan specifically N 2.1 Neighborhood Quality of Life.

ORDINANCE NO. C36680

An ordinance adopting an interim official control relating to off-premises alcohol outlets near public assets; adopting a new chapter 17C.348 of the Spokane Municipal Code; setting a public hearing; and declaring an emergency.

- **WHEREAS**, the City of Spokane is concerned about the number off-premises alcohol outlets seeking to locate near schools, community centers, parks, transit centers, and early learning centers; and
- **WHEREAS,** off-premises alcohol outlets have a significant effect on crime and the quality of life in neighborhoods; and
- **WHEREAS,** research shows off-premises alcohol outlets are associated with violent crime including shootings, assaults, and robberies; and
- **WHEREAS,** research also shows that the proliferation of off-premises alcohol outlets is associated with higher rates of drug overdose; and
- **WHEREAS**, the United States Department of Health and Human Services has identified density of off-premises alcohol outlets in neighborhoods as a risk factor for youth and young adult substance abuse; and
- **WHEREAS,** the Spokane City Council unanimously adopted Ordinance C36634 on February 3, 2025, establishing an alcohol impact area within the boundaries of the downtown police precinct; and
- **WHEREAS,** the City of Spokane is in the voluntary compliance period and is required by WAC 314-12-215 make good-faith efforts, such as changing land use, to reduce illegal activity associated with liquor sales and to promote public health and safety; and
- **WHEREAS**, the City of Spokane is in the process of updating its Comprehensive Plan by year 2026; and
- **WHEREAS,** the Spokane City Council has identified an immediate need to protect and preserve public assets such as schools, parks, and community centers from the potential public health and public safety impacts of off-premises alcohol outlets; and
 - WHEREAS, the Spokane City Council intends to utilize the authority granted under

RCW 36.70A.390 to adopt interim zoning standards to protect and preserve public assets from the potential public health and public safety impacts of off-premises alcohol outlets; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 36.70A.390, the City Council may adopt an interim official control that may be effective for one year if a work plan is developed for related studies; and

WHEREAS, RCW 36.70A.390 authorizes the enactment of an interim official control without a hearing; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 36.70A.390, when the City Council adopts an interim official control without holding a public hearing on the proposed interim official control, it must hold a hearing on the adopted interim official control within at least sixty days of its adoption; and

WHEREAS, the Spokane City Council finds that the interim official control imposed by this ordinance is necessary for the protection of the public peace, health, or safety and for the immediate support of City government and its existing public institutions; and

WHEREAS, the Spokane City Council finds that the application for and the acquisition of businesses offering alcohol for sale for off-premise consumption is increasing, and creating a dangerous situation that is sudden, unexpected, and requires immediate action to prevent or mitigate the threat to public health and safety; and

WHEREAS, the normal course of legislative procedures of the Spokane City Council cannot timely address the threat without the threat of applications and nonconforming uses vesting under the existing code, thereby causing or exacerbating harm to the community or government functions;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City of Spokane does ordain:

Section 1. <u>Findings of Fact.</u> The recitals set forth above are hereby adopted as the City Council's initial findings of fact in support of the interim official control established by this ordinance. The City Council may, in its discretion, adopt additional findings after public hearing referenced in Section 5 below.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of this interim official control is to prohibit the siting of off-premises alcohol outlets within 500 feet of the property line of any public school, private school, property hosting ECEAP or Head Start early learning programs, community center, library, or park.

Section 3. <u>Duration of Interim Official Control</u>. The interim official control imposed by this Ordinance shall be in effect for a period of one year, beginning on the date of the adoption of this Ordinance. During this period, the City will evaluate how to make these standards permanent pursuant to the City's public notice and participation process set forth in SMC 17G.025.

Section 4. Work Plan. Pursuant to RCW 36.70A.390, a work plan related to this ordinance shall include continued public participation and noticing pursuant to chapter 17G.025 SMC, as well as consideration of off-premises alcohol outlets during the update to the City's Comprehensive Plan.

Section 5. Public Hearing. Pursuant to RCW 35.63.200 and 36.70A.390, the City Council will hold a public hearing on this interim official control on June 16, 2025. Immediately after the public hearing, the City Council will adopt findings of fact on the subject of this interim official control.

Section 6. That there is adopted a new Chapter 17C.348 of the Spokane Municipal Code to read as follows:

Chapter 17C.348	Zoning Standards for Off-Premises Alcohol Outlets
17C.348.010	Purpose
17C.348.020	Definitions
17C.348.030	Zoning Standards for Off-Premises Alcohol Outlets

Chapter 17C.348 Zoning Standards for Off-Premises Alcohol Outlets

Section 17C.348.010 Purpose

This chapter provides zoning standards for off-premises alcohol outlets.

Section 17C.348.020 Definitions

- A. "Community Center" means a publicly-owned property or non-profit facility where community members gather to socialize, participate in recreational or educational activities, learn, and/or seek counseling or support services. Community centers house a variety of programs and can be open to everyone in a community or only to a particular group, such as youth or seniors.
- B. "Grocery establishment" means a retail store in this state that is over 15,000 square feet in size and that sells primarily household foodstuffs for off-site consumption, including the sale of fresh produce, meats, poultry, fish, deli products, dairy products,

- canned foods, dry foods, beverages, baked foods, or prepared foods, and where the sale of household supplies or other products is secondary to the primary purpose of food sales.
- C. "Hotel" means buildings, structures, and grounds, having facilities for preparing, cooking, and serving food, that are kept, used, maintained, advertised, or held out to the public to be a place where food is served and sleeping accommodations are offered for pay to transient guests, in which twenty or more rooms are used for the sleeping accommodation of such transient guests. All hotel buildings, structures, and grounds must be located on adjacent property either owned or leased by the same person or persons.
- D. "Library" means the Spokane Public Library, as established under Chapter 6.06 of the Spokane Municipal Code, and all locations operated by the Spokane Public Library. It does not include Spokane Public Library kiosk locations.
- E. "Liquor" in this chapter shall mean the same as "liquor" defined in RCW 66.04.010.
- F. "Off-premises alcohol outlet" means a business that sells liquor intended to be consumed away from the point of sale. It does not include a grocery establishment, hotel, pharmacy, supermarket, or tavern.
- G. "Parks" means and includes all City parks, public squares, park drives, parkways, park museums, pools, bathing beaches, and playgrounds, recreation grounds, trails, natural areas and any conservation land under the control of the park board.
- H. "Pharmacy" means every place properly licensed by the Pharmacy Quality Assurance Commission where the practice of pharmacy is conducted as defined by RCW 18.64.011(32).
- I. "Public or Private School" means any tax-supported elementary or secondary school or private school meeting the requirements of RCW 28A, and includes any facility hosting an Early Childhood Education Assistance Program or Head Start.
- J. "Supermarket", as designated by the North American Industry Classification System, means a business where the primary business activity is retailing a general line of food, such as canned and frozen foods; fresh fruits and vegetables; and fresh and prepared meats, fish, and poultry. It does not include Convenience Retailers or Gasoline Stations with Convenience Stores as defined by the North American Industry Classification System.

- K. "Tavern" means any establishment, with special space and accommodation for sale by the glass and for consumption on the premises, of beer or other fermented beverages.
- L. "Transit center" means a facility where multiple buses or trains can stop simultaneously.

