PUBLIC SAFETY DIVISION COMMUNICATIONS MANAGER



POSITION OVERVIEW

The City of Spokane is seeking a highly qualified Public Safety Division Communications Manager to develop and implement strategic communications plans for the Spokane Police and Fire Departments. This position is appointed by the Mayor, reports directly to the Police and Fire Chiefs, and has a dotted line reporting relationship to the City's Communications Director. The role also provides public safety recommendations and completes public safety related communications projects for the Mayor's Office.

As a media spokesperson, public representative, and public relations advisor to the Police and Fire Chiefs (or their designees), the Division Communications Manager disseminates authorized information to the media, other agencies, and the public through written and oral communications and electronic formats including social media. The Division Communications Manager responds to requests from the media and Police and Fire Department Leadership on a 24-hour basis, to include weekends. This role is responsible for engaging the media to ensure coverage of programs and initiatives of the Police and Fire Departments and activities serving the community. The Public Safety Division Communication Manager makes appropriate recommendations to Police and Fire Department Leadership regarding high-profile police and fire incidents to facilitate the advancement of the organization's overall goals.

THE IDEAL CANDIDATE

The ideal candidate will have a strong background in media and public relations with an emphasis in the public safety field. This position requires extensive interaction with the public, media, fire and law enforcement officers and City personnel; strong interpersonal communication skills are a necessity. Knowledge of multiple social media platforms is important to the success of this position, especially a proficiency with Facebook and Twitter and various social media management tools. The ideal candidate will be able to develop effective relationships with the media and community organizations, in order to broaden the influence of the Police and Fire Department's outreach efforts. The candidate will be familiar with web content development and management. The ability to handle multiple projects in a fast-paced environment and rely upon critical thinking and problem solving expertise is essential to success in this role.



EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE

Any combination of education and experience which would provide the required knowledge, skills and abilities, is qualifying. Generally this would include: graduation from an accredited four-year college or university with major course work in journalism, English, communications, mass media, marketing, public relations, or a closely related field; AND, four years professional experience in journalism, communications and/or public relations. Prior experience in public safety and/or ICS certifications is strongly preferred.

BEHAVIORAL STANDARDS

As an exempt employee of the City of Spokane, Public Safety Division the Communications Manager is subject to the City's code of Ethics set forth in Chapter 1.04A of the Spokane Municipal Code. As such, "It is the policy of the City of Spokane to uphold, promote and demand the highest standards of ethics from all of its employees shall maintain the utmost standards of responsibility. trustworthiness, integrity. truthfulness, honesty and fairness in carrying out their public duties, avoid any improprieties in their roles as public servants including the appearance of impropriety, and never use their City position, authority or resources for personal gain."

COMPENSATION AND BENEFITS

The salary range for this position is \$75,606.48 to \$100,307.52, depending on experience and qualifications. The City of Spokane offers a full range of leave and insurance benefits including vacation, sick, personal, and floating holiday leave, medical, dental, long-term disability, life insurance, and a Section 125 healthcare reimbursement account. A deferred compensation plan is available with a City match up to \$200.00 a month if actively contributing. Participation in Spokane Employee's Retirement System with (SERS) matching employer employee contributions of 9.25% of the employee's salary earnings.
