## PROCLAMATION

**WHEREAS**, April 28<sup>th</sup> was chosen as the Workers Memorial Day in remembrance of the formation of the Occupational Safety and Health Administration in 1989 and is recognized as a day of remembrance by workers around the world; and

**WHEREAS**, every year tens of thousands of American workers are killed by workplace injuries and occupational diseases and tens of thousands more are permanently disabled, and millions of American workers are injured or made ill while on the job; and

**WHEREAS**, concerned Americans are determined to prevent these tragedies by honoring those injured or deceased due to workplace injuries or illnesses, renewing our efforts to seek stronger safety and health protections, better standards and enforcement, fair and just compensation, and rededication of ourselves to improve safety and health in every American workplace:

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Nadine Woodward, Mayor of the City of Spokane, on behalf of the citizens of Spokane do hereby proclaim April 28, 2022 as

in Spokane, in recognition of workers killed, injured, and disabled on the job and encourage all local agencies, businesses, and organizations to help ensure that all workers are confident that their health and safety is a priority.