Section 17C.34.030 Regulations for Off-Premises Alcohol Outlets

- A. An off-premises alcohol outlet shall not be located within five hundred feet of the property line of any public school, private school, community center, library, or park. The owner or operator of an off-premises alcohol outlet shall be responsible for demonstrating that the proposed location is not within five hundred feet of the property line of a public school, private school, community center, library, transit center, or park.
- B. The measurement of the separation distance shall be measured as the shortest straight-line distance from the property line of any public school, private school, community center, library, transit center, or park to the property line of the off-premises alcohol outlet.
- C. Nothing in this chapter shall prohibit a person or entity from assuming ownership or operation of an existing off-premises alcohol outlet within the restricted area; provided, the person or entity assumes and maintains the necessary off-premises liquor license required by the Washington State Liquor and Cannabis Board and; provided further, said premises shall not be moved any closer to any public school, private school, community center, library, transit center, or park. Nonconforming off-premises alcohol outlets shall be subject to the provisions of SMC Chapter 17C.210 Nonconforming Situations.
- D. These zoning standards do not apply to grocery establishments, hotels, pharmacies, supermarkets, or taverns as defined in SMC 17C.348.020.
- **Section 7.** Severability. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance should be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance.
- **Section 8.** <u>Clerical Errors.</u> Upon approval by the city attorney, the city clerk is authorized to make necessary corrections to this ordinance, including scrivener's errors or clerical mistakes; references to other local, state, or federal laws, rules, or regulations; or numbering or referencing of ordinances or their sections and subsections.
- **Section 9.** Emergency Clause. The City Council declares that an urgency and emergency exists such that this ordinance is needed for the immediate preservation of

the public peace, health, or safety, and/or for the immediate support of City government and its existing public institutions, and that because of such need, this ordinance shall be effective immediately under Section 19 of the City Charter, upon the affirmative vote of one more than a majority of the City Council.

An Ordinance relating to regular adjustments of fees, charges and other assessments collected by the City of Spokane to ensure they reflect the actual cost of service delivery; and amending Section 04.02.010 of the Spokane Municipal Code.

WHEREAS, the City lawfully assesses certain fees, charges and other assessments for services rendered, such as processing applications, reviewing documents and issuing permits, and delivering essential services; and

WHEREAS, because many fee schedules fail to keep pace with the actual cost of delivery of services due to the significant time, resources and expenses associated with evaluating whether fees, charges and other assessments suffice to cover costs; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to encourage regular evaluation of available technologies and software that would allow for reduction or other adjustments of City fees, charges, and assessments; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to establish a policy that would ensure regular review of fees, charges and other assessments to ensure they both reflect the actual cost of services rendered, coupled with efforts to reduce the costs of collection;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City of Spokane does hereby ordain as follows:

Section 1. That Article I, Section 04.02.010 of the Spokane Municipal Code is amended as follows:

Article I. In General

Section 04.02.010 Policy to Collect Accounts

- <u>A.</u> It is the policy of the City to promptly identify and collect all duly payable moneys related to services rendered, damage to City property, or any other source.
- B. It is the policy of the City to regularly review and, as necessary, adjust schedules for fees, charges, and other assessments to ensure the City recovers at least the actual cost of delivering said services. Accordingly, during the even year of each biennium, all city departments shall review as appropriate their schedules for fees, charges, and other assessments to ensure there is adequate cost recovery for the services rendered and shall then report the status and outcome of such review to

the Mayor and City Council. The biennial review and adjustment shall be governed by the following specific criteria:

- Except as otherwise provided in this section, fees, charges and
 assessments shall be adjusted by reference to the Consumer Price Index
 published by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics, (All City
 Average (CPI-U and CPI-W)) or such other applicable index or formula
 appropriate for the service rendered.
- 2. General facilities charges shall be updated and maintained pursuant to Chapters 13.03 and 13.04 of the Spokane Municipal Code.
- 3. <u>Transportation impact fees shall be updated and maintained pursuant to Chapter 17D.075 of the Spokane Municipal Code.</u>
- 4. This section shall not apply to criminal and civil penalties fees, which shall be adjusted consistent with state law and any penalty schedule established separately under the Spokane Municipal Code.
- 5. In reviewing fees, charges, and other assessments each biennium, each City department shall systematically and resolutely pursue opportunities to maximize operational efficiency, eliminate waste, streamline processes, and minimize administrative costs to ensure the lowest possible financial burden on payers. This includes exploring innovative solutions that enhance effectiveness and reduce expenses. In conjunction with the Information Technology Division, departments shall also evaluate and implement apt software and platforms that automate workflows, improve accuracy, and reduce the costs associated with calculating and billing fees, charges, and other assessments.
- 6. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit review and adjustment of fees more frequently than every biennium.

Section 2. Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this ordinance should be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality thereof shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this ordinance.

Section 3. Clerical Errors. Upon approval by the city attorney, the city clerk is authorized to make necessary corrections to this ordinance, including scrivener's

errors or clerical mistakes; references to other local, state, or federal laws, rules, or regulations; or numbering or referencing of ordinances or their sections and subsections.

Ordinance C36667

An Ordinance relating to discrimination and affirming protection of LGBTQIA2S+ Communities in Spokane, amending Sections 18.01.020, 18.01.030, and 18.02.030 of Title 18 of the Spokane Municipal Code; creating a new section 03.07.340 in Chapter 03.07 of the Spokane Municipal Code; and establishing an effective date.

WHEREAS, the City of Spokane is committed to fostering a community where all individuals are treated with dignity, equity, and respect, regardless of sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender expression; and

WHEREAS, LGBTQIA2S+ individuals face ongoing discrimination, violence, and systemic barriers that threaten their safety, well-being, and human rights; and

WHEREAS, the 2025 Presidential Transition Project ("Project 2025") is a political initiative to reshape the federal government of the United States and consolidate executive power in favor of ultra-conservative policies; and

WHEREAS, consistent with the Project 2025 initiative, President Donald Trump has issued at least six anti-equity executive orders related to diversity, equity, inclusion, accessibility and transgender people, including executive orders to terminate equity-related grants, forbid federally-funded entities from engaging in diversity, equity, inclusion and accessibility programs, as well as a refusal to federally recognize the existence of transgender people, provide equal access for transgender people to sports and the military, and to assure access to gender-affirming care for individuals under age 19; and

WHEREAS, transgender and gender expansive people in particular have been vilified in political advertisements; and, across the country, there continues to be legislation enacted that targets LGBTQIA2S+ communities, threatening access to healthcare, education, and basic protections under the law; and

WHEREAS, as of August 2024, 39.4% of trans youth aged 13-17, amounting to 118,300 individuals, are living in the 26 states that have passed bans on gender-affirming care; and

WHEREAS, by preventing doctors from providing this care or threatening to take children away from parents who support their child in their transition, these state bans prevent transgender, non-binary, and gender-expansive youth from accessing medically necessary, safe health care backed by decades of research and supported by every major medical association, which collectively represent over 1.3 million US doctors; and

WHEREAS, the City of Spokane recognizes the inherent worth and equal rights of all people, including LGBTQIA2S+ individuals, and seeks to provide a safe and welcoming environment for those who reside in or visit our city; and

WHEREAS, Spokane Municipal Code Title 18 and state law currently offer protections for the LGBTQIA2S+ community against discrimination, including protections against discrimination based on gender identity and sexual orientation, and Spokane has continuously committed to protecting and advocating for the rights of LGBTQIA2S+ individuals by rejecting policies and actions that promote discrimination, harm, or inequality; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to further revise Spokane Municipal Code to recognize the inherent risk to the LGBTQIA2S+ community in Spokane both from federal policies and from interjurisdictional legal processes emanating from states that do not recognize LGBTQIA2S+ rights or which are working to deny such individuals access to essential medical care, including gender-affirming care;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City of Spokane does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That section 18.01.020 of Chapter 18.01 of the Spokane Municipal Code is amended as follows:

SMC 18.01.020 Purpose and Intent

- A. The City values the dignity and worth of all human beings and is committed to promoting justice, equity and an inclusive environment for all by respecting cultural and individual diversity and fostering mutual understanding among all people regardless of race, religion, creed, color, sex, national origin, marital status, familial status, domestic violence victim status, age, sexual orientation, gender identity, honorably discharged veteran or military status, refugee status, the presence of any sensory, mental or physical disability as defined by the Americans with Disabilities Act and/or the Washington State Law Against Discrimination, or the receipt of, or eligibility for the receipt of, funds from any housing choice or other subsidy program or alternative source of income. The City of Spokane expands its welcoming city commitment to include LGBTQIA2S+ people; affirming its commitment to ensuring that all individuals, regardless of the federal government's persecution of LGBTQIA2S+ people, feel safe and supported.
- B. It is the intent of the City that all people have an equal opportunity to participate fully in the life of the City and that discriminatory barriers to equal participation in employment, housing, and public accommodations be removed. The City has a compelling interest in eradicating and preventing such discrimination and in ensuring equal opportunity in employment, housing, and public accommodations.

