MINUTES OF SPOKANE CITY COUNCIL**Monday, February 8, 2016****BRIEFING SESSION**

The Briefing Session of the Spokane City Council held on the above date was called to order at 3:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers in the Lower Level of the Municipal Building, 808 West Spokane Falls Boulevard, Spokane, Washington.

Roll Call

On roll call, Council President Stuckart and Council Members Fagan, Kinnear, Mumm, Stratton, and Waldref were present.

City Council's Policy Advisor Brian McClatchey and City Clerk Terri Pfister were also present on the dais.

Advance Agenda Review

There was no Advance Agenda to review as the regularly scheduled City Council meeting on Tuesday, February 16, 2016 is cancelled. There is no City Council Meeting on Monday, February 15, 2016 due to the recognized President's Day Holiday.

Upon Unanimous Roll Call Vote, the City Council **passed Emergency Budget Ordinance C35363** carrying over from the 2015 fiscal year and re-appropriating various funds for the use of certain departments and divisions of the City government and the budgeting of various outstanding grants, both revenues and expenses, of the City of Spokane, and thereby amending Ordinance No. 35322, passed November 23, 2015 and entitled, "An Ordinance adopting the Annual Budget of the City of Spokane for 2016, making appropriations to the various funds, departments and programs of the City of Spokane government for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2016, and providing it shall take effect immediately upon passage," and declaring an emergency.

(This action carries over budget authority for items budgeted in 2015, but not completed at year-end and appropriates various outstanding grants and capital expenditures.)

HEARINGS

Spokane Housing Ventures Annexation—First Hearing on Ordinances C35359 and C35360 and consideration of Resolution 2016-0011 (PLN 2016-0001)

The City Council held first hearings on Final Reading Ordinance C35359 relating to the pending Spokane Housing Ventures Annexation and Final Reading Ordinance C35360 relating to zoning for the area within the pending Spokane Housing Ventures Annexation and considered Resolution 2016-0011 setting hearing before the City Council for March 14, 2016, for the proposed Spokane Housing Ventures annexation. Jo Anne Wright of the City’s Planning and Development Department provided an overview of the items and public testimony followed.

Council President Stuckart advised that the hearing on Ordinances C35359 and C35360 will be continued and no action will be taken (this evening). He noted the City Council will continue to take written comment (until the second hearing on the matter on March 14). He noted the City Council does need to vote on Resolution 2016-0011 which sets hearing for March 14. Council Member Fagan commented that, by virtue of the testimony received specifically received from Fire District 8, as well as the owner of the storage facility that happens to reside in the triangle, the triangle is not relevant to the discussion the City Council is having. He inquired if Council President Stuckart would entertain a motion to disposition the triangle. Policy Advisor Brian McClatchey stated such a motion should be entertained at the conclusion of the second hearing when the City Council is thinking about actually taking the annexation action and setting the comp plan and land use categories for that property. Council President Stuckart stated he tended to agree that the triangle does not need to be a part of the annexation. Subsequently, the following action was taken:

Upon Unanimous Roll Call Vote, the City Council **adopted Resolution 2016-0011** setting hearing before the City Council March 14, 2016 for the proposed Spokane Housing Ventures annexation.

Council President Stuckart stated the first hearing is open for written comment and the second hearing will be held on March 14, 2016.

No individuals spoke during the **Second Open Forum**.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business to come before the City Council, the Regular Legislative Session of the Spokane City Council adjourned at 7:55 p.m. Note: The regularly scheduled City Council meeting for Monday, February 15, 2016, is canceled.

RESOLUTION NO. 2016-0018

A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE INTENTION OF THE SPOKANE CITY COUNCIL TO DESIGNATE AN ADDITIONAL RESIDENTIAL TARGETED AREA AND TO SET A PUBLIC HEARING

WHEREAS, Chapter 84.14 RCW authorizes cities to enact multifamily housing property tax incentive programs by designating residential targeted areas within urban centers;

WHEREAS, the City of Spokane exercised its authority under Chapter 84.14 RCW by enacting Ordinance No. C-32575, codified as Chapter 8.15 SMC, which provides a property tax incentive for multifamily housing in urban centers by establishing a methodology for granting such incentives and designating the urban centers and residential targeted areas;

WHEREAS, the City Council later modified, by adopting Ordinance No. C-34909 on September 24, 2012, the existing residential targeted areas; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to revise the residential targeted areas to add an area referred to as the “Lower South Hill” to SMC 8.15.030, as shown in attachment A to this Resolution; and

WHEREAS, RCW 84.14.040 requires public notice and a hearing before the City designates residential targeted areas.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it is resolved by the Spokane City Council that it is the intent of the City of Spokane to designate the Lower South Hill as an additional residential targeted area as set forth in Ordinance No. C-35362, amending SMC 8.15.030.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Spokane shall conduct a public hearing on **Monday, February 29, 2016**, beginning at 6:00 pm at the City Council Chambers at City Hall, 808 W. Spokane Falls Blvd., Spokane, WA, to take public testimony and consider the addition of the designated residential targeted area as set forth above.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED that the City Council shall also consider adoption of Ordinance No. C-35362, amending SMC 8.15.030 to add the designated Lower South Hill residential targeted area subsequent to the hearing called for in this Resolution.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPOSED ANNEXATION OF SPOKANE HOUSING VENTURES ANNEXATION AREA, INCLUDING ADOPTION OF COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AND APPROPRIATE LAND USE REGULATIONS

The City of Spokane Washington proposes to annex an area otherwise known as the Spokane Housing Ventures Annexation Area. The Spokane Housing Ventures Annexation Area is an approximately 42-acre area contiguous to the City of Spokane, lying South of 53rd Avenue, West of Regal Street, and North of 55th Avenue ("Spokane Housing Ventures Annexation Area"). The Spokane Housing Ventures Annexation Area is situated in the County of Spokane, State of Washington, and is legally described as follows:

Those portions of the North ½ of Section 3, Township 24 North, Range 43 East W.M. and further described as follows:

All of lots 5-7 and portions of lots 3,4 and 8-12 of, Block 1, of The Amended Plat of South Spokane and Lot 1, Block 2, of the Plat of Hilby Station; which include the following Parcel Numbers: 34031.5201, 34031.0459, 34032.0433, 34032.0405, 34032.0432, 34032.0490, 34032.0489, 34032.0492, 34032.0481, 34032.0480, 34032.0446, 34032.0412, and 34032.0447.

The boundaries are described below:

Beginning (Point of Beginning) at the southwest corner of Lot 12, Block 1, of The Amended Plat of South Spokane, which is also the intersection of the north right-of-way line of 55th Avenue and the east right-of-way line of Regal Street; THENCE west across Regal Street to the intersection of the west right-of-way line of Regal Street and the north right-of-way line of 55th Avenue; THENCE north along said west right-of-way line of Regal Street to the intersection of the south right-of-way line of 53rd Avenue (coincident with the south limit of

the City of Spokane) and the west right-of-way line of Regal Street; THENCE east along the south limit of the City of Spokane to the intersection of the east limit of the City of Spokane; THENCE east, along the same bearing as the north lot lines of Lots 5 and 6, Block 1, of The Amended Plat of South Spokane (coincident with the south limit of the City of Spokane), to the intersection of the southwest right-of-way line of the Palouse Highway; THENCE southeasterly along said southwest right-of-way line of the Palouse Highway to a point that is 9.96 feet primarily north of the northwest corner of Lot 1, Block 2, of the Plat of Hilby Station; THENCE south 00°36'08" west 9.96 feet to the northwest corner of Lot 1, Block 2, Hilby Station, said plat was filed on May 5, 1999 under Auditor's File Number 4363950; THENCE along the following (4) courses according to the above mentioned plat; THENCE

- a) south 48°14'45" east 74.61 feet; THENCE
- b) southwesterly along a tangential curve to the right having a radius of 20.00 feet, 45.25 feet; THENCE
- c) southwesterly along a curve having a radius of 185 feet, and a delta angle of 08°59'49" with a chord bearing of north 85°53'42" east and a chord distance of 29.02 feet for an arc distance of 29.05 feet; THENCE
- d) south 89°36'23" west 17.30 feet to a point on the north right-of-way line of 55th Avenue;

THENCE west along the north right-of-way line of 55th Avenue to the intersection of the east right-of-way line of Freya Street; THENCE west to the intersection of the north right-of-way line of 55th Avenue and the west right-of-way line of Freya Street; THENCE west along the north right-of-way line of 55th Avenue to the Point of Beginning.
