HUD currently in process of implementing parts of this – definition of homelessness is currently out for public comment until 6/21/10
HMIS	Homeless Management Information System	A software application designed to record & store client-level info on the characteristics and service needs of homeless persons.  Typically a web-based application that providers use to coordinate care, manage their operations, and better serve their clients

Mandatory Grants	Gants a federal agency is required to award if the recipient meets the qualifying conditions	
McKinney-Vento Act	Federal Legislation providing a range of services to homeless people	
NOFA	Notice of Funding Availability	Issued by the Federal Agency administering a program. Tells applicants the money available, requirements & timeline of application, the award process, eligible activities, and program specific requirements
ОМВ	Office of Management & Budget	Federal Agency that evaluates the effectiveness of agency programs, policies, and procedures, assesses competing funding demands among agencies, and sets funding priorities
PIT	Point In Time	The annual point in time count that acts as a census count for people experiencing homelessness. This count shows us trends.

SHP	Supportive Housing Program	HUD CPD program to develop supportive housing and services that will allow homeless persons to live as independently as possible
SRO	Single Room Occupancy Program	HUD CPD Program providing rental assistance for homeless in connection with moderate rehab of SRO dwellings. SRO's contains units for occupancy by one person and may contain food prep and/or sanitary facilities