- This Title 18 represents the least restrictive means of achieving the City's objectives.
- C. The City of Spokane strongly believes in and affirms the right of individuals to seek, obtain, provide, or facilitate gender-affirming care that is legal in Washington State or in other states where it would be legal had it occurred in Washington State.
- D. To further combat discrimination in the Spokane community, it is necessary to direct that the City shall conduct regular reviews of its policies, practices, and public services to ensure they are inclusive, equitable, and affirming for LGBTQIA2S+ individuals.
- ((C)) <u>E</u>. The provisions of this Title 18 are to be broadly and liberally construed to effectuate this Title's remedial purpose and the City's legislative intent.
- ((D)) <u>F</u>. These sections are not intended to establish or require affirmative action or quotas of any kind, or to infringe upon the authority vested in the civil service commission and City departments pursuant to the City Charter.
- ((€)) <u>G</u>. By enacting this title, the City expresses its intent to ensure that Spokane generally, as well as the City itself, is free from bias or discrimination on the basis of race, religion, creed, color, sex, national origin, marital status, familial status, domestic violence victim status, age, sexual orientation, gender identity, honorably discharged veteran or military status, refugee status, the presence of any sensory, mental or physical disability as defined by the Americans with Disabilities Act and/or the Washington State Law Against Discrimination, and free from sexual harassment.
- ((\(\xi\)) \(\frac{H}\). Nothing in this chapter shall constitute a cause of action under state law or form a basis for relief in the state courts. It is the intent of this chapter that all causes of action for violations of the chapter shall lie with the City of Spokane's Hearing Examiner, Municipal Court, or Superior Court, as specified in this Title 18.
- ((G)) I. Nothing in this Title 18 shall be deemed to deny any person the right to institute any action or to pursue any civil or criminal remedy for the violation of such person's civil rights. Nothing in this Title 18 shall limit or expand any cause of action available to any person under federal or state law.
- **Section 2.** That section 18.01.030 of Chapter 18.01 of the Spokane Municipal Code is amended as follows:

SMC 18.01.030 Definitions.

A. "Commission" means the Spokane Human Rights Commission.

- B. "Data management protocols" means the procedures governing how data collected by surveillance equipment will be retained, stored, indexed and accessed. Information comprising data management protocols includes, at a minimum, the information required in SMC 18.04.020.
- C. "Disability" means the presence of a sensory, mental, or physical impairment that, whether temporary or permanent, common or uncommon, mitigated or unmitigated, a limitation or not on the ability to work generally or work at a particular job, or a limitation or not on the ability to engage in any other activity within the scope of this Title 18:
 - 1. is medically cognizable or diagnosable; or
 - 2. exists as a record or history; or
 - 3. is perceived to exist whether or not it exists in fact.
 - 4. For the purposes of reasonable accommodation in employment, an impairment must be known or shown through an interactive process to exist in fact and:
 - a. The impairment must have a substantially limiting effect upon the individual's ability to perform his or her job, the individual's ability to apply or be considered for a job, or the individual's access to equal benefits, privileges, or terms or conditions or employment; or
 - b. The employee must have put the employer on notice of the existence of an impairment, and medical documentation must establish a reasonable likelihood that engaging in job functions without an accommodation would aggravate the impairment to the extent that it would create a substantially limiting effect.
 - 5. For purposes of this definition, a limitation is not substantial if it has only a trivial effect.
 - 6. For purposes of housing, a "reasonable accommodation" is an adjustment to a rule, policy, practice, or service that may be necessary for a person with a disability to have an equal opportunity to use and enjoy a dwelling, including public and common use spaces, where there is an identifiable relationship or nexus between the requested accommodation and the person's disability.
- D. "Discrimination" means different or unequal treatment because of race, religion, creed, color, sex, national origin, marital status, familial status, domestic violence victim status, age, sexual orientation, gender identity, honorably discharged veteran or military status, refugee status, disability, the use of a guide dog or

service animal, or the use or eligibility for the use of housing choice or other subsidy program or alternative source of income. "Discriminate" means to treat differently or unequally because of race, religion, creed, color, sex, national origin, marital status, familial status, domestic violence victim status, age, sexual orientation, gender identity, honorably discharged veteran or military status, refugee status, the presence of any sensory, mental or physical disability as defined by the Americans with Disabilities Act and/or the Washington State Law Against Discrimination, or the use or eligibility for the use of housing choice or other subsidy program or alternative source of income. For purposes of this definition, it is discriminatory to fail to offer reasonable accommodation in housing or employment to an otherwise qualified applicant or employee with a disability, absent a showing that the accommodation would impose an undue hardship.

- E. "Dog guide" means a dog that is specifically trained for the purpose of guiding persons who are blind or a dog trained for the purpose of assisting persons with disabilities.
- F. "Domestic Violence Victim Status" means a family or household member, as defined in RCW 10.99.020 (3), who has been subjected to domestic violence as defined in RCW 10.99.020 (5) or who is a victim of sexual assault as defined in RCW 70.125.030.
- G. "Employee" means an individual who works for wages, salary or commission, or a combination thereof, in the service of an employer, but does not include a person employed by a parent, grandparent, brother, sister, spouse or child. The term includes an individual who is seeking or applying for employment. This definition does not include independent contractors.
- H. "Employer" means any person acting in the interest of an employer, directly or indirectly, who employs employees within the City, or who solicits individuals within the City to apply for employment within the City, including the City of Spokane and all its boards, commissions and authorities.
- I. "Entities under common ownership" means two or more legal entities, such as corporations, limited liability companies, partnerships, and the like which are: owned by the same person(s); in which the same person(s) serve as officers and/or directors; or the majority of one of which is owned by one or more of the others. For example, if a single person owns controlling interests in several limited liability companies, all of those limited liability companies are entities under common ownership.
- J. "Family with children status" means one or more individuals who have not attained the age of eighteen years being domiciled with a parent or another person having legal custody of such individual or individuals, or with the designee of such parent

- or other person having such legal custody, with the written permission of such parent or other person. Families with children status also applies to any person who is pregnant or is in the process of securing legal custody of any individual who has not attained the age of eighteen years.
- K. "Federally-recognized tribe" means an entity listed on the Department of the Interior's list under the Federally Recognized Indian Tribe List Act of 1994, which the Secretary currently acknowledges as an Indian tribe and with which the United States maintains a government-to-government relationship.
- L. "Gender-affirming care" means a service or product that a health care provider, as defined in RCW 70.02.010, provides to an individual to support and affirm the individual's gender identity. "Gender-affirming care" includes, but is not limited to, treatment for gender dysphoria, gender-affirming hormone therapy, and gender-affirming surgical procedures. "Gender-affirming care" can be provided to two spirit, transgender, nonbinary, and other gender diverse individuals.
- ((L)) M. "Gender Identity" means having or being perceived as having a gender identity, self-image, appearance, behavior, or expression, whether or not that gender identity, self-image, appearance, behavior, or expression is different from that traditionally associated with the sex assigned to that person at birth.
- ((M) N. "Housing choice or other subsidy program((or alternative source of income))" means, without limitation: (i) any short or long term federal, state or local government, private nonprofit, or other assistance program in which a tenant's rent is paid either partially by the program (through a direct arrangement between the program and the owner or lessor of the real property), and partially by the tenant or completely by the program; or (ii) HUD-Veteran Affairs Supportive Housing (VASH) vouchers, Housing and Essential Needs (HEN) funds, and short-term rental assistance provided by Rapid Rehousing subsidies.
- ((N)) O. "Impairment" includes, without limitation, any:
 - physiological disorder, or condition, cosmetic disfigurement, or anatomical loss affecting one or more of the following body systems: Neurological, musculoskeletal, special sense organs, respiratory, including speech organs, cardiovascular, reproductive, digestive, genitor-urinary, hemic and lymphatic, skin and endocrine; or
 - 2. mental, developmental, traumatic, or psychological disorder, including but not limited to cognitive limitation, organic brain syndrome, emotional or mental illness, and specific learning disabilities.
- ((O)) P. "Income" means lawful, verifiable income derived from all sources, including without limitation wages, salaries or other compensation for employment; Social

Security benefits; supplemental security income; unemployment benefits; retirement programs; child support; payments from the Aged, Blind or Disabled Cash Assistance Program; Refugee Cash Assistance; any federal, state, local government, private, or nonprofit-administered benefit program, including without limitation payments from any housing choice or other subsidy program as defined in this chapter; financial aid for college students; and per capita payments or distributions received from a federally-recognized tribe.

