Meeting & Project Description:

This meeting will engage the community in a discussion on the eventual surface design of a block of Wall Street, following a project to install a sewer main there.

The City of Spokane will begin work in early August on a project to install a sewer main in Wall Street from Main Avenue to Spokane Falls Boulevard, including both of those intersections. In phase one, crews will install the pipe and cover the construction area with a temporary asphalt patch. That work is expected to take eight to 12 weeks, with limited access to traffic.

In phase two, which is planned for the spring of 2016, the City will install a new surface on the street and add related elements, including lighting and landscaping.
