Notice of Intent to Adopt Amendment to the Bicycle Parking Code

The City of Spokane Planning Services Department proposes an amendment to the Bicycle Parking Code requirements for short-term and long-term bicycle parking.

Project Description: This proposal will amend Spokane Municipal Code (SMC): Sections 17C.230.110 and 17C.230.200. The proposed update to section 17C.230.110 revises the vehicle substitution provisions to allow up to twenty-five percent of vehicle parking to be substituted by bicycle parking. The proposed update to section 17C.230.200 revises the bicycle parking code to require short-term and long-term bicycle parking throughout the city. The exact amendments to the code will be available online at the following address: https://my.spokanecity.org/projects/bicycle-parking-code-update/.

SEPA Status: These proposed changes will be reviewed as a non-project action under the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) under Spokane Municipal Code Section 17E.050. A Determination of Non-Significance is anticipated.

Legislative Process: An initial Plan Commission Workshop was held on January 25th to introduce the Commission to proposed amendments. A second Plan Commission Workshop is scheduled for February 22nd, 2023, and Plan Commission Public Hearing is anticipated for March 2023. City Council action is expected to occur in May 2023.

ORDINANCE NO. C36353

An ordinance carrying over from the 2022 fiscal year and re-appropriating various funds for the use of certain departments and divisions of the City government and the budgeting of various outstanding grants, both revenues and expenses, of the City of Spokane, and thereby amending Ordinance No. C36345, passed by the City Council December 12, 2022, and entitled "An ordinance adopting the Annual Budget of the City of Spokane for 2023, making appropriations to the various funds of the City of Spokane government for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2023, and providing it shall take effect immediately upon passage", and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, at the end of the 2022 fiscal year there were various unexpended appropriations for uncompleted programs, improvements in progress, unfilled orders for material, equipment and supplies and unfulfilled contracts for personnel services, properly budgeted and contracted for, and various outstanding grants, bond projects, and capital projects; and

WHEREAS, in order to complete such programs and pay such claims it is necessary that the various funds be reappropriated in the 2023 budget; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance has been on file three days;

NOW, THEREFORE,

The City of Spokane does ordain;