- ((P)) <u>Q.</u> "Labor organization" means an organization which is constituted for the purpose, in whole or in part, of collective bargaining or for dealing with an employer concerning grievances, terms or conditions of employment, or for other mutual aid or protection in connection with an employer.
- R. "LGBTQIA2S+" means and includes Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer/Questioning, Intersex, Asexual/Aromantic, Two Spirit people and any other term which refers to one's gender identity or sexual orientation.
- ((Q)) <u>S</u>. "Marital status" means the status of being married, single, separated, divorced or widowed.
- ((R)) <u>T</u>. "National origin" includes ((ancestry)), <u>but is not limited to, an individual's or their ancestor's place of origin (such as country or world region) or the manifestation of the physical, cultural, or linguistic characteristics of a national origin group.</u>
- ((S)) \underline{U} . "Operational protocols" means the procedures governing how and when surveillance equipment may be used and by whom and includes, at a minimum, the information required in SMC 18.04.010.

$((\mp))$ \underline{V} . "Person" includes:

- 1. A natural individual, partnership, association, organization, corporation, cooperative, legal representative, trustee and receiver, and any group of persons acting in concert;
- 2. an owner, lessee, proprietor, manager, agent or employee, of a person, whether consisting of one or more natural persons;
- 3. entities under common ownership; and
- 4. any political or civil subdivisions of the City and any agency or instrumentality of the City or of any political or civil subdivision thereof.

This definition does not include the federal government or any federally-recognized tribe.

 $((\ensuremath{ \cup}))$ <u>W</u>. "Place of public resort, accommodation, assemblage or amusement" includes, but is not limited to, any place, licensed or unlicensed, kept for gain, hire or reward, or where charges are made for admission, service, occupancy, or use of any

property or facilities, whether conducted for the entertainment, housing, or lodging of transient guests, or for the benefit, use, or accommodation of those seeking health, recreation, or rest, or for the burial or other disposition of human remains, or for the sale of goods, merchandise, services, or personal property, or for the rendering of personal services, or for public conveyance or transportation on land, water or in the air, including the stations and terminals thereof and the garaging of vehicles, or where food or beverages of any kind are sold for consumption on the premises, or where public amusement, entertainment, sports, or recreation of any kind is offered with or without charge, or where medical service or care is made available, or where the public gathers, congregates, or assembles for amusement, recreation, or public purposes, or public halls, public elevators, and public washrooms of buildings and structures occupied by two or more tenants, or by the owner and one or more tenants, or any public library or educational institution, or schools of special instruction, or nursery schools, or day care centers or children's camps, provided that nothing contained in this definition shall be construed to include or apply to any institute, bona fide club, or place of accommodation, which is by its nature distinctly private, including fraternal organizations, though where public use is permitted that use shall be covered by this section; nor shall anything contained in this definition apply to any educational facility, columbarium, crematory, mausoleum, or cemetery operated or maintained by a bona fide religious or sectarian institution.

- ((orall)) \underline{X} . "Profiling" means actions of the Spokane Police Department, its members, or officers commissioned by the Spokane Police Department to rely on actual or perceived race, religion, national origin, color, creed, age, citizenship status, immigration status, refugee status, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, disability, socio-economic status, housing status, or membership in any protected class under federal, state or local law as the determinative factor in initiating law enforcement action against an individual, rather than an individual's behavior or other information or circumstances that links a person or persons to suspected unlawful activity.
- ((\(\frac{\text{W}}{\text{)}}\) \(\frac{Y}{\text{.}}\) "Refugee status" means the status of a person who, under the provisions of 8 USC 1101(a)(42), is outside a country of that person's nationality or, in the case of a person having no nationality, is outside any country in which that person last habitually resided, and who is unable or unwilling to return to, and is unable or unwilling to avail himself or herself of the protection of, that country because of persecution or a well-founded fear of persecution on account of race, religion, nationality, membership in a particular social group, or political opinion.
- ((X)) \underline{Z} . "Service animal" means an animal that is trained for the purposes of assisting or accommodating a person with a disability.

- ((¥)) AA. "Sex" is the biological indication of male and female, determined by factor such as sex chromosomes, naturally occurring sex hormones, and nonamibguous internal and external genitalia present at birth, without regard to an individual's psychological, chosen, or subjective experience of gender.
- ((∠)) <u>BB</u>. "Sexual orientation" includes heterosexuality, homosexuality, bisexuality and gender expression or identity. As used in this definition, "gender expression or identity" means having or being perceived as having a gender identity, self-image, appearance, behavior, or expression, whether or not that gender identity, self-image, appearance, behavior, or expression is different from that traditionally associated with the sex assigned to that person at birth.
- ((AA)) <u>CC</u>. "Surveillance equipment" means equipment capable of capturing or recording data, including images, videos, photographs or audio operated by or at the direction of a City department that may deliberately or inadvertently capture activities of individuals on public or private property, regardless of whether "masking" or other technology might be used to obscure or prevent the equipment from capturing certain views. "Surveillance equipment" includes drones or unmanned aircraft and any attached equipment used to collect data. "Surveillance equipment" does not include the following equipment which are in use by the City of Spokane as of March 1, 2017:
 - 1. handheld or body-worn devices (e.g., "bodycams") used by law enforcement;
 - 2. cameras installed in or on a police vehicle (e.g., "dashcams");
 - 3. cameras installed in or on any City-owned vehicle, including without limitation fire trucks, emergency vehicles, utility vehicles and street maintenance vehicles, which are intended to ensure the safe operation of the vehicle;
 - 4. cameras installed along a public right-of-way to record traffic patterns and/or traffic violations;
 - 5. cameras intended to record activity inside or at the entrances to City buildings for security purposes; or
 - 6. cameras installed to monitor and protect the physical integrity of City infrastructure, including without limitation fire stations and utility service facilities.

Section 3. That section 18.02.030 of Chapter 18.02 of the Spokane Municipal Code is amended as follows:

SMC 18.02.030 Prohibition Against Assisting in Discrimination

- A. No person shall, with the knowledge or assent of an employer, to assist, induce, compel or coerce the doing of any acts of discrimination, or to attempt to do so.
- B. No City of Spokane resources, including, but not limited to, City property or time spent while on duty by a City employee or official, employee, shall be used for investigation, assisting an investigation, or detention of an individual based on exercising their rights against discrimination set forth in this title.
- C. Whenever the City collects or disseminates information about an individual or individual's sex or gender, it will be without regard to sex assigned at birth. The City will not collect or disseminate information about sex assigned at birth, unless related to a criminal investigation of a violation of Washington State law.
- D. The City shall actively work to combat discrimination prohibited by this title by ensuring the City's public safety programs:
 - a. <u>Maintain LGBTQIA2S+ liaison officers within the police department to act</u> as points of contact, advocate for community members, and build trust; and
 - b. Collaborate with local LGBTQIA2S+ community and cultural leaders, working closely with LGBTQIA2S+ event organizers to ensure public safety while prioritizing the needs and well-being of participants and attendees.
- E. The City shall conduct regular reviews of its policies, rules, practices, and public services to ensure they are inclusive, equitable, and affirming for LGBTQIA2S+ individuals.

