I understand and acknowledge that all notifications from the Court will be transmitted to me via the United States Postal Service (USPS) 1st class mail, absent my specific agreement to be notified via email, as is permitted by General Rule 30(b)(3).

By checking the box to the left and providing my valid email address and signature below, I am expressly consenting and agreeing to accept service of all documents, pleadings, notices, and/or correspondence from the Spokane Municipal Court *exclusively* via the email address I am providing below for all my infraction and criminal cases, whether pending now or filed with the Court in the future.

I understand this authorization <u>does not apply to photo enforcement or parking cases</u>. Notices and other written communications from the Court will continue to be transmitted to the mailing address I have on file with the Court.

I understand that such electronic transmission will have the same legal effect as if I had received the document, pleading, and/or correspondence via USPS 1st class mail.

I may revoke this authorization at any time by sending written notice to the Court.

It is important that you check your email inbox regularly to assure timely receipt of items from the Court. If the Court receives an undeliverable message for the email address you provided, it will revert to sending all items related to your cases to the last mailing address we have on file for you.
