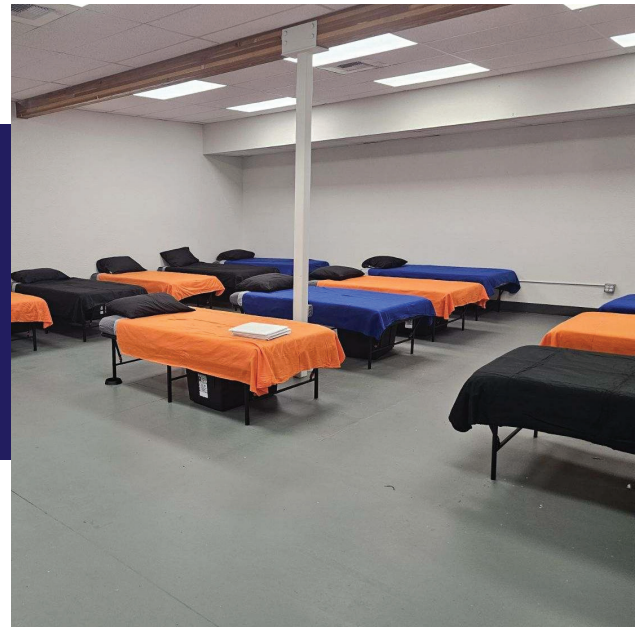

ENCAMPMENT RESOLUTION PROGRAM

OVERVIEW

During the last week of June and first week of July, Revive Counseling Spokane began operations at the Cannon Street Shelter as part of the Encampment Resolution Program.

This program is part of an agreement between the Washington Dept. of Commerce, Washington Dept. of Transportation, City of Spokane, Empire Health Foundation and Revive to navigate members of the unhoused community living in the Division-Sprague Corridor to services and transitional housing.

In the past few weeks, the Revive team swiftly completed several facility enhancements, gathered supplies for clients, and began moving people from the corridor into the facility.

FACILITY UPDATES

Revive Counseling conducted the following maintenance improvements:

- Wall mudding and patching
- Application of Kilz to facility interior
- Wall and floor painting
- Installation of new curtains and rods
- Fence installation (underway)

CLIENT DEMOGRAPHICS

Over the past several months, 12 Strategies identified 47 people within the Division-Sprague Corridor who were eligible for referral to the Cannon Street Shelter.

- **38 people** have engaged with the program within the first two weeks of operations at Cannon.
 - **24 men**
 - **14 women**
 - **5 couples**

COLLECTIVE GOALS/SUCCESS:

- Individuals experiencing homelessness in the Division-Sprague Corridor will be offered the opportunity to access services, including housing placements, and mental health and substance use treatment, in a stable, safe environment.
- Implement strategies to create a safe community for all.