Section 4. That there is adopted a new section SMC 03.07.340 of Chapter 03.07 of the Spokane Municipal Code as follows:

03.07.340 Employee Access to Health Care

City-provided health care policies shall extend coverage for the rights of individuals to seek, obtain, provide, or facilitate reproductive health care services and gender-affirming treatment that is legal in Washington State.

- **Section 5.** Effective Date. This ordinance shall go into effect on May 22, 2025 or the effective date set by Section 19 of the City Charter, whichever is later.
- **Section 6.** <u>Severability</u>. If a section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance us declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.
- **Section 7.** Clerical Error. Upon approval by the city attorney, the city clerk is authorized to make necessary corrections to this ordinance, including scrivener's errors

or clerical mistakes; references to other local, state, or federal laws, rules, or regulations; or numbering or referencing of ordinances or their sections and subsections.

Spokane City Council Ordinance C36667

Thank you president Wilkerson and members of the Spokane City Council for the opportunity to send a more complete review than my 3 minute presentation would allow.

My name is Dr. Al Oliva and I am a board-certified plastic and reconstructive surgeon and I have had the privilege of serving this medical community for over 30 years. I write to you in opposition to Ordinance C3667, as a board member of the Alliance for Hippocratic Medicine, a National organization of over 30,000 physicians that are dedicated to the restoration of Hippocratic principles back to medicine. The foremost principle in medicine is to affirm the intrinsic value and dignity of every human person. Secondly, physicians are obligated by the principles on non-maleficence, to do no harm, and the principle of beneficence, to always act in the best interest of their patients. I have lectured on the treatment of gender dysphoria and the surgical interventions and complications at numerous medical meetings nationally and internationally.

The current treatment of gender dysphoria in some centers of the United States violate Hippocratic principles of medicine. We speak against this because it's just bad medicine. In fact, many would consider it malpractice. (American College of Pediatricians n.d.)

We must understand that gender-confused youth truly and greatly suffer. A clear diagnosis of their suffering can only come from proper assessment. Treatment must be directed at the established psychological problems and must be therapeutic, carefully weighing the adverse risks and the anticipated benefits of treatment. None of this occurs in the present treatment of gender dysphoria. There is no clinical diagnosis for gender dysphoria. Children and adolescents diagnose themselves and are immediately affirmed with no attempts to understand their underlying problems. Currently, if a child or adolescent claims any discomfort or confusion about their sex and is seen in a transgender clinic, after a brief interview, they are immediately affirmed as having gender dysphoria and are prescribed pubertal blockers and cross-sex hormones.. However, there is overwhelming scientific evidence that puberty-blocking agents and transsex

hormones do not ameliorate the dysphoria, but actually make it worse. (Hisle-Gorman 2021). The reason is because the underlying psychological cause of the suffering is never addressed. These children and adolescents have a markedly increased incidence of autism, depression, anxiety, dissociative disorder, and PTSD from childhood physical, mental, and/or sexual abuse (Ruuska 2024) (Kozlowska 2021). That is why Professor Christopher Gillberg, a neuropsychiatrist at the Neuropsychiatric Institute in Gottenberg, Sweden, has called the treatment of gender dysphoria in youth "possibly one of the greatest scandals in medical history" and has called for "the immediate moratorium on the use of puberty blocker drugs because of their unknown long-term effects. (Brief 2021).

After years of experimentation with pubertal blockers and transsex hormones, the National Health Service in Sweden has now blocked all medical and surgical transitioning of minors. (Ministry 2019). A landmark systematic review of nearly 10,000 published medical articles from 15 medical databases failed to reveal any psychological benefit from medical or surgical transitioning of children and adolescents. (Ludvigsson 2023). Finland, Denmark, and Norway, all progressive countries in Europe that have always been welcoming to the LGBTQ communities, have stopped transitioning children and adolescents as well. Similarly, government agencies or medical organizations in France, Italy, and even Belgium are considering blocking the transitioning of children and adolescents, (Review 2020) while the state of Queensland in Australia has ordered the prohibition of pubertal blockers. The Health Minister in New Zealand is considering the same and has launched its own review. Last week the Federal Council of Medicine in Brazil has also approved a resolution banning pubertal blockers, lifting the minimum age for transsex hormones to 18 and surgical intervention to age 21 (Lane 2025).

Simply put, multiple systematic reviews have revealed no benefit to psychological well-being in transitioned children. However, studies reveal serious medical adverse events. In Finland, for example, the collapse of the entire cervical and thoracic spine of a 14-year-old transgender boy led to their systematic review that found no psychological benefit. In addition, the Finns also reported that the suicide rate in transgender youth is not different from cohorts with the same underlying psychological challenges. Therefore, the issue of

suicide in these young people has everything to do with the underlying psychological problems and not their gender identity.

As you may know, the National Health Service in England, shut down the Tavistock Clinic, perhaps the largest transgender clinic in Europe. After a 4-year review by pediatrician Hillary Cass, and seven systematic reviews done by York University, England also stopped puberty suppressing hormones. (Cass 2024). The Cass Review, as it is known, found "sexless adults, adolescents with depleted bone density, hampered cognitive development and a worsening of psychological problems". The review, the largest comprehensive review to date, found "no statistically significant difference in gender dysphoria, mental health, body image and psychological functioning in children and adolescents treated with puberty blockers". Rather than "sterilize children, these clinics will provide patients with access to mental health and pediatric health experts, resulting in a holistic approach to care".

The only study that actually measured IQ before and after puberty blocking agents revealed a seven-point drop in just 1 year (Mul 2001). It has now become clear to the neuropsychologists that the prefrontal cortex of the brain, which is the executive function of the brain, is not fully developed until age 25. Its normal development requires *same* sex hormones to develop normally.

The medical risks of giving testosterone to natal girls include low HDL and high triglycerides, elevated homocysteine, hepatotoxicity, polycythemia, sleep apnea, insulin resistance and unknown effects on the breast, endometrial, and ovarian tissue.

Similarly, the risks of giving estrogen to natal boys include a 5-fold increase in thrombosis and embolism, cardiovascular disease, weight gain, hypertriglyceridemia, hypertension, decreased glucose tolerance, gallbladder disease, prolactinoma, and breast cancer. A recent study from the University of Amsterdam revealed that in natal men taking estrogen for a median period of 18 years, the breast cancer in these men, transgender women, was 46-fold higher than in cis-men (de Block 2019). In the United States, we have been transitioning children since 2007. Where is the data? Dr. Johanna Olson-Kennedy received \$11 million from the NIH, to study the effects of transitioning on children and

adolescents in LA, the largest transgender clinic in the United States. Dr. Olson-Kennedy refuses to publish the data because as she told the New York Times, she does not wish her data to be "weaponized" (Ghorayshi 2024). If the data showed that puberty blockers and transsex hormones benefited transgender youth, she would have certainly published it. The data has not been published because like all the other systematic reviews it fails to show psychological benefit. Now one can understand why Dr. Gilberg calls this perhaps the greatest medical scandal in history. Rather than helping these adolescents with her underlying psychological distress and suffering we are stopping their puberty, which will cause infertility and is not reversible, and placing them on a fast track to take transsex hormones and then surgical interventions which again are not reversible. Dr. Olson-Kennedy has also stated that adolescent girls who undergo bilateral mastectomies of normal breasts, and who change their minds can simply "go get them made" (Bosshardt 2025). As a reconstructive surgeon who has devoted a great deal of my career to breast cancer reconstruction, I can only say that the statement is extremely absurd, nonscientific, and lacks any understanding of normal female physiology.

Space does not allow me to discuss the serious complications that occur from transgender surgical operations. The complication rate for inversion vaginoplasty in trans-women, where most of the penis is resected and the testes are amputated and the penile skin is inverted into a canal created between the vagina and the bladder, has a complication rate of over 70%. (Hontscharuk 2021), (Massie 2018). Similarly, transgender men have urethral complications of 35-40% more than half of these patients require revisional surgery and many live the remainder of their lives requiring urethral catheterization in order to urinate or living in diapers because of urethral fistulas (Veerman 2020).

