City Updates

- The City Council <u>passed an ordinance</u> to increase the penalty for trespassing in parks after hours, amending it from a civil infraction to a misdemeanor.
- Mayor Nadine Woodward announced a <u>Safe Spokane Summer Plan</u> to address the most prolific repeat misdemeanor offenders and provide additional emphasis on hot-spot areas.
- City of Spokane owns and operates most of its own utilities and services. The operations of City facilities take care of your daily needs while conserving materials and resources, generating power, and saving citizens money. Review the <u>2022 environmental highlights</u> guide here.
- The City of Spokane received a \$20,000 grant from the Mars Petcare's Better Cities for Pets program and awarded it to Spokanimal, a non-profit animal shelter, to help fund the <u>Keeping Pets with their</u> <u>People program</u>. The grant provides services to pets whose owners are experiencing homelessness.



- The City of Spokane released its <u>annual report on the quality of drinking water</u> provided by the City's Water Department. For 2022, as in previous years, the City met or exceeded all federal and state drinking water standards.
