City Government:

RESIDENTIAL PARKING DON'TS

Please DON'T:

- Park on the wrong side of the street. Your passenger side tire should always be against the curb.
- Park with tires off the street. Parking on the sidewalk or planting strip is a ticketable offense.

Parking incorrectly is a safety hazard for everyone.

Sidewalks are a public utility for getting around. Blocking it with your car is not fair to those who choose (or need) to use the sidewalk for mobility.

Parking in the wrong direction makes you unpredictable to other users. Plus, when you park, you have to cross oncoming traffic. It may not seem dangerous on your residential street, but residential streets are where most people let their guard down.

Parking on the sidewalk is a \$65 ticket. Parking the wrong direction is a \$45 ticket. Submit your <u>parking complaints</u> here.