A longitudinal study from the Karolinska Institute researched adults who had surgical transitioning operations and followed them 10 years after their surgery. The suicide rate was 19 times their cohorts. And in female to male transition the completed suicide rate was 40 times the control cohorts (Dhejne 2011). Clearly, the surgery did not do anything to improve the psychological well-being of these patients.

Who is caring for the destroyed lives of the detransitioners? There are over 57 thousand

detransitioners on the social media platform Redditt alone. The clinics and the doctors

that transitioned these children and adolescents turn them away. Perhaps this Council

could find a way to welcome and help these detransitioners.

Grand View Research estimates that in 2025, \$1.8 billion will be spent on pubertal

blockers and trans-sex hormones and \$3.4 billion will be spent on sex trait modification

surgery. (Research 2023-2030) Ask yourselves: "Who benefits from this industry?"

Certainly not the transitioners. Studies show that 75 to 90% of gender dysphoric youths

would desist, that is, no longer have the angst about their sex if we counseled them, loved

them, and affirmed their biological sex (Zucker 2018). So why are we sterilizing them,

castrating them, and removing their normal natal breasts?

Some of you on this council have worked for Planned Parenthood, now perhaps the

leading provider of pubertal blockers and transsex hormones. Some of you have received

campaign contributions from Planned Parenthood. Obviously, this is a conflict of interest

that demands that you recuse yourselves from any vote on this ordinance.

Acting in the best interest of children and adolescents should be your only concern and

this should not be a political issue. This requires objective thinking and acting only on

scientific evidence. The moral and legal responsibility for the Detransitioners' ruined lives

will rest with this Council.

RE: Emergency Medical Transport Requirements - License Code Update (SMC 10.47)

This memo recommends the adoption of an ordinance to update the City of Spokane's Emergency Medical Transport requirements to align with state law, Spokane County EMS & Trauma Care Council protocols, and local regulatory licensing requirements.

Executive Summary – City of Spokane Emergency Medical Transport

I. **Background**: The Spokane Fire Department is the primary responder for basic and advanced life support medical emergencies within Spokane. The City of Spokane contracts with private ambulance service companies to provide emergency medical transport within the city of Spokane. Currently, the City contracts with one company. There are approximately 43,000 emergency/non-emergency 911 transports annually.

Ambulance services are regulated statewide by Washington State Department of Health primarily through RCWs 18.73, 70.168, and WAC 246-976. Local oversight is provided by the Spokane County EMS & Trauma Council, Spokane County Medical Program Director, and the Spokane Fire Department.

SMC Chapter 10.47 – Emergency Medical Transport was adopted by the City Council twenty-five years ago to provide oversight of the City's contracted private ambulance transport services. This ordinance sought to codify practices to end deceptive billing, the practice of "jumping calls" by monitoring radio frequencies, and the withholding of critical medical information from Fire Department EM first responders (Lopez, 2025).

II. Issue: SMC Chapter 10.47 – Emergency Medical Transport was drafted and adopted by the

City Council twenty-five years ago. The current code contains references to WACs and RCWs that have changed and refers to the City EMS Board that no longer exists. The current code also contains procedural differences from those adopted by the Spokane Fire Department through the Spokane County EMS & Trauma Council.

III. Policy Recommendations

The Council should adopt an ordinance to update the licensing requirements for Emergency Medical Transport that reflects the correct RCW and WAC references, transport procedures and protocols, and codify patient protections required to be included in all private ambulance contracts with the City of Spokane.

Section 3. Repeals SMC 10.47.040 (City of Spokane EMS Board)

This section repeals a reference to the City of Spokane EMS Board which no longer exists.

Section 4. Amends SMC 10.47.050 - Permit

- This section changes the title from "Permit" to "Emergency Medical Transport License Requirements;
- Changes the term "permit" to "license";
- Clarifies that a private ambulance operator must have a general business license with Spokane city endorsement as well as a regulatory license;
- Removes a reference to the Spokane County EMS Council during the licensure process;
- Adds that the license applicant must show proof of licensure by the Washington State Department of Health;
- Clarifies the regulatory license is an annual license valid for one year from when the license is approved; and
- Removes the license fee because the state preempts ambulance license fees through RCW 18.73.020.

Section 5. Repeals SMC 10.47.060 (Insurance)

This section repeals SMC 10.47.060 relating to insurance requirements and replaces it with a new Insurance Requirements section – SMC 10.47.061.

Section 6. New Section SMC 10.47.061 - Insurance Requirements - Ambulance Companies

This new section establishes new insurance requirements for ambulance companies operating in the city of Spokane based on recommendations by the City of Spokane's Risk Manager (Jordan, 2025):

- worker's compensation insurance;
- minimum of ten million dollars in general comprehensive liability insurance;
- minimum of five million dollars in auto liability insurance; and
- minimum of one million dollars in professional liability insurance per person for any certified individual providing medical care.

Section 7. New Section SMC 10.47.062 – Patient Protections

This section codifies patient protection provisions required to be included in any contracts for ambulance services:

- The City can review all patient billings by the ambulance company to monitor compliance with the established rate of charges;
- The ambulance company may not charge a patient for medical supplies provided by the City to the ambulance company;
- The ambulance company cannot charge for treatment provided by City of Spokane personnel; and
- The ambulance company may not solicit payment on-site or en route.

Section 8. Amends SMC 10.47.070 – Medical Emergencies

- This section corrects the Spokane County EMS Council to the correct name: Spokane County EMS & Trauma Council; and
- Replaces references to the Spokane City/County Fire Service Dispatch (CCC) with "designated public safety answering point".

Section 9. Amends SMC 10.47.080 - Patient Care and Transfer

This section updates protocol references to the Spokane County EMS & Trauma Council Protocols and clarifies the Order of Authority, Patient Care Procedures, and Selection of Hospital is governed by the Spokane County EMS & Trauma Council Operating Procedures as well as the East Region EMS and Trauma Care Council procedures and the state's destination procedures for trauma, cardiac, and stroke.

Section 10. Amends SMC 10.47.090 – Communications

- This section includes the term "two-way" to indicate a "two-way communications plan" to comply with WAC 246-976-310;
- This section also changes the title of the section from "Communications" to "Dispatch and Communications Requirements"; and
- Clarifies that all dispatchers must have an Emergency Medical Dispatch certification of an equivalent from a State-approved program. The Public Safety Telecommunicators Certification Board sets public safety telecommunicator training and certification standards.¹

Section 11. Repeals SMC 10.47.120 (Telephone Numbers)

This section repeals out-of-date information regarding the display of telephone numbers on ambulances. The relevant code regarding the display of "911" on ambulances is included in a new Section 10.47.131.

Section 12. Repeals SMC 10.47.130 (Appearance)

This section repeals SMC 10.47.130 regarding the appearance of private ambulances and combines it into a new Section SMC 10.47.131.

Section 13. New Section SMC 10.47.131 – Appearance of City-licensed Ambulances

- This section specifically limits telephone number advertisement on City of Spokane-licensed private ambulances to 911;
- Adds the language from SMC 10.47.130 prohibiting a private ambulance from having the same color schemes or uniforms of the Spokane Fire Department; and
- Adds a new subsection to prohibit the use of the City of Spokane or Spokane Fire Department logo without permission of the City Administrator or their designee.

Section 14. Repeals SMC 10.47.140 (Enforcement)

This section repeals the Enforcement section to be combined into the Penalties section, SMC 10.47.150.

Section 15. Amends SMC 10.47.150 - Penalties

- This section changes the section name from "Penalties" to "Penalties and Enforcement"; and
- Outlines that the suspension or revocation of an emergency medical transport license will follow the process and appeal procedures outlined in SMC 08.01.

Section 16. Repeals SMC 10.47.190 (Effective Date)

This section repeals SMC 10.147.190, which established the effective date of the previous ordinance.

