An ordinance amending Ordinance No. C-36161, passed by the City Council December 13, 2021, and entitled, "An ordinance adopting the Annual Budget of the City of Spokane for 2022, making appropriations to the various funds of the City of Spokane government for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2022, and providing it shall take effect immediately upon passage," and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, subsequent to the adoption of the 2022 budget Ordinance No. C-36161, as above entitled, and which passed the City Council December 13, 2021, it is necessary to make changes in the appropriations of the American Rescue Plan Fund, which changes could not have been anticipated or known at the time of making such budget ordinance; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance has been on file in the City Clerk's Office for five days; - Now, Therefore,

The City of Spokane does ordain:

Section 1. That in the budget of the American Rescue Plan Fund, and the budget annexed thereto with reference to the American Rescue Plan Fund, the following changes be made:

- 1) Increase appropriation by \$100,000, funded from the city's direct allocation of the State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund of the American Rescue Plan Act.
- A) Of the increased appropriation, \$100,000 is provided for the purpose of funding for capital expenditures for a City owned firehouse safety center.

Section 2. It is, therefore, by the City Council declared that an urgency and emergency exists for making the changes set forth herein, such urgency and emergency arising from the need to provide appropriation authority for funding one time costs to improve communications to its residents, increasing access to broadband services and improving fire safety, and because of such need, an urgency and emergency exists for the passage of this ordinance, and also, because the same makes an appropriation, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage.

Tranche 4 (Proposed) Children's Fire Safety House - \$100,000 CM Cathcart

The CFSH is the primary tool for delivering essential fire and life safety education to elementary students across the City of Spokane and since November 1992 over 54,204 kids from 46 public & private elementary schools in Spokane have completed the curriculum. A one-time investment would allow SFD to continue providing essential fire and life safety messaging to 3rd and 4th graders. Due to age and wear-and-tear the CFSH is no longer able to safely meet the needs of our community however the projected lifetime of use for a new safety trailer is approximately 20 years. \$100,000 is for the Fire Safety House; it is not meant to fund a new vehicle.
