PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the Holocaust was the state-sponsored, systematic persecution and genocide of European Jewry by Nazi Germany and its collaborators from 1933 to 1945, wherein six million Jews were murdered and millions of other non-Aryans suffered grievous oppression and death under Nazi tyranny; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to an Act of Congress in 1980, the United States Holocaust Memorial Council designates the Days of Remembrance for the Victims of the Holocaust to be Sunday April 4 through Saturday April 10, 2021, and Thursday April 8, 2021 as the International Day of Remembrance known as *Yom HaShoah*; and

WHEREAS, it is important to recognize that attacks on Jews occur in our city and significantly increased this past year; Holocaust remembrance at this season in Spokane continues to have a strong presence, with this year being no exception, reaffirming the compassion of our community and its respect for our community's diversity:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Nadine Woodward, Mayor of the City of Spokane, on behalf of the citizens of Spokane, do hereby proclaim April 4th – 10th, 2021 as

THE DAYS OF REMEMBRANCE

in Spokane in memory of all the Holocaust victims and survivors, and further proclaim that we, as citizens of the City of Spokane, should be vigilant against hatred, persecution and tyranny, and overcome intolerance and indifference through learning and remembrance.