ORDINANCE NO. C36668

An ordinance relating to Emergency Medical Transport in the city of Spokane; amending Sections 10.47.010, 10.47.030, 10.47.050, 10.47.070, 10.47.080, 10.47.090, and 10.47.150; adopting new Sections 10.47.061, 10.47.062, and 10.47.131; and repealing Sections 10.47.040, 10.47.060, 10.47.120, 10.47.130, and 10.47.140 of the Spokane Municipal Code.

- **WHEREAS**, the Spokane Fire Department is the primary responder to basic and advanced life support medical emergencies within the City boundaries; and
- **WHEREAS,** the City initiated paramedic services in 1976 through the Spokane Fire Department and currently has both advanced life support (ALS) and basic life support BLS first-response units; and
- **WHEREAS,** there are approximately 43,000 emergency/non-emergency 911 transports annually; and
- **WHEREAS,** the City of Spokane has contracted for emergency and nonemergency 9-1-1 referral transport services with a private ambulance company since 1993; and
- **WHEREAS**, the municipal code governing the requirements for emergency medical transport has not been reviewed and updated for twenty-five years; and
- **WHEREAS,** the City intends to update requirements, response protocols, and license procedures to reflect changes in state law and the protocols established through the county and regional EMS councils.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City of Spokane does ordain:

Section 1. That Section 10.47.010 of the Spokane Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

Section 10.47.010 Purpose

- A. The purpose of this chapter is to regulate the emergency medical treatment of injured, ill, or disabled persons and their emergency transport in ground and air ambulances.
 - ((1. It does not apply to or regulate non-emergency patient transport.))
- B. This chapter is enacted as an exercise of the police power and is to be construed for the protection of the general public health, safety, and welfare. It is intended to supplement and exceed the standards for ambulances and emergency services

set forth in ((chapter 18.71 RCW and chapter 18.73 RCW)) <u>state law</u> to the extent possible.

Section 2. That Section 10.47.030 of the Spokane Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

Section 10.47.030 Definitions

- A. "Ambulance" means a ground or air vehicle_designed and used to transport the ill or injured and to provide personnel, facilities, and equipment to treat patients before and during transportation.
- B. "Ambulance company" or "ambulance companies" means an organization licensed per the requirements of this chapter and state law that operates one or more ambulances in the city of Spokane.
- C. Advanced life support" means invasive emergency medical services requiring advanced medical treatment skills as defined by chapter 18.71 RCW.
- <u>D.</u> "Basic life support" means noninvasive emergency medical services requiring basic medical treatment skills.
- E. "Emergency medical service (EMS)" means medical treatment and care which may be rendered at the scene of any medical emergency or while transporting any patient in an ambulance to an appropriate medical facility, including ambulance transportation between medical facilities.
- F. "Emergency medical technician" means a person who is authorized by the Washington Secretary of Health to render emergency medical care, under the responsible supervision and direction of an approved medical program director, which may include participating in an emergency services supervisory organization or a community assistance referral and education services program established under RCW 35.21.930, or providing collaborative medical care if the participation or provision of collaborative medical care does not exceed the participant's training and certification.
- ((B)) G_. "Emergency transport" means an ambulance transport of a person on an emergency basis to an appropriate medical facility for immediate treatment.
- H. "First responder" or "emergency medical responder" means a person authorized by the Washington Secretary of Health to render emergency medical care.
- ((C)) <u>I.</u> "Non-emergency transport" means planned transport of a person in a medically stable condition on a non-emergency basis.

- <u>J.</u> "Patient" means any person injured, sick, or incapacitated, requiring medical treatment and care of emergency medical services.
- K. "Public safety answering point" means the public safety location that receives and answers 911 voice and data originating in a given area.
- L. "State-approved training program" means a public safety telecommunicator-certified training program approved by the state certification board to meet the requirements of a state-approved public safety telecommunicator training, certification, and recertification standards.

Section 3. That Section 10.47.040 (City of Spokane EMS Board) of the Spokane Municipal Code is repealed.

Section 4. That Section 10.47.050 of the Spokane Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

Section 10.47.050 ((Permit)) Emergency Medical Transport License Requirements

((A. Permit Required.))

<u>A.</u> No person may operate an ambulance within the ((City)) city of Spokane without first obtaining ((a permit)) an annual general business license and an annual emergency medical transport regulatory license from the City ((with the endorsement of the Spokane County EMS council)).

((1. An application for a license must be submitted to Spokane County EMS council, contain documentation provided by the provisions of this chapter and be signed by the person and certified as true under penalty of perjury.))

((B. Requirements.))

- <u>B.</u> No ((permit is)) license may be issued for emergency medical transport unless the applicant has:
 - fulfilled all the requirements of the laws of the State of Washington applicable to ambulance services, including but not limited to chapter 18.71 RCW, chapter 18.73 RCW and ((chapter 71.168 RCW)) chapter 70.168 RCW and chapter 246-976 WAC ((and chapter 248-17 WAC)), and subsequent amendments or revisions thereto;
 - 2. met all requirements of this chapter; ((and))

- 3. filed proof of insurance coverage as required by this chapter((-));
- 4. filed proof of licensure by the Washington State Department of Health; and ((C. Validity.))

((A permit is valid for two years beginning July 1st, if application is made between March 1st and April 30th.))

((1. Permits issued pursuant to applications made at other times of the year will be issued within three months of the application date and be valid until the second July 1st after the date of issue.))

((D. Exemptions.))

- <u>C.</u> A ((permit)) <u>emergency medical transport regulatory license</u> is not required for ambulance(s):
 - 1. entering the ((City)) city of Spokane for the purpose of transporting patients to or through it only; or
 - 2. pressed into service for transportation of patients in major emergencies or disasters; or
 - 3. based and posted inside of the ((City)) city limits for the purpose of providing service to border areas or outside the ((City)) city limits but not operating within the city limits.

