# Maximizing Your Neighborhood Mailer

- Each year all 29 neighborhood councils that participate in the Neighborhood Council Clean-up program are able to use a portion of their clean-up credits to create up to 2 postcards to be sent out to all residents in your neighborhood boundary.
- This is a great opportunity to highlight your clean-up events as well as other neighborhood happenings to engage new people.
- Clean-up event information and guidelines are required on each mailer, and anything extra is optional.

The City reserves the right to refuse to haul anything considered dangerous or hazardous. Because of its hazardous nature, nothing that does or did contain Freon (refrigerators, air conditioners, freezers, etc.) belongs in a dumpster; nor do fluorescent lighting tubing.

## Clean-up Events & Information

Your Northwest Neighborhood Council (NWWNC) has designated funds to help neighbors get rid of excess garbage and debris. The Neighborhood Clean-up Program is funded by residential rate-payers of the City of Spokane solid waste services. Anyone living within council boundaries is eligible to receive (1) dump pass per address per event on a "first come, first served" basis. See the reverse side of this postcard for neighborhood boundaries. Each event is limited to 64 available dump passes. Dump passes are also available at NWWNC meetings preceding the dates below. BRING THIS POSTCARD WITH YOU TO CLAIM A DUMP PASS.

Those without a postcard need photo identification and proof of residency such as a utility bill or statement. Dump passes have conditions of use. Please read and understand these conditions before accepting a dump pass. Valid only for residential use.

## FREE CURBSIDE CLEAN-UP:

**Tues, MAY 14, 2019**

You may have up to an equivalent of 4 standard trash cans (32 gal.) (no more than 85 lbs. each)

- **The City reserves the right** to refuse to haul anything considered dangerous, hazardous, toxic, corrosive, or reactive including but not limited to items that contain Freon, fluorescent lighting tubing, compact fluorescent light bulbs or any other mercury-containing lights, and paint.
- **Not accepted:** items over 85 lbs, large appliances or oversized items, recyclable (big blue cart) materials, or batteries.
- **Okay:** Small appliances, such as microwaves, are OK, as are mattresses and box springs (one set ONLY) Tires - limit two.
- **Electronics** such as TVs, computers, monitors, DVD players and E-readers can be dropped off for free at Goodwill stores or other participants in the E-Cycle Washington program. Visit [ecyclewashington.org](http://ecyclewashington.org) or call 1-800-RECYCLE for more information.
- **Household items** must be in standard 32-gallon cans, auto-mated carts of any size, boxes, bags, or bundles. Any receptacle other than 32-gallon cans or automated carts may be considered trash, and requests for replacement will not be recognized.
- **Materials must be available on the curb for pickup by: 7:00 AM the morning of the event.**
- **CURBSIDE\* only!** \* Even if it is usually picked up in alley. **RESIDENTIAL USE ONLY— NOT for commercial use.**

## LARGE APPLIANCE PICK-UP

\*This event is by registration only.

Residents must call or email to REGISTER BY: **WEDNESDAY, MAY 15.**

• **The City reserves the right** to refuse to haul anything considered dangerous, hazardous, toxic, corrosive, or reactive including but not limited to items that contain Freon, fluorescent lighting tubing, compact fluorescent light bulbs or any other mercury-containing lights, and paint.

• **Acceptable appliances:** old refrigerators and freezers (no Freon), hot water heaters (drained), trash compactors, stoves, ovens, washing machines, dishwashers, air conditioners, BBQs, and other such large items. Doors must be removed from appliances.

• **Items must be at the curb, no exception.**

No items from inside yards, houses, in alleys or off of porches will be picked up.

• **Limited to the first 30 requests**

• **one appliance per household only.**
