The City of Spokane is currently seeking an **Engineering/Environmental Studies Student** to join the team at its Waste to Energy (WTE) Facility. <u>WTE SPOKANE</u> is part of the community's overall comprehensive solid waste system that encourages recycling and waste reduction—along with the recovery of energy. The facility can handle up to 800 tons of municipal solid waste a day and can generate 26 megawatts of electricity. Waste to Energy Spokane went on line in late 1991 as part of an overall solution to handle the community's solid waste, replacing non-compliant, leaking landfills located over the region's solesource aquifer.

The <u>WTE SPOKANE</u> summer student program is designed to provide real-world experience and professional development opportunities to talented undergraduates. As a <u>WTE SPOKANE</u> summer employee, you will impact the future of <u>WTE SPOKANE</u> by collaborating and providing input to programs and projects. Candidates will work a variety of positions throughout the facility, of which some may be physically demanding. Duties will be divided between manual labor and activities aimed to enhance career goals.

## The ideal candidate will have the following:

- Currently majoring in Electrical, Mechanical, or Environmental Engineering or another environmental studies major from an accredited college or university
- Will have completed at least 30 hours of college coursework.
- Maintained a GPA of 2.75 or higher
- Currently enrolled as a full time student
- Have reached the age of 18 years old