((E. Fee.))
((The permit fee is twenty-five dollars.))
((F. Transfer.))
```

<u>D.</u> ((A permit)) An emergency medical transport license issued under this section may not be assigned or transferred. It shall be invalid upon change of ambulance ownership.

Section 5. That Section 10.47.060 (Insurance) of the Spokane Municipal Code is repealed.

Section 6. That there is adopted a new Section 10.47.061 of the Spokane Municipal Code to read as follows:

Section 10.47.061 Insurance Requirements – Ambulance Companies

A. The ambulance company shall obtain and maintain:

- 1. worker's compensation insurance for the benefit of its employees required to be insured by the laws of the State of Washington;
- 2. a minimum of ten million dollars in general comprehensive liability insurance;
- 3. a minimum of five million dollars in auto liability insurance; and
- 4. The ambulance company shall obtain and must maintain a minimum of one million dollars in professional liability insurance per person for any certified individual providing medical care.
- B. The above-referenced liability insurance policies must:
 - 1. provide for thirty days' notice to the City by the insurer in the event any policy, or portion thereof, is canceled, or the coverage under the policy is reduced, or the policy is not renewed; and
 - 2. be primary and not excess or contributing.
- C. Certificate(s) evidencing such coverage(s) shall be provided to the City.

Section 7. That there is adopted a new Section 10.47.062 of the Spokane Municipal Code to read as follows:

Section 10.47.062 Patient Protections

- A. The City may review any patient billings of ambulance companies to monitor compliance with the schedule of charges.
- B. The City may replenish, at no charge to the ambulance company, medicines, supplies and equipment used by the licensed ambulance company and the company shall not charge the patient for the replenished items.
- C. The ambulance company shall not charge patients for Advance Life Support (ALS) or Basic Life Support (BLS) treatment provided by City of Spokane personnel.
- D. The ambulance company shall not make on-site, en-route, or upon delivery, solicitations or requests for collection of payment.

Section 8. That Section 10.47.070 of the Spokane Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

Section 10.47.070 Medical Emergencies

The provisions of the section are in keeping with the "tiered response" principles <u>and protocols</u> adopted by the ((Spokane County EMS council)) <u>Spokane County EMS & Trauma Council</u> for securing the immediate response by the appropriate emergency medical service (EMS) provider to any medical emergency incident and to assure incident management and control.

A. Primary EMS Responder.

The ((Spokane fire department)) Spokane Fire Department is designated as and will be the primary EMS responder for the City of Spokane within the city boundaries.

- B. Incident Command and Control.
 - 1. The (("primary EMS responder", as defined in subsection (A) of this section,)) Spokane Fire Department as the primary EMS responder is responsible for and will have incident command and control for all EMS incidents in its jurisdiction.
 - 2. Ambulance personnel shall operate within the incident command framework.
- C. Notice Medical Emergency to ((Fire Service)) Dispatch.

When an ambulance company receives a request for an ambulance to respond to any medical emergency from any source other than ((Spokane City/County fire service dispatch (CCC) or the Spokane fire department)) the designated public safety answering point, the ambulance company shall immediately, coincident with its response, provide ((Spokane City/County fire service dispatch (CCC))) the designated public safety answering point with all available information as to the nature and location of the emergency.

D. Ambulance Response.

An ambulance may not respond to a medical emergency incident unless called to respond by ((Spokane City/ County fire service dispatch (CCC))) the designated public safety answering point ((or direct telephone call as provided for in subsection (C) of this section)).

E. Monitoring Frequencies.

No person may monitor emergency service radio frequencies to ascertain emergency medical incident locations for the purpose of responding.

Section 9. That Section 10.47.080 of the Spokane Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

Section 10.47.080 Patient Care and Transfer

The procedure for patient care at an incident and for the transfer of care of such person(s) ((is as follows)) shall follow the Spokane County EMS & Trauma Council Protocols:

- A. Medical Command at the Scene.
 - 1. Fire Personnel on Scene First.
 - a. Upon arrival on the scene of a medical emergency where patient care is being provided by ((fire protection district)) Spokane Fire Department personnel, the ambulance crew seeks out the officer or paramedic in command of the incident.
 - b. Fire personnel remain in charge of the incident in accordance with state law.
 - c. Fire personnel remain in charge of patient care until it is specifically relinquished to the ambulance personnel.
 - 2. Ambulance Crew Scene First.
 - a. Where the ambulance company has arrived first on the scene of a medical emergency, the officer in charge of the subsequently arriving ((Spokane fire department)) Spokane Fire Department unit seeks out the ambulance attendant in charge for a report on the condition of the patient, any treatment that may have been provided, and any other necessary information.
 - b. Following this transfer of information, the fire officer ((may assume command of the incident)) will follow the adopted Spokane County EMS Protocols for On Scene Medical Authority and Assistance and utilize fire resources to assist patient care to the extent possible.
 - 3. Order of Authority.

Patient care at an incident is subject to the following ascending order of authority <u>as</u> <u>described by the Spokane County EMS & Trauma Care Council Protocol</u>:

- a. First responder
- b. Emergency medical technician (first arriving, either fire or private).
- c. Paramedic or flight nurse (first arriving, either fire or private).

- d. Physician <u>with acceptance of 'Thank You For Your Offer of</u> Assistance' card.
- e. ((ALS (Advanced Life Support))) EMS supervising physician.
- f. ((Medical program director)) Spokane County Medical Program Director.

B. Patient Care Procedures and Protocols.

- 1. Patient care procedures and protocols shall comply with the Spokane County pre-hospital patient care procedures and protocols established by the ((Spokane County EMS & council, East Region Trauma Council,)) Spokane County EMS & Trauma Care Council, East Region EMS & Trauma Care Council, and Spokane County ((medical program director)) Medical Program Director.
- 2. Concerns about patient care procedures, including compliance, should be referred to the ((Spokane County EMS council)) Spokane County EMS & Trauma Care Council.

C. Patient Transfer.

- 1. Loading of patients into the ambulance is under the direction of ambulance company personnel.
- 2. The ambulance company assumes responsibility for patient care from fire personnel in accordance with subsection (A)(1) of this section, except that a ((advance)) advanced life support (ALS) patient care may remain the responsibility of the ((advance)) advanced life support personnel providing the patient care if such ALS provider accompany the patient during transport.
- 3. Should the condition of a patient or the number of patients necessitate more than the ambulance company's personnel in the patient compartment to appropriately treat the patient(s), the ambulance company and the fire officer shall mutually determine if the ((Spokane fire department)) Spokane Fire Department will provide additional personnel to assist with patient care en route to the hospital.

D. Selection of Hospital.

((The order of priority in transporting patients to hospitals shall be consistent with patient care procedures as established by the Spokane County EMS council)) The order of priority in transporting patients to hospitals shall be consistent with Spokane County EMS & Trauma Council Operating Procedures, East Region EMS and Trauma Care Council

<u>Patient Care Procedures, and Washington state trauma, cardiac, and stroke destination procedures.</u>

Section 10. That Section 10.47.090 of the Spokane Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

Section 10.47.090 ((Communications)) <u>Dispatch and Communications</u> <u>Requirements</u>

- A. Dispatch Center Requirements.
 - 1. An ambulance company must provide staffed dispatch twenty-four hours per day.
 - 2. Staffing may be accomplished by the ambulance company or by contract with another agency.
 - 3. All dispatchers must be trained and certified in "Emergency Medical Dispatch" or a ((Washington state DOH-approved equivalent)) or equivalent State-approved training program.
 - 4. Ambulance service dispatch centers must have speed-dial telephone lines to all level 3 or higher designated trauma centers in Spokane County.
 - 5. Direct-connect telephone lines to ((fire and law enforcement emergency)) dispatch centers are to be provided at no cost to the City.

B. Radio Communications.

- 1. An ambulance company must have, and provide with its permit application, a <u>two-way</u> radio communications plan meeting all FCC permit and licensing requirements <u>and requirements of WAC 246-976-310</u>.
- 2. All ambulance company radio frequencies and permission to access them must be provided to the ((Spokane fire department)) City of Spokane.

C. Recordings.

- 1. An ambulance company shall record all of its dispatch telephone and radio traffic with a recorder providing a simultaneous date and time track.
- 2. All recordings shall be retained for a minimum period of ninety days.
- Recordings shall be made available to the City ((of Spokane EMS board))
 upon request.

Section 11. That Section 10.47.120 (Telephone Numbers) of the Spokane Municipal Code is repealed.

Section 12. That Section 10.47.130 (Appearance) of the Spokane Municipal Code is repealed.

Section 13. That there is adopted a new Section 10.47.131 of the Spokane Municipal Code to read as follows:

Section 10.47.131 Appearance of City-licensed Ambulances

- A. "911" is the public telephone number for all emergencies, including medical emergencies of all types, in the city of Spokane. "911" shall be the only telephone number displayed on an ambulance licensed by the City of Spokane.
- B. ((Neither)) <u>Private</u> ambulance color schemes ((ner)) <u>and</u> uniforms may <u>not</u> represent or resemble those of the ((Spokane fire department)) <u>Spokane Fire</u> Department.
- C. Private ambulances shall not use the logo of City of Spokane or the Spokane Fire Department without approval by the City Administrator or their designee.

Section 14. That Section 10.47.140 (Enforcement) of the Spokane Municipal Code is repealed.

Section 15. That Section 10.47.150 of the Spokane Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

Section 10.47.150 Penalties and Enforcement

A. Any person who ((violates any provisions of this chapter)) operates a private ambulance without an emergency medical transport license is guilty of a misdemeanor. ((and upon conviction shall be punished by:)) All other violations of this chapter are Class 1 Civil Infractions.

((1.imprisonment in the City/County jail for a maximum term fixed by the court of not more than ninety days, or

- 2. by a fine in an amount fixed by the court of not more than one thousand dollars, or
- 3. both such imprisonment and fine.))
- B. Each day that a violation is permitted to exist constitutes a separate offense.
- C. As an alternative to the enforcement provisions in this section, the City may suspend or revoke the emergency medical transport license issued under this chapter for noncompliance or violation of any requirement of this chapter. The suspension or revocation of the emergency medical transport license shall follow the process and appeal procedures described in SMC 08.01.

Section 16. That Section 10.47.190 (Effective Date_ of the Spokane Municipal Code is repealed.
