PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, 81 years ago today, Japanese forces attacked the United States Naval Base at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, a day which will live in infamy, and led to the United States' entry into World War II; and

WHEREAS, in 1994, the United States Congress designated December 7th as National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day in honor of the 2,403 service members and civilians who were killed during the attack, as well as the 1,178 people who were injured; and

WHEREAS, the City of Spokane joins our Nation in honoring those whose lives were forever changed that December morning and resolve to uphold the legacy of all who stepped forward in our Nation's time of need:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Nadine Woodward, Mayor of the City of Spokane, on behalf of the citizens of Spokane, do hereby recognize and proclaim December 7, 2022, as

PEARL HARBOR REMEMBRANCE DAY

in Spokane and encourage all citizens to observe this solemn day of remembrance and to honor our brave military men and women who have fought and sacrificed for our freedom.
