## PROCLAMATION

**WHEREAS**, the monarch butterfly is an iconic North American species whose multigenerational migration and metamorphosis from caterpillar to butterfly has captured the imagination of millions of Americans across the nation and here in Spokane; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Spokane recognizes that human health ultimately depends on well-functioning ecosystems, and creating and maintaining biodiverse regions can better support food production, healthy soil and air quality and can foster healthy connections between humans and wildlife along with the importance of coexistence; and

**WHEREAS**, cities play a critical role in helping to save the monarch butterfly through education and conservation of monarch habitats, and Spokane is striving to become a leader in these efforts through encouraging the planting of native milkweed and other native plants that serve as habitats and invite pollination, not only helping the monarch population but also helping to make Spokane beautiful:
