Here are the next steps in the Greening Grant timeline:

## September 1<sup>st</sup> - 15<sup>th</sup>

- 1. Neighborhood Council to sign Grant and Maintenance Agreement
- 2. Participating Residents sign Waiver and Release of Liability
  - a. This form is a waiver for those that are participating in the neighborhood volunteer planting day and for those participants who have agreed to maintain the trees/vegetation to be planted.
- 3. Set the date for your event
  - a. Order necessary perennial plants that were included within your application.
  - b. Work with the Project Coordinator to select/finalize any tree species and quantities.
  - c. Recruit volunteers for your event.

### September 15<sup>th</sup>, 2014 – May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2015

- 1. Implement your volunteer planting day.
  - a. Neighborhoods Responsibilities:
    - i. Set your event date and timeframe
    - ii. Coordinate the participation of all volunteers and/or volunteer groups
    - iii. If your grant included vegetation coordinate the delivery of the plants on the event day
    - iv. Coordinate any necessary tools needed for planting day with volunteers and/or other organizations/donations.
  - b. Cities Responsibilities:
    - i. Order and deliver trees on event day.
    - ii. Schedule Arborist to be onsite.

Your events may start as early as September 15<sup>th</sup>. It would be great to see these projects in the ground this year. #### **Greening Neighborhoods – Contest & Award**

Every individual grant project will be entered into the Greening Neighborhoods – Contest & Award. The projects will be evaluated under 3 criteria, which are:

**Volunteerism** – Creating a unique volunteering event that highlights neighborhood participation and project completion.

**Impact** – The project with the greatest impact to the neighborhood community and the City

**Green Infrastructure** – The project that implements that most sustainable plant selection in that it includes a robust variety of trees and other native vegetation.

Each grant project is very unique to each neighborhood and in order to showcase this please submit a brief description of your event planning process and any other necessary information relevant to this process. This may also include before/after photos or photos of the event planting day. This information may be highlighted on the Cities website under <a href="Forest Spokane">Forest Spokane</a> and/or distributed to the Community Assembly representatives and the Mayor for selection of the Greening Neighborhoods Contest.

# GRANT AND MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF SPOKANE AND THE \_\_\_\_\_NEIGHBORHOOD COUNCIL

This Grant and Maintenance Agreement ("Agreement") is made and effective or, 2014, by and between the City of Spokane, a municipal corporation located in the state of Washington ("City"), and the Neighborhood Counci ("Neighborhood Council"), jointly referred to hereafter as the "Parties."
1. <u>Greening Neighborhoods – Grant Program and Guidelines.</u> The City has developed the Greening Neighborhoods – Grant Program ("Grant") and Guidelines to enable neighborhood councils to apply for grants for the planting of trees and other native vegetation within public or private common areas exposed to the community population. The City awards a Grant to the Neighborhood Council and desires that the Neighborhood Council, along with participating residents and businesses in the Neighborhood Council boundary, plant and maintain the trees and vegetation described in the Neighborhood Council's Grant application.

- 2. Purpose. This Agreement is entered into between the Parties for the purpose of awarding a Grant to the Neighborhood Council through the City's Greening Neighborhoods Grant Program, for which the Neighborhood Council has applied. The Neighborhood Council understands that the award and receipt of the Grant subjects the Neighborhood Council to the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement as well as the Grant Program and Guidelines attached hereto, which are included as part of the obligations involved in this Agreement.
- 3. <u>The Parties' Obligation</u>. The Parties shall perform the obligations set forth in the Greening Neighborhoods Grant Program and Guidelines, as well as other obligations specifically set forth in this Agreement and the Neighborhood Council's Grant application. The planting and maintenance of all trees and vegetation shall comply with all City standards and specifications and arboricultural best management practices. The City reserves the right to require any sight-obscuring vegetation be altered or removed, so as to adequately provide appropriate pedestrian or vehicular line of sight.
- 4. **The Neighborhood Council Obligation.** The Neighborhood Council shall perform the following specific tasks:
  - (a) maintain the trees in reasonable condition by watering them and
  - (b) maintaining the area around the trees in reasonable condition by weeding them.
- 5. The City's Obligations. The City shall perform the following specific tasks:
  - (a) prep the site:
- (b) verify that appropriate species and planting locations are selected according to Spokane Municipal Code, City standards and specifications, and arboricultural best management practices;



- (c) deliver the street trees to the traffic island; and
- (d) verify that the street trees are installed per the City Tree Planting Detail.
- 6. <u>Safety.</u> The Neighborhood Council and all participating residents shall take all necessary precautions while working in and around the public right-of-way. The City does not assume any liability or responsibility for the safety of those volunteers working in and around the public right-of-way.
- 7. Control of Right-of-Way. Trees and vegetation may be planted in the right-of-way under the control of the City pursuant to this Agreement and with the approval of the City. The City retains ownership of all trees and vegetation planted in the right-of-way and maintains control of the right-of-way. The City may alter the trees or vegetation for purposes of public safety.
- 8. <u>Waiver and Release of Liability</u>. Each person participating in this Agreement and related project shall sign a Waiver and Release of Liability provided by the City prior to participating in this project.
- 9. <u>Assignment and Delegation</u>. No party may assign its rights or delegate its duties created under this Agreement, without the other party's prior written consent, which the other parties shall not unreasonably withhold.
- 10. <u>Modification</u>. This Agreement shall not be amended, altered, or otherwise changed except by written agreement signed by all parties, or their assignees or delegates.
- 11. <u>Term.</u> The term of this Agreement shall remain in effect indefinitely from the date of signing. The City reserves the right to terminate this Agreement immediately, at its discretion, based upon any public health, safety, or welfare concerns.
- 12. **Governing Law and Venue.** This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the state of Washington. Any dispute, or litigation arising from, or to enforce this Agreement shall be handled by a court of competent jurisdiction located in Spokane County, Washington.
- 13. <u>Independent Contractor</u>. The Parties intend that no employment relationship shall be created by this Agreement, the Neighborhood Council, its employees and agents are operating entirely as independent contractors, without the supervision, direction or control of the City.
- 14. **Agreement Documents**. This Agreement, as well as the Grant Program and Guidelines, and the Neighborhood Council's Grant application constitute the Agreement documents and are complementary. Federal and state requirements and the terms of this Agreement, respectively, supersede other inconsistent provisions. These Agreement documents are on file with the Office of Neighborhood Services and Code Enforcement located on the 6<sup>th</sup> Floor of City Hall at W. 808 Spokane Falls Blvd., Spokane, Washington, and are incorporated into this Agreement by reference as if they were set forth at length.
- 15. <u>Indemnification</u>. The Neighborhood Council agrees to defend, indemnify and hold



the City harmless from any and all claims, demands, losses and liabilities to or by third parties arising from, resulting from or connected with services performed or to be performed under this Agreement by the Neighborhood Council, its agents or employees to the fullest extent permitted by law.
