## **THERAPEUTIC COURTS**

Therapeutic courts have small but mighty teams. There are many opportunities to help these small teams! If you are interested in volunteering for Community Court, you can read more and sign up here!

The mission of the Spokane Municipal Community Court is to build stronger and safer neighborhoods by providing accountability with help for individuals involved in the criminal justice system to reduce and properly address quality-of-life offenses by utilizing a collaborative, problem-solving approach to crime.

The City of Spokane Municipal Court system has several different therapeutic courts that aim to help people navigate the criminal justice system when they may have extenuating circumstances that make traditional (or Alpha) court unsuitable. Community Court is the most recognized of the therapeutic courts. The City also has therapeutic courts for Mental Health, Domestic Violence Intervention, DUI's and Veterans.

In case you missed it, Community Court had a great presentation at the <u>June 2 Public Safety Committee</u>. We would encourage you to take a look to learn more about the program and their metrics of success.
