ENGAGEMENT AND ENFORCEMENT

DAYTIME NAVIGATION MODEL

- Changing Cannon St. Shelter to daytime navigation center with transportation
- Daytime services including mental health care, addiction treatment, housing placement, employment services, access to primary care services
- Increase capacity from 30 to 80+ people
- Refer to nighttime shelter

COORDINATED STREET OUTREACH

- Assigning outreach teams to geographic quadrants of the City that align with SPD precincts, seven days a week
- Allows for near real-time response to relevant 311 calls
- Works closely with SPD to refer individuals to appropriate services

CO-DEPLOYED TEAM EXPANSION

- Partnership with Spokane County to increase SFD's Behavioral Response Team's coverage from 40 hours a week, Monday - Friday to approximately 72 hours a week, Monday - Saturday
 - Behavioral Response Team is a codeployed team comprised of one paramedic (Spokane Fire) and one mental health clinician (Frontier Behavioral Health) that respond to behavioral health crises, including but not limited to overdoses.
- Diverts away from emergency department and into timely, effective treatment and services

PARTNERSHIP WITH DIGNIFIED WORK DAY

- Contracting with Dignified Work Day to connect unhoused people ready to work with employment opportunities
- Prioritizing downtown and gateway litter clean up and graffiti abatement

ENFORCEMENT

- New police staffing model, including more officers downtown
- High Utilizer Initiative 2.0, including reserve jail bed capacity
- New enforcement ordinance update to expand officer discretion and area restrictions
