PROGRAMS

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT GRANT: The Community Engagement Grant (CEG) is used to fund items and activities to boost resident participation in the City's Neighborhood Councils.

NEIGHBORHOOD CLEANUP: The

Neighborhood Clean-Up Program works to make Spokane neighborhoods clean, safe, and healthy for all residents to live and thrive in. This program funds neighborhood-wide clean-up events and graffiti abatement.

TRAFFIC CALMING & SCHOOL SAFETY: The

Traffic Calming and School Safety/Radar program uses photo red light camera tickets to fund neighborhood-driven improvements to improve safety and the "livability" of streets for residents and visitors.

MOBILE SPEED FEEDBACK: The Mobile Speed Feedback Trailer Program provides 6 mobile speed feedback trailers to be placed at Neighborhood Council-request to show drivers how quickly they are moving and to collect speed data.


